Helpful Mail Bidding Instructions



idding in this sale can be an interesting, enjoyable, and numismatically rewarding experience. If you're an old-time bidder with us, you may find some of the following comments

will increase your bidding success. If this is your first sale, then we particularly recommend that you read this commentary. The paragraphs are numbered for reference in the event that you wish to ask further questions about any aspect. Have a question? You get *personal service* at Bowers and Ruddy Galleries. Please feel free to write or call; a member of our Auction Department staff will gladly help you.

- Read the Terms of Sale in the front of the catalogue. Note that a 10% buyer's premium will be added to all successful bids.
- 2. Mail your bid sheet as early as possible. This is particularly important if you're a new bidder, for it takes us time to check your references. Also, this assures that your bid sheet will be received before the sale. A bid sheet mailed a few days before the sale might not reach us until a week later—at which time the coins will have all been sold to others!
- 3. We've found it best to use a *work sheet* to compile bids. In this way you can check back and forth throughout the catalogue, make changes and revisions, and so on. Then when you've decided on your final bids, enter them on the bid sheet. Try your best to keep the bid sheet neat and clearly understandable, listing the lots in order.
- **4.** If you are a new bidder, send along references and a 25% deposit.
- 5. Be prepared to pay in full for all lots for which your bids are successful. Don't bid more than you want to pay! Review your financial circumstances carefully before bidding. If you are awarded lots you are legally bound to pay for them.
- 6. Please keep current price levels in mind when bidding. While high and low prices sometimes occur, most items sell within market ranges. If a popular coin sells for \$500 on the retail market, chances are not good that a bid of, say, less than \$400 will win it. On the other hand, chances are excellent that a bid in the \$500 to \$600 range will be a winner. There is no harm in bargain hunting, but as your time is valuable (and so is ours), it is most productive if you keep current values in mind while bidding!



The Roy Harte Collection Part III



Twice in recent years, Roy Harte has presented us with very interesting collections to sell at auction. We are very proud that he has selected us again to sell the third part of his collection, which you will find as the "lead" collection of this fascinating auction catalogue.

As many of you know, Roy Harte is famous for his collection of 1873 coins and memorabilia. His collection presented here is another interesting grouping of pieces, mainly from 1873, including two-cent pieces, three-cent pieces, an 1873-CC arrows dime described as the third finest known, 1873-CC arrows quarter in Choice EF-45, 1873-CC no arrows half in Choice AU-55, and 1873-CC dollar in EF-40. There are five pattern Trade dollars from 1873. The Judd-1276 in Choice Proof condition is shown on the cover; the toning is magnificent! An example of this issue sold for \$16,000 in the Garrett Collection. There is also an 1873 \$3 gold in Proof-55 and an 1873 \$10 gold in EF-45 (a lesser example brought \$4,400 in the United States Gold Coin Collection auction). Completing his selection of 1873 coins are six pieces of extremely rare Colombian patterns. In addition, there are such interesting pieces as a bound volume of 1873 Harper's Weekly, part of which is shown on the cover.

You can read about the Harte coins in greater detail, but you cannot fully appreciate his collection unless you have met the man. Roy Harte is "one of the finest known" drummers in the world. He has performed as a drummer, producer, or leader for every major television, motion picture, and recording company in the United States and abroad. The list of artists that he has performed with is truly impressive, including Kay Starr, Eddie Fisher, Peggy Lee, Perry Como, Tommy Sands, Billie Holliday, Tennessee Ernie Ford, Doris Day, Rudy Vallee, the Andrews Sisters, the Inkspots, the Mills Brothers, Patti Page, Frank Sinatra, and many more. He has worked with jazz bands which include Dizzy Gillespie and Stan Kenton. He has played for television shows such as "The Bob Hope Show" and the "Danny Thomas Show." The list could go on and on. In 1948, Roy founded the Drum City Enterprises and the Los Angeles Theaseum. In doing so, he coined the word "theaseum," which is a combination of theatre and museum. The Los Angeles Theaseum is a public, non-profit corporation established to foster and exhibit the art and artifacts of music, and appear to be enjoying life to its fullest. I know that he will enjoy seeing the coins in his collection find new homes with interested and avid collectors.

Roy Harte's Collection is followed by the type of collection which we are always excited about, "an old-time collection." The bulk of the collection appears to have been formed between 1880 and 1920, with some additions made through the 1940s. Here are some of the highlights: an 1855 MS-63 cent with upright 5's in full mint red condition (this coin is illustrated on the cover); an 1856 flying eagle cent in AU-50; a nice run of Mint State and Proof Indian cents, including two 1909-S examples in MS-63; a very pleasing group of two-cent pieces highlighted by a rare 1872 business strike in MS-65 and an 1872 Proof-65; three-cent nickels include two MS-65 examples of the 1879 and four Proof 1880s; an extensive offering of five-cent pieces from 1886 to 1936 highlighted by an 1885 business strike in MS-65, which is shown on the cover. Look for the 1860 transitional half dime with the obverse of 1859 and the reverse of 1860, which is popularly known as a "coin without a country," because it does not have the legend of "United States of America." There is a very interesting group of patterns, including six 1858 transitional cents in original Choice condition and the commemorative silver includes an Isabella quarter and Fort Vancouver half, both MS-65.

Following this "old-time collection" is an unusually beautiful collection of Coronet type large cents, which is highlighted by a fantastic 1834 N-4 piece in MS-65. This lovely coin is illustrated on the cover. The collection includes a complete die variety set of 1816 cents, including examples of N-5 and N-7 varieties in MS-65. The 1817 cents are extremely well represented with thirteen examples of Mint State coins. The N-3 and N-6 varieties are in MS-65 condition and are a collector's delight. And pay particular attention to the extraordinary set of 1831 large cents. They are complete in all known Newcomb varieties. This grouping of 1831 cents ranks as the finest to ever come before public auction. Just look at the 1831 N-3. It is a beautiful MS-65 Choice Uncirculated piece.

The next section of the catalogue features a small, but exciting, consignment from Mrs. Andrew W. Williams, who is the granddaughter of President Theodore Roosevelt. The pieces shown were the property of President Roosevelt, who had such a profound impact on United States coinage. The consignment contains an 1814/3 \$5 gold piece in AU-55; 1908 \$5 and \$10 Matte Proof-55 pieces; 1795 eagle in AU-50; and 1880 eagle in EF-40. This interesting collection is highlighted by two beautiful rarities, a 1907 wire edge \$10 piece with periods in MS-63 and a 1907 MCMVII high relief double eagle in MS-65. These obviously were pieces that were given to the President as examples of the coinage which he and Augustus Saint-Gaudens had created. What a marvelous opportunity to own such exciting examples of numismatic history!

Following the Roosevelt grouping is an extensive offering of regular United States material, which begins with a 1793 half cent in EF-40 condition and flows through every major category of United States coinage. There are pieces valued from \$25 to thousands of dollars. The offering covers the length and breadth of United States numismatic coinage, offering items for the specialist and the type collector. There are 1,500 silver dollars alone!

Dr. George Fuld has catalogued a broad array of military orders and medals and a far-reaching presentation of Americana. The orders and medals area is highlighted by the Dr. Joseph Vacca collection and the John J. Ford, Jr. Hitler medal collection. The offering includes the Austrian and Belgian Order of Leopold; French Legion of Honor Knight's Cross Werlich 368, circa 1802-1814; Great Britain Order of the Bath, circa 1895; plus the Japanese Order of the Rising Sun and the Order of the Sacred Treasure; and the Dutch Order of Orange-Nassau-Military Commander.

John J. Ford, Jr. created the Hitler collection presented here. As a veteran of World War II, he fought in Germany and found these medals to be an interesting representation of this tumultuous time in our world history. The collection includes all Goetz issues, many in three sizes including seven pieces in gold which are unlisted, and four medals from Hitler's private collection liberated from the Braun Haus in Munich. Over 40 medals are completely unlisted in the standard reference, which was published in 1971!

The Civil War Store Cards include examples from Alabama, Kansas, Maryland, and Virginia. There is an unlisted "unique" McClellan die (Fuld 139/432) in silver and a recently-discovered unique New York and Harlem Railroad token in copper, circa 1840. There is also included a nice grouping of California fractional gold, including two R-8s. Two Morgan and Orr Coining Press medals of 1873 are presented, one in silver and one in brass (which is unique). Over 100 lots of the Stephen Album collection of medals of California are presented, with many rarities to tempt the collector. American militaria includes decorations, 15 lots of patriotic society orders, mostly in gold, and 17 magnificent lots of accoutrement plates, which are all original and expertised, mostly of the Civil War period.

As you can see, Bowers and Ruddy once again has brought you the finest and broadest selection of numismatic items for unreserved public auction. The Roy Harte Collection of 1873 Coins

U. S. Small Cents



1873 Indian cent. Closed 3 in date. Choice Proof-65, mint red and iridescent. Figure 3 in date heavy with knobs nearly touching; all proofs of this denomination from dies with the closed 3. Circulation strikes were made with the new open 3, but surprisingly, no Proofs.

Note: The change from the closed 3 to open 3 dates in all denominations was due to the following complaint by A. Louden Snowden, Chief Coiner, addressed to James Pollock, Director of the Mint, dated January 18, 1873:

"I desire in a formal manner to direct your attention to the 'figures' used in dating the dies for the present year. They are so heavy, and the space between each so small that upon the smaller gold and silver, and upon the base coins it is almost impossible to distinguish with the naked eye, whether the last figure is an eight or a three. In our ordinary coinage many of the pieces are not fully brought up, and upon such it is impossible to distinguish what is the last figure of this year's date. I do not think it is creditable to the institution that the coinage of the year should be issued bearing this defect in the date. I would recommend that an entire new set of figures avoiding the defects of those now in use, be prepared at the earliest possible day."

- 2 1873 Cent. Closed 3. Proof-60, mottled red and gold toning. From a Federal Brand Enterprises auction, 1966, Lot 141.
- 3 1873 Cent. Closed 3. Proof-60, lightly impaired on obverse only. Red to iridescent. Acquired from James Kelly of Dayton, Ohio (i.e. before 1964).
- 4 1873 Cent. Closed 3. Proof-55, cleaned, lightly impaired.



5 **1873 Cent. Closed 3. MS-60, Uncirculated**, dull brown with hints of gold. The closed 3 variety is normally seen in Proof. Mint State examples are quite scarce, at least ten times more so than the open 3 type. It is known that the changeover from closed 3 to open 3 occurred prior to April 1, 1873; thus most of the 11,676,500 1873 cents were struck in the open 3 style.





6 1873 Cent. Closed 3. Doubled die obverse, letters in LIBERTY all sharply doubled; the same kind of "die shift" that produced the famous 1955 cent. Discovered by Breen in the 1950s and still rare. MS-60, cleaned Uncirculated. Priced at \$500 in VF in Scott's 1976 edition (the last published); not priced in higher grades in that reference, indicating extreme rarity. Unpriced in all grades in the "Guidebook." We have handled two or three in ten years, all VF or below. From Paramount's Century sale, Lot 267.

U.S. Small Cents; 2c; Silver 3c

7 1873 Cent. open 3 in date. MS-60, Uncirculated, mottled tan and rose with underlying lustre. Also from the Paramount's Century sale (1965), Lot 266.



8 1873 Cent. Open 3. Struck 1/3 off-center. Fine, scratches on obverse blank portion, defect on reverse blank portion. Marked "unique."

U. S. Two-Cent Pieces



9 1873 Two-cent piece. Closed 3, knobs less than width of a knob apart, ball directly above 87 in date. Select Proof-63, brilliant golden, one reverse spot and a trace of an obverse fingerprint at left. Overall attractive and far above average. Purchased from the late John Cobb at the 1967 Cal-State Auction.

Note: Last year of issue for the two-cent piece and struck only in proof for inclusion in the sets. About 600 pieces were struck, with some of these melted after April 1, 1873, when the new Mint Act came into effect and abolished this denomination. The two-cent piece had gotten off to a fast start in 1864 with more than 19 million struck, but mintages trended steadily downwards as the coins piled up in vaults due to low demand for a denomination that was at best unnecessary. It has been estimated that nearly a third of all two-cent pieces ever struck (or over 15 million pieces!) were melted in 1873. Harry X Boosel, well-known 1873 specialist shows (see pg. 10 of his "1873-1873" book) that 11 dies for the two-cent piece (10 reverse dies and a single obverse) were destroyed "by sledge and fire" on January 2, 1874. The single obverse die was presumably the closed 3 die used to strike the present piece; 10 reverse dies evidently indicate that production had lagged behind expectations in the engraving department for many years and several unused reverses were left over.



- 10 **1873 Two cent piece. Closed 3. Select Proof-63**, glittering sea-green and golden brown. Reverse die same as used on the 1872 proofs with a sharp horizontal die line left from 2. All 1873 closed 3 coins used the same reverse. Another attractive example of this scarce issue.
- 11 **1873 Two-cent piece. Closed 3**; reverse as on the last two. **Proof-60**, cleaned or dipped brilliant orange, mirror surfaces partially intact so this will undoubtedly improve as it retones.



12 1873 Two-cent piece. Open 3, knobs smaller and greater than a knob diameter apart. Ball closer to 8 than 7; different reverse die, not seen on any other issue. Weight 95.1 grains, or close to standard. Choice Proof-65, pinkish tan, deepening to sunset tones at the rims. Dies not fully polished, resulting in only partly mirror surfaces, as usual, but struck as a Proof with full crisp detail. Rarer than the closed 3; Breen says by a ratio of 10 to 1; possibly fewer than 75 pieces struck.

Note: Probably a restrike, the dies being made after the denomination was terminated in April 1873. Since only one obverse die was mentioned as being destroyed in the January 2, 1874 letter quoted above, it is possible that this open 3 was not made until well into 1874. As a restrike, these pieces would not have been included in the listed proof mintage of 600 pieces (all those coins were closed 3 pieces distributed with the sets before April 1, 1873). The old figure of 500 1873 open 3 coins one sometimes comes across results from the known mintage of new-style 1873 proof sets (with the arrows coins and the trade dollar). However it is definitely known that these sets did not contain a two cent piece of any type, so the 500 mintage figure for the open 3 is wrong. Based on frequency of appearance, it is likely that the original mintage of this variety is closer to 75 pieces.

13 1873 Two-cent piece. Open 3. Proof-60, cleaned, poorly so on obverse. Not fully struck up on crossbars of shield; this is probably a characteristic of the variety as it occurs on all three pieces offered here. From Lester Merkin's November 1965 sale, Lot 197.

Unpublished "Business Strike" 1873 Two Cent Piece



14 1873 Two-Cent piece. Open 3, same dies as the last two. This piece has all of the characteristics of a business strike: Struck only once (not twice as on proofs), no evidence of special polishing of the blank, very weak at center horizontal lines of shield, leaves at top left and on motto IN GOD WE TRUST. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, mint red to gold brilliance, light traces of carbon. Weight 95.8 grains or about standard, proving these were made from standard two cent blanks. Unlisted as a non-proof and first actually seen, though a couple of others have been rumored of similar character.

U. S. Silver Three-Cent Pieces



15 1873 Three-cent silver. Closed 3 in date, as always, as the denomination was discontinued in April, 1873. Select Brilliant Proof-63, faint hairlines, light gold toning near the rims. 600 pieces struck, included with the no-arrows proof sets. It is unknown how many of these early style sets were melted in July, 1873, but Breen says the number was considerable. It is known that after the April, 1873 Mint Act, there were more than 60,000 trimes on hand at the mint which had never been distributed, evidently most of the business strikes dated after 1862. These were all melted in July and the bullion was recycled into arrows silver coins. This would explain the great scarcity of non-Proof late date three cent pieces.



16 **1873 Three-cent silver.** Select Brilliant Proof-63, equal to last but without the toning at the rim. Scarce.



17 **1873 Three-cent silver. Select Proof-63**, steel gray with lovely greenish gold and pastel overtones. Another excellent example, and probably the best of this group.

U. S. Nickel Three-Cent Pieces




18 1873 Three-cent nickel. Closed 3. Select Brilliant Proof-63, really a gem with a spot under the eye. About 1,100 pieces struck (600 for the old style sets, another 500 for the new style sets with arrows). Some of the former were melted and many of the survivors are very dull.



19 **1873 Three-cent nickel. Closed 3, as above. Select Proof-63,** gray and iridescent, slightly streaky, a trace of carbon on obverse.



- 20 **1873 Three-cent nickel. Closed 3. Select Proof-63**, more attractive than last with only a slight mottling of the toning keeping this from the Proof-65 level.
- 21 1873 Three-cent nickel. Open 3, this type not struck in Proof. AU-50, perhaps Uncirculated, but very dull, weakly struck in the centers and cleaned.
- 22 1873 Three-cent nickel. Open 3. AU-50, gray and iridescent, sharply struck from clashed dies.





- 23 1873 Nickel. Closed 3, 1 in date lightly recut at base, not noticed in Breen. Brilliant golden Select Proof-63, an attractive piece. Mintage the same as the 1873 three-cent nickel, approximately 1,100 pieces. It is interesting that all three of the minor coins, the cent, three-cent and five-cent nickel come only with the closed 3 in Proof, even though these pieces were inserted in the Type II Proof sets after the date punches had been changed. Obviously enough Proof dies were made at the beginning of the year to strike all Proof coins required, and rather than waste these dies by replacing them with open 3 dies, it was decided to use them as-is. After all, Proof sets would be going to collectors anyway, and there wasn't likely to be any problems with confusion of what the last figure of the date was. So no Proof dies of the new open 3 style were ever used for these denominations.
- 24 1873 Nickel. Closed 3, as before. Proof-60, cleaned, partly cloudy surfaces.



- 25 **1873 Nickel. Closed 3. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, lustrous golden**, attractive. Scarcer than generally known; most of this variety are proofs, as the date style was changed after only about 900,000 circulation strikes had been run off. We see at least four open 3 coins for every one of these.
- 26 1873 Nickel. Closed 3, knobs connected by a lumpy diebreak, completely closing the figure. It may have been a coin like this that prompted Snowden to write his letter complaining about the date figures. MS-60, Brilliant Uncirculated, appears to be from the Proof dies, and not impossibly a late Proof made after considerable die crumbling and wear.

U. S. Half Dimes



27 1873 Half dime. Closed 3, as on all (the denomination was terminated April 1, 1873, and evidently there were enough closed 3 dies on hand to take care of the required mintage). Valentine-1. Select Brilliant Proof-63, light hairlines and two tiny obverse field chips below arm at right. 600 Proofs struck, all for the first style sets, some melted with the unsold sets in July 1873.



28 1873 Half dime. V-2 (lower date; right ribbon end free). Select Proof-63, lovely original bluish gold iridescence. An excellent coin for a type set.



29 **1873 Half dime. MS-60, Uncirculated**, reddish gold lustre, sharply clashed dies.



30 1873-S Half dime. Mintmark placed below wreath as on the last of the 1872-S coins. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, gorgeous original silvery gold toning, well struck except at the rims, lightly clashed dies. Not rare (the only 1873-S silver coin reasonably common in Uncirculated condition) but an excellent type example; the last year of issue for this denomination.

Note: The year 1873 brought the curtain down on the half dime, a denomination that had been struck since the beginning of U.S. silver coinage in 1794. The main factor responsible for the demise of the half dime was the fact that it, along with other silver coins, had not circulated to any great extent since the suspension of specie payments in 1862. Instead, millions of U.S. silver coins were exported and largely remelted, although many of them circulated in the Caribbean and other places and later returned to U.S. circulation about 1876. In the meantime, a replacement for the half dime, the nickel five-cent piece, made its debut in 1866. It was very popular, both with the public, who liked a coin that would stay in circulation, and with the mint officials who were working out "creative" deals with nickel king Joseph Wharton for huge supplies of the metal at top prices. It has even been alleged that the half dime and silver three-cent piece were deliberately sabotaged in favor of their nickel equivalents because of influence from Wharton.

31 1873-S Half dime. AU-50, some lustre, pale toning. From the 1965 Century sale, Lot 570, as "Brilliant Uncirculated."

U. S. Dimes



32 **1873 Dime. No arrows, closed 3 in date. Select Proof-63,** some claims to Proof-65 on the grounds of overall eye-appeal. Choice original reddish gold deepening to an electric blue at the rims. 600 pieces struck for the Type I sets, but some later melted as unsold. Acquired from Lester Merkin's November 1965 sale, Lot 267.

Note: The number of Type I sets melted in July, 1873 has been a matter of debate for some time, and there are no definite figures available. If we note that there were 600 Type I sets and at least 500 Type II sets struck, giving a total of 1,100 1873

proof sets of both kinds, and compare this to the total number for 1872 (950 sets) and 1874 (700 sets), we can make some guesses. If we assume that only a minuscule number of collectors in 1873 wanted both types of sets (a likely assumption) then we can see that the "underlying demand" from Proof sets in the late 1870s was roughly 800 sets per year. This means that at 1100 sets, the 1873 sets were overproduced by 300 sets, and this gives a rough figure of the probable number melted as unsold in July, 1873. If we further assume that all of the melted sets were of the Type I variety (this is very likely because the mint would not release Type I sets after April 1, as the silver coins were not of the new legal weight) then the net number of Type I sets actually sold would be about 300 sets, against at least 500 sets of the Type II style. This implies that no arrows Proofs should be scarcer than Proofs with arrows, despite the listed mintage figures. This corresponds with what we see coming up for sale.



33 **1873 Dime. No arrows**, closed 3, as before. **Select Proof-63**, pale gold toning on reverse at left border, otherwise brilliant.



- 34 1873 Dime. No arrows, closed 3. Select Brilliant Proof-63, similar to last. A nice example.
- 35 1873 Dime. No arrows, closed 3. AU-50, much lustre, brilliant with a purple toning streak vertically across obverse.



- 36 1873 Dime. No arrows, open 3 in date. Choice AU-55, reddish gold and green toning, full underlying lustre and very close to Choice Mint State. Partial obverse wire rim. Many, many times rarer than the closed 3 without arrows; Taxay estimates a mintage of 60,000 against 1,508,000 of the closed 3, no arrows! The changeover to a new date punch must have occurred after most of the old style dimes had been struck; after April 1, all new dimes would have had to have arrows at the date. Also, Boosel points out that any coins of the no arrows type left undistributed were melted and recoined into arrows pieces. Since the open 3 coins were struck after the closed 3 style, it is only natural that more of them would have been undistributed as of April 1. A great sleeper at anything resembling a common date price; the scarcity of this issue has been known for many years, but too many people have simply not been paying attention!
- 37 1873 Dime. No arrows, open 3. EF-40, cleaned, sharp reverse rim nicks. Another example of this scarce issue. Also, 1873 dime with arrows in Fine-12, green and gold toning, ex Century sale as "VF" (grading was not the strictest back in 1965). (Total: 2 pieces)



38 1873 Dime. Arrows at date. Open 3 (arrows coins always have open 3, as the date change was made prior to April 1). Select Proof-63, very attractive and not far from Proof-65 level.

Third Finest 1873-CC Dime



1873-CC Dime. Arrows at date, open 3. Small short arrowheads; close 39 CC mintmark with first C low, fine crack runs through mintmark from ribbon end (this reverse die also used for 1874-CC). AU-50 or better, evidently never really in circulation, but cleaned, stripping it of most of its original mint lustre, and the surfaces are finely, though uniformly porous. However it is free of the usual roughness, pockmarks, and flaky planchet defects typical of this low mintage rarity; evidently the silver ore was not refined properly, resulting in a wretched alloy totally unfit for coinage. The 1873-CC is rarer in all grades than even its low mintage of 18,791 pieces implies, and usually comes G-VG and rough. The present piece is either third or fourth finest known of the date. The only Uncirculated examples ever reported to our knowledge are the F. C. C. Boyd coin (World's Greatest Collection) Lot 795, the Boosel piece (Rarcoa), later reappearing in the 1975 ANA sale, Lot 269 at \$13,000 and a piece in Kagin's "Sale of the '70s", Lot 1064 at a reported \$27,000 (grade not verified). It is not even clear that all of these are different coins, we suspect that they are not; specialist Kam Ahwash says he has only seen a single piece that he would consider as Uncirculated. Only two others have been traced at the EF level: R. L. Miles sale, Lot 721 (rough, sold for \$800) and Lot 146 of Pine Tree's Feb., 1975 sale at \$3500. One of the highlights of the sale for the dime collector.

Note: Mint records show that 12,400 1873-CC dimes without arrows were struck before April 1 and 18,791 pieces with arrows later. The no arrows coins were all struck on February 5, 1873, with five of them reserved for assay. All of the no arrows business strikes were melted, as they could not be released after April 1, due to the change in the legal weight. The only surviving piece is in the Eliasberg Collection, and this was one of the five original assay pieces as it has been traced back to A. L. Snowden at the Philadelphia Mint.



- 40 1873-CC Dime. Arrows at date. Sharpness of Fine-12 with full LIBERTY but tooled in fields to remove corrosion, some of which remains in the protected areas of the coin's surface. However definitely a genuine 1873-CC with the correct placement of the mintmark and the peculiar wide gauge edge reeding seen only on Carson City dimes of this era. Completely overshadowed by the preceding lot, but highly important in its own right and within the top dozen of the date in sharpness; the Gilhousen and Ruby coins were only VG. This is apparently the first time in history that two 1873-CC dimes have been offered in the same auction.
- 41 1873-S Dime. Arrows at date, open 3. VF-20, harshly cleaned.

U. S. Quarter Dollars



U.S. Dimes; Quarter Dollars

42 **1873 Quarter. No arrows**, closed 3 in date. **Select Brilliant Proof-63**, faintest hairlines, light field cut below first star, lint mark up from pole towards back of neck. The familiar reverse die with the "die cut" on left border of shield (we suspect that a short piece of wire was impressed into this reverse die during the hubbing operation). The same distinctive reverse was used on some of the 1872 Proof quarters and the die was reused again in 1880 on both Proofs and business strikes. Only 600 pieces struck for the Type I sets; some melted as unsold in July, 1873 along with a large number of no-arrows business strikes.



43 1873 Quarter. No arrows, closed 3, same reverse die as last. Select Proof-63 or better, really a borderline gem with lovely pale gold and sunset tones around border of obverse, and a silvery blue reverse with orange and red hues near the center. An exciting coin and worth a premium to the color enthusiast.



44 1873 Quarter. No arrows, closed 3, same reverse as last two. Select Brilliant Proof-63.



45 1873 Quarter. No arrows, closed 3; different reverse die without the die cut. Choice AU-55, much lustre, cleaned, lightly retoning a pale gold near the rims, dig at lower reverse above AR in QUAR. The edges display a fine greenish iridescence. Enough of the lustre survives to show that it is definitely not a Proof. Very rare as a non-Proof; Boosel originally claimed that all 1873 closed 3 quarters were Proofs, and at the time of the sale of his collection in 1972 (from where the present piece was acquired as Lot 601, as "Uncirculated" of course) there were only seven or eight pieces known, three of which were offered in our Terrell Collection (May, 1973), also from Mr. Boosel's holdings.

Note: All 1873 non-Proof quarters without the arrows are quite scarce, with the closed 3 Type rarer than the open 3, the converse of the situation for most of the other denominations. Evidently quarter production was delayed for some unknown reason at the beginning of 1873, and only a small number were made before the changeover to the new date style. Boosel, in his "1873-1873" book, pg. 33, quotes a letter from James Pollock (Director of the Mint) to an official of a Boston bank, in which Mr. Pollock, on Feb. 7, 1873, sent a package of \$50 worth of U.S. coins in exchange for \$50 in gold. The inventory shows that the shipment included \$10 in quarters but Mr. Pollock states: "The 25c pieces are of the year 1872: We have none for 1873 and no prospects of having any for a long time." Mr. Pollock did not elaborate on the problem that was holding up production of quarters, but this letter does make it clear that production was started very late, and therefore explains the scarcity of 1873 no arrows business strike quarters, especially those having the earlier closed 3 style.



46 1873 Quarter. No arrows, open 3. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, pale gold toning. Scarce as a non-Proof, though not as rare as the above closed 3 variety in business strike form. Taxay estimates a mintage of 143,700 pieces vs. 1,339,500 of the arrows style, making this nearly 10 times as rare (these figures do not even take into account probable later meltings of the no arrows business strikes). The fact that a good number of these were able to be struck off before April 1 (when the arrows were added) implies that the engraver lost no time in responding to Snowden's letter of January 18, 1873, recommending a change in the date punches. The scarcity of business strike closed 3 quarters indicates only that the denomination was not produced during the first couple of months of the year, as noted above.



47 1873 Quarter. Arrows at date, open 3, as on all arrows coins. Select Proof-63, brilliant with light scattered hairlines on obverse, mostly from old album slides. Same reverse die as on the earlier no-arrows proofs with the die-cut at left border of shield. A total of 540 pieces struck, 500 for the Type II sets, another 40 pieces, presumably distributed as singles during the year. An important and popular type coin with arrows at date.

Note: The arrows were added to the obverses of the dime, quarter and half dollar to mark a slight change in weight that was part of the April, 1873 Mint Act. In the case of the quarter, the weight was increased slightly from 6.22 grams to 6¼ grams, which would mean that four of the new quarters would weigh an "even" 25 grams of 900 fine silver. The increase in weight was done to bring U.S. coinage weights into conformance with the metric system of units. The metric system was very popular in Europe, and in the 1870s was really "in" among U.S. intellectuals and scientists. The idea of making U.S. coins conform to the metric system came up again in 1879 with the minting of the famous gold stellas and "metric" dollars.

As in the case of the 1853 weight change, arrows were added to the obverses of the coins to facilitate the sorting of the old weight coins (those struck prior to April 1, 1873) from the new weight coins. This was mostly a matter of expedience at the Mint and Treasury. After April 1, no more of the old weight coins could be released, as they were now of illegal weight under the new measure. The arrows enabled Mint and Treasury personnel to readily distinguish the new coins, which were to be shipped out immediately, from the old coins, which were to be held back, eventually to be melted. There was no widespread attempt to call in the old weight coins already in circulation. This would have been impossible, in any case, since millions had been issued and most were in the hands of hoarders or else were circulating outside of the country, and would not have been turned in even if the order to do so had been given. Instead, the old and new weight coins passed at equal values and it took many years before the old coins were completely retired from circulation (Walter Breen has stated that he remembers seeing coins as old as 1853 circulating during the Depression of the 1930s).

- 48 1873 Quarter. Arrows at date. Same dies as last. Proof-55, polished.
- 49 1873 Quarter. With arrows, as last. AU-50, harshly and poorly cleaned, traces of lustre remain at the rims.

1873-CC Quarter. Arrows at date. Choice EF-45, considerable lustre, pale gold toning near the rims. Free of the usual defects, and actually attractive, which is most unusual for any Carson City coin of this period. Only 12,642 pieces struck, the fifth lowest mintage from the CC Mint. Difficult to find even in Fine, these usually come in G-VG or rough, like the similar dimes. We can find no records for an Uncirculated example. There are five or six at the EF level or slightly above, including this one. Most of the major collections of this denomination have had well-worn specimens or lacked the date altogether. The following roster tells the story: Boyd (WGC) VF; Menjou, Lot 852, Fine; Atwater, VG; Miles sale, Lot 991, EF; Wolfson, Lot 844, Fine; Reed Hawn had none, never finding one attractive enough for him; Herbert Bergen, Lot 189, G-VG, tooled; Century sale, Lot 934, VF; James A. Stack, Lot 138, VG. Finally the Speir sale and the Boosel sale had none, and the Gilhousen and Ruby examples were only G-VG. We emphasize that the sales quoted above were the top sales for quarter dollars in this generation, and money was no object at all to most of these collectors. A major opportunity is at hand now; once it is gone it may not be repeated for many years.

Note: The rare 1871-1874 quarters from the Carson City Mint began appearing in coin auctions in the late 1870s, or only a few years after their mintage. There was little interest in collecting coins by mintmark in those days, however, and the pieces received little attention. By the 1940s, collectors began to notice that these dates were never turning up in decent condition, and prices were bid sharply upwards with further significant price appreciation during the war years when several large and important collections came on the market. It is largely the great rarity of these CC quarters in decent condition that makes assembling a date collection of Liberty seated quarters such a forbidding and gruesome task. As far as we know, only one collector in history has ever done it, F.C.C. Boyd, over 40 years ago. The ultimate rarity is, of course, the 1873-CC without arrows, a coin of which only two are believed to exist (the Eliasberg piece and the one sold in 1975 in the James A. Stack sale) and both are Uncirculated. For years, coin catalogues idiotically listed this issue in all grades from Good to Uncirculated, even though no coins had ever traded in those conditions. For example, the 1976 edition of Scott's quotes the 1873-CC no arrows quarter in six (!) different grades as follows: Good \$500, VG \$600, Fine \$750, VF \$1500, EF \$3000, AU \$5000.



- 51 1873-CC Quarter. Arrows at date. Sharpness of VF-20, but heavy pitting and roughness tooled off obverse. A coin that should have been left alone, but worth a good price even as it is, since it is one of the sharper examples of this rarity around. Guaranteed genuine: position of mintmark and other die characteristics as well as edge pattern matches the preceding piece.
- 52 1873-S Quarter. Arrows at date. Choice EF-45 with rich gold toning, some lustre. About as nice as is normally obtainable; we remember handling an AU about a year ago (in the Clifford sale, Lot 1647) but no Mint State ones have passed our way in many years. The great rarity of this date in Uncirculated condition has never really been recognized, perhaps due to the common availability of the similar 1874-S, a hoard of which was dispersed more than a decade ago.

U. S. Half Dollars



53 1873 Half dollar. No arrows, closed 3. Select Brilliant Proof-63, few faint hairlines, but a beautiful glittering piece. Only 600 pieces struck for the Type I sets, with probably up to half of these melted in July, 1873, leaving a net coinage of only about 300 pieces. Scarce and underrated, like the no arrows quarter.



- 54 1873 Half dollar. No arrows, closed 3. Proof-60, absolutely gorgeous deep original iridescence (olive and rose obverse; bluish pink reverse) but a faint obverse field scratch in left field and a scrape at rim left of date reduce the overall grade to Proof-60.
- 55 1873 Half dollar. No arrows, closed 3. Proof-55, faint signs of circulation. Rich gold toning.
- 56 1873 Half dollar. No arrows, closed 3. Choice EF-45, nice pastel and gray toning. From the Century sale, Lot 1251.
- 57 1873 Half dollar. No arrows, closed 3. VF-20, reddish gray toning.



58 1873 Half dollar. Arrows at date, open 3. Proof-60, brilliant hairlined obverse, lightly toned reverse. Superior to most offered at this grade level. According to Boosel, 550 of these were struck, 500 for the Type II sets, the other 50 pieces distributed as singles. A highly popular type coin.



- 59 1873 Half dollar. Arrows at date, scarce variety with quadruple stripes in obverse shield. MS-60, frosty Uncirculated, weak obverse strike, few light scratches from poor handling, delicately toned. A double obverse die: note the doubling of the shield border, on letter of LIBERTY, drapery folds, and fingers. There were only three or four pieces known as late as 1960, but more have turned up since, of course, and this variety is certainly no longer the high R-6 listed in Taxay, though it is still scarce. The same kind of quadruple stripes effect also occurs on a variety of the 1844 silver dollar. The present piece was acquired at Lester Merkin's March, 1967 sale, Lot 365.
- 60 1873 Half dollar. Arrows type. Long arrowheads, triple stripes. AU-50, gold toning.
- 61 1873 Half dollar. With arrows, as above. VF-20, light toning.



62 1873 Half dollar, with arrows. An interesting counterstamped piece. Counterstamp "Bradley and Smith Brushes, N.Y." around obverse in an arc, "Tiffany & CO. N.Y." at center of obverse, and a third counterstamp on reverse, "Asbury Park N.J." Overall VG, black corrosion on reverse, either once in a fire or dropped in the ocean for a time (at Asbury Park, N.J.?). It has been said that coins could tell interesting stories if they could only speak; here is one that could tell a heck of a tale!

Important 1873-CC No Arrows Half Dollar



63 1873-CC Half dollar. No arrows, closed 3; small round CC mintmark. AU-50, cleaned, little sign of anything in the way of real wear, but too much lustre has been lost due to the cleaning. A coin sold in the past as "Uncirculated," probably many times. We are aware of only a handful of pieces equal to or better than this one: Garrett, Lot 354, reappearing in Auction '82, Lot 1693 is evidently the finest and is a gem. Then come two Uncirculated pieces, the Boosel coin and the one in the Reed Hawn sale. Three more listed as Uncirculated but actual grade unknown are the Miles, J. A. Stack, and Atwater coins. There are probably 8-10 additional pieces at the EF level; the others mostly VG-Fine. Although 122,500 pieces were struck, many of these are believed to have been melted and recoined into the arrows type; the same fate took all of the 1873-S halves with no arrows, and this piece does not exist today.



64 **1873-CC Half dollar. Arrows at date.** Different reverse die with the CC mintmark more closely spaced. **Choice EF-45**, attractively lustrous, an area of gold toning on obverse. Evidence of advanced die fatigue on reverse (note pronounced flow lines toward rims and light peripheral diecracks). Another coin that is rare in the top grades. Like other Carson City rarities it is so often overgraded that it is difficult to pin down a Condition Census. We have records of 4 or 5 Uncirculateds and 5 or 6 AU's, but some of these are probably no better than the present piece. Another opportunity for the specialist.



65 **1873-S Half dollar. With arrows. Choice EF-45 lustrous.** Another "sleeper" among Liberty seated coins. Our records show this to be really difficult to find better than EF, and the date is nearly unobtainable in strict (no rub) Uncirculated condition. Yet it catalogs for only a small increment above a common Philadelphia arrows half dollar.

Note: 1873 half dollars were released from San Francisco of the arrows style only. The "phantom" 1873-S no arrows has been a real mystery coin since Beistle listed one in his half dollar treatise, but the coin has never turned up. Harry X Boosel was able to find out that the San Francisco Mint struck 1873 no arrows half dollars in February 1873 (along with that other phantom coin, the 1873-S seated dollar). On March 5, one of the coins was sent to Philadelphia for assay purposes. The rest were not released before the April 1 changeover to the arrows contrary to that in the new Mint Act, and all were presumably melted, along with all of the 1873-S silver dollars.

U. S. Silver Dollars



66 **1873 Seated dollar.** Closed 3 in date, as always. **Select Brilliant Proof-63**, light scattered hairlines in fields, still very attractive. Highly popular as the final year of issue; 600 pieces struck, some remelted in July 1873 as were many of the business strikes.

Note: The silver dollar was suspended by Act of February 12, 1873. The Liberty seated dollar had never achieved a wide circulation; indeed the coin was barely known to the general public. The silver dollar was the only coin not reduced in weight in 1853, and so it contained more silver than two half dollars or four quarters or ten dimes. Hence, until the early 1870s, it was profitable to melt down new silver dollars for the bullion content. For this reason, mintages were low, and the coins tended to stay out of circulation. By suspending the silver dollar, the currency unit was now defined in terms of gold exclusively, which means that the country was now effectively on a gold standard. Beginning in the 1870s, the price of silver started to fall on bullion markets because of overabundant supply from the western mines. It was no longer profitable to melt silver dollars for the bullion content, but the Treasury began retiring them and nearly all of them must have been removed from circulation by 1878, when the new Morgan dollar made its debut. Several bags of circulated seated dollars were released by the government in the early 1960s, as well as bags of Uncirculated 1859-O, 1860-O, and 1871 dollars that had never been released, all at face value!



- 67 **1873 Seated dollar. Proof-60**, cleaned years ago, now retoning to a natural bluish golden.
- 68 1873 Seated dollar. VF-20 with light gray toning.

Very Rare 1873-CC Silver Dollar



69 1873-CC Seated dollar. EF-40, prooflike lustre, attractive for grade, formerly auctioned as "AU". One of the top condition pieces in existence; comparable to specimens in the Atwater, Miles, Wolfson, and Ostheimer collections, and these were four of the greatest collections ever offered. Surely one of the finest available pieces, and another highlight of this offering. Only 2,300 pieces struck of this final year of issue; rarest obtainable seated dollar. More difficult to find in EF or better than an 1851 silver dollar. Only the 1870-S is rarer among regularly issued seated dollars (the 1866 no motto is not a regular issue and the 1873-S was never issued).

70 **1873 Trade dollar.** Open 3, as on all. **Proof-60**, cleaned, retoning. 865 pieces struck, according to Boosel. 500 of these went into the Type II sets, the remainder were sold as singles of this new denomination.



71 **1873 Trade dollar. Proof-60**, brilliant obverse, bluish rose reverse. Light hairlines and a few minor field nicks but much superior to last.



- 72 **1873 Trade dollar. Proof-60**, deep bluish violet, signs of an old cleaning. From Lester Merkin's Nov., 1965 sale, Lot 312.
- 73 1873 Trade dollar. EF-40, cleaned, couple of surface scrapes on reverse.



74 **1873-S Trade dollar. MS-60**, **Uncirculated**, lovely pink and sunset tones. The large mintage does not begin to reflect the rarity of this

date; it is known that more than 80 percent were shipped to China and were later remelted, according to the Director's report of January, 1877. In Uncirculated condition the 1873-S trade very seldomly comes up for sale.

- 75 1873-S Trade dollar. AU-50, attractive gold toning.
- 76 1873-S Trade dollar. AU-50, pale gold toning.
- 77 1873-S Trade dollar. EF-40, harshly cleaned, obverse rim bump right of date.

Magnificent Pattern Trade Dollar, J-1276

78 1873 Pattern trade dollar. Judd-1276. Silver. Reeded edge. Head of Liberty with coronet facing left; inscriptions enclosed in a laurel wreath. Magnificent Choice Proof, iridescent toning of uncommon beauty: bluish lilac in centers changing to a pale olive-gold near the rims. Light underlying hairlines as always on pattern trade dollars, but the beauty of the colors more than make up for it. Sheer magnificence. A similar, but demonstrably different one realized \$4000 as Lot 628 of our Harte II sale in March 1981. The record is the \$16,000 one received in our Garrett sale, Lot 1069. Current Judd evaluation is \$5000, which seems reasonable enough.

Note: Does the design of a coin have an influence on how it tones? We note that this particular pattern, with its wide-open fields tends to tone beautifully, in contrast to other pattern trade dollars of the same period. We have noticed for a long time that Franklin halves tone better than Liberty walking halves, Morgan dollars tone better than Peace dollars, Barber dimes tone better than Mercury dimes, and so on. It seems that composition and die preparation affect how the piece will later tone, but we are slowly grasping the idea that the actual design of the coin makes a difference. It seems that a design with ample flat open space in the fields promotes better toning than a design cluttered with shurp angular projections of the device (such as rays on the peace dollar) and little open space in the fields. Any comments from our readers?



79 1873 Pattern trade dollar. J-1281. Silver, reeded edge. The Bailly design, featuring a snarling, very masculine "Ms" Liberty with close cropped hair. Proof, harshly cleaned decades ago, dulling the surfaces and leaving numerous hairlines; this has since toned back to a deep seagreen and blue. Center of reverse not fully brought up, as always, this alone would have been enough to condemn this artistically poor design. Superior to the piece sold as Lct 633 of our Harte II sale (that piece was well circulated but still managed to bring \$800).

Note: Estimated mintage of 50 pieces. This, like the last, and along with J-1293, J-1310, J-1315, J-1322 in silver were issued as six-piece sets by the mint. In nineteenth century auction catalogues they were always referred to as the "regular trade set" without further elaboration.



80 1873 Pattern trade dollar. J-1293. Silver, reeded edge. Reverse similar to last, both adopted from Barber's Amazonian design. Proof, also cleaned, though not as severely as the last, moderate hairlines, mirror surfaces partly intact, pale gold tones commencing. Also from the regular six-piece trade dollar set, although once considered as very rare due to an omission in the old Adams-Woodin reference (evidently a mere typographical error). The present piece is surely comparable to Roy Harte's duplicate, sold as Lot 637 of our March, 1981 sale, at \$1750.



81 **1873 Pattern trade dollar. J-1310.** Silver, reeded edge. The Barber Indian princess design copied from Longacre's pattern dollars of 1870; reverse as used on J-1304. **Proof**, glittering Choice obverse, reverse somewhat duller, but this is partly as made; the die not given the final fine polishing necessary to bring out full mirror surfaces. Attractive reddish gold toning with faint hairlines. Part of the regular trade dollar set. The comparable piece in our Harte II sale brought a very strong \$4400.

Note: The trade dollar was a new denomination and had to be designed "from scratch" so as not to resemble the Liberty seated dollar. William Barber designed many different patterns and these were submitted for consideration of what the new design would be. That Barber had a difference of opinion with Mint officials as to what was the best design is evidenced by this letter of June 3, 1873, from Superintendent Pollock to Mint Director Linderman (based in Washington, D.C.) quoted from Boosel's "1873-1873" book:

"Your letter of the 2nd inst. acknowledging (sic) receipt of trade dollar specimens & has been received.

I communicated to Mr. Barber the contents of your note, and directed him to carry out your suggestions so far as we could understand them without the aid of the specimen selected. We can more certainly meet your wishes if you will forward to me the specimen or specimens likely to be selected, with such criticisms and suggestions as you may desire to make concerning them. We will then be able to correct and amend intelligently.

I have said to Mr. Barber that he must do as required—must yield his opinions, if necessary to others who have the right of selection and direction. I will try to have your directions carried out. We must have a coin worthy of our country [what a placating statement this is! - · JDP]

I enclose you (no 8) another specimen which I think is equal to any of those sent. My preference is, however, for the obverse of the plaster model. Please send me at your earliest convenience the specimens above indicated. They will be returned to you, if desired."



82 **1873 Pattern trade dollar. J-1322.** Silver, reeded edge. **Brilliant Proof**, light hairlines, but mostly choice. These pattern trade dollars are always seen with at least some hairlining as all have been cleaned with various success or failure by their many collector-owners. The Harte II coin, Lot 652, realized \$3300.

Note: Also part of the regular six-piece trade dollar set: an example of five of the six pieces from this set is offered here (only J-1315 is lacking). The Chapman brothers considered this the poorest of the six designs, pointing out that the bale of cotton on the end implies that Liberty would have to be about 15 feet high in order to preserve proportion. However this is not a valid criticism by itself, for as any artist knows, freedom to manipulate proportions is absolutely essential to good art. The Connecticut commemorative half dollar comes to mind here as an example of deliberate freedom of proportion: look at the size of the leaves on the oak tree—compared to the tree itself they would have to be more than a foot long in order to strictly maintain proportion.



83 **1873 Pattern trade dollar.** J-1327. Regular dies, struck in copper, listed as R-7 in Judd. **Proof**, but harshly scrubbed to an unnatural orange color; mirror surfaces completely destroyed. From our Harte II sale, Lot 655 where this was identified as once being part of the Farouk Collection, though the eccentric playboy-king was surely not the only one that scrubbed his coins to death. Very rare.

- 90 1873 \$21/2. Closed 3. Also AU-50.



- 91 **1873 \$2**¹⁄₂. Open 3. MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated, frosty with reddish gold toning, attractive.
- 92 1873-S \$2½. Closed 3 as always. The dies were shipped to the branch mints at the end of 1872 and so all have the closed 3 style. Fine-12, nearly VF. Only 27,000 of these struck.

93 1873 \$3 gold. Breen-3. Closed 3 in date, fields are flat (not dished). Proof-55, slightly circulated as are most, mirror surfaces in the protected areas of the surface, light wear in fields and on high points of obverse, obverse scratch through STATES. Probably in circulation for a few months. Rare proof-only date; no 1873 \$3 gold pieces were ever made for circulation. The official mintage is only 25 pieces, but there are about 75 pieces existing today. One of the most researched coins in the U.S. gold series. Another 1873 rarity from Roy Harte; should see spirited bidding.

Note: Believed to be a restrike, even though it has a closed 3 in the date. Instead the open 3 coins are believed to be the originals, a situation exactly opposite to all of the other gold denominations, in which Proofs were made only with the closed 3 style. The entire situation will never be known but we can hypothesize as follows: the closed 3 die was the one made first, as with the other denominations; probably in late 1872. However gold Proof sets were not struck off until February, 1873, by which time the dates had been changed to the open 3 type on the business strikes. For some reason the original 53 die with closed 3 was rejected and laid aside, perhaps because of poor hubbing or some small defects on the die. In any event, a new die, this with the new open 3 was made in February and used to strike off the 25 pieces that were

included in the gold Proof sets, all delivered Feb. 18. The rejected closed 3 die need not have been destroyed before the end of the year. The guess is that it was employed to make clandestine (i.e. unreported) Proofs to sell to collectors (it must have been well known that the 1873 \$3 would be a rarity even before the end of the year). Either most of these restrikes were not sold, and later released into circulation, or collectors spent them in later years, for most we have seen display obvious wear, with a few worn down to Fine level. The above remarks are consistent with the research of Boosel and Breen, and seem to be the most probable of the possible alternatives. An interesting article on the 1873 \$3 by Boosel appears in the January, 1981 issue of "The Numismatist".

According to Breen and David Akers, the total population of all four varieties of the 1873 \$3 is likely to be about 75 pieces, consisting of less than 20 originals with open 3 (out of 25 struck), 7 or 8 closed 3 restrikes with dished surfaces and about 50 closed 3 restrikes with flat fields, and 1 or 2 open 3 pieces from rusted dies, also presumably restrikes. Note that the February, 1874 letter by Snowden which inventories the dies destroyed "by sledge and fire" mentions two obverse dies and three reverse dies for the 1873 \$3 gold (the reverse is the date side on this denomination). Thus both the open and closed 3 dies, plus an additional unknown die never used were destroyed on January 2, 1874, which would mean that the "restrikes" were coined during 1873 and therefore not really restrikes at all. However they were secret issues of some kind, since they are not accounted for in the Mint reports. David Akers also takes the position that there are no 1873 restrikes, both open and closed 3 coins having been struck during 1873. He even states his opinion that the closed 3 pieces were mostly struck for circulation and the well-known "dished" coins were the first 1873 proofs. Obviously this is a controversial date, but this makes the coin more fascinating to study.

- 94 1873 \$5. Closed 3 and open 3. EF-40 and Choice EF-45, lustre on both. (Total: 2 pieces)
- 95 1873 \$5. Closed 3 and open 3. Both EF-40. (Total: 2 pieces)



- 96 1873-CC \$5. Closed 3 as always. Fine-12, attractive for grade. Unknown above EF, always comes F-VF. The U.S. Gold Coin Collection example was a VF.
- 97 1873-CC \$5. VG-8, also attractive for the grade.



98 1873-S \$5. Closed 3. EF-40, harshly cleaned, starting to retone an orange gold. Very rare condition, only 31,000 struck. Tends to come F-VF when seen at all. Comparable in sharpness to the piece just sold in our U.S. Gold Coin Collection.

99 1873-S \$5. Fine-12.

100 1873 \$10. Closed 3. A perfect Choice EF-45 with glittering prooflike surfaces in the protected areas; sharp but tiny obverse rim nick at 2:30. One of the finest known; only 800 business strikes made, of which no more than 12 or 15 pieces survive. Much finer than the Choice VF-30 in the U.S. Gold Coin Collection sale that brought \$4000. Ex Harry X Boosel (Rarcoa, 1972); Lot 629. A prize for the gold specialist and equal to the finest known nonproof. A grossly underrated date; actually a little rarer than the highly publicized 1858.

Note: According to Breen, the 800 non-proofs were struck in January, while the 25 Proofs (for the sets) were struck in February, all with closed 3 and all from the same pair of dies. Here is an unusual situation where Proofs were coined from dies which had been used earlier on business strikes. The roster of known pieces is small indeed and there are none that will grade better than EF.



101 1873-CC \$10. Sharpness of EF-40, but apparently acid-treated, leaving a dull, grainy, etched surface. Another rarity, especially this sharp. Just 4,543 pieces struck with perhaps 25 of them surviving today, mostly F-VF with none exceeding the present piece in sharpness. The U.S. Gold Coin Collection piece was graded VF-30.



- 102 **1873-S \$10. VF-20**, some lustre, light reddish gold, attractive, markfree surfaces. 12,000 pieces struck but rarer than the mintage suggests, usually available only in F-VF with no Uncirculateds known to exist and perhaps two pieces that could honestly be called AU.
- 103 1873-S \$10. VF-20, some lustre, not quite as nice as last, a little more nicked up. The U.S. Gold Coin Collection piece was graded VF-30.



- 104 **1873 \$20 with closed 3 in date** (the date punch used on the seated dollar). **AU-50, highly lustrous, reverse nearly Mint State.** A rare coin; Boosel did not find one until 1965; his 1957 and 1958 "Scrapbook" articles refer to this variety as being Proof-only. Listed by Taxay (1976 edition) at \$1200 in AU and \$1750 in Uncirculated.
- 105 1873 \$20. Open 3, date punch as on the trade dollar. AU-50, lustrous.
- 106 1873 \$20. Open 3. EF-40, some lustre.
- 107 1873-S \$20. Closed 3. EF-40, cleaned, light scratches on both sides.
- 108 1873-S \$20. Closed 3. VF-20, light toning.
- 109 1873-S \$20. Open 3. VF-20, cleaned.



110 1873-CC \$20. Date level; wide CC mintmark. Choice EF-45, much original mint lustre, close to AU level and one of the finer ones available, as this normally comes heavily marked up and dull. The U.S. Gold Coin Collection piece was EF-40 at best. We know of 5 or 6 at the AU level but none in strict Uncirculated.



111 **1873-CC \$20. EF-40**, considerable lustre, also far above average surfaces free of the usual heavy nicks and dings. Easily worth \$1000 to the underbidder of the previous lot.

The following lots of California gold are all dated 1873, a more popular year in the series. All pieces are attributed to the two standard works on the subject, Doering published in 1980 and 1981 (second edition) and Lee published in 1980. Rarities are from data kindly supplied by John Roe. Estimates are realistic market values, not the inflated ones given by Doering.

- 112 1873 25c. Octagonal Indian head. Doering 5, Lee 43A rated as a R-6. Lovely prooflike Brilliant Uncirculated. (\$135-175)
- 113 Pair of 1873 25c, Octagonal and Round Liberty heads. (1) Octagonal Liberty head, D-70A and Lee 41B rated as R-5 in Uncirculated; and (2) Round Liberty head, D-163 and Lee 43A rated as R-4 in About Uncirculated. (Total: 2 pieces) (\$200-250)
- 114 Pair of 1873 25c. Octagonal and Round Liberty heads. (1) Octagonal Liberty head, D-70A and Lee 41B rated as R-5 in About Uncirculated; and (2) Round Liberty head, D-163 and Lee 43A rated as R-4 in About Uncirculated. (Total: 2 pieces) (\$190-235)



- 115 1873 25c. Round Indian head from extremely rare dies. D-105C, not in Lee. Obtained unclassified by Mr. Harte in 1965 for \$22. Basically it is prooflike Uncirculated, but there is a minor dent visible on reverse, similar to that on the Doering plate coin. United States Assay Commission Medals of 1873

U.S. Assay Commission medals, a very specialized and limited series, have finally come into their own in recent years, especially with the publication of Julian's Medals of the United States Mint The First Hundred Years 1792-1892, published by TAMS in 1976. Although the Assay Commission was established in the first years of the Mint, these limited medals awarded to each member (with very little overrun), was the only tangible reward to this official non-salaried government position. First issued in 1860, with a lapse during the Civil War, they were regularly issued into the mid 1970s when the Commission was abolished in an "economy" move by President Carter. Of course in the Harte Collection, only medals of 1873 are represented.



- 121 U. S. Assay Commission medal for 1873 in silver, Julian AC-12. This medal shows the common obverse showing Archimedes used from 1871 to 1875, but makes a radical departure from the typical stereotype previously used. The reverse shows a draped tombstone in honor of the late Director of the Mint, Adam Eckfeldt who died that year. Julian concludes, and rightly so that the overall issuance of medals in this year (silver, copper, aluminum and white metal) probably exceeded 50 copies because of the commemorative nature of the issue. The only recent sales of this medal were in Rarcoa's Boosel Sale, April 1972 Lot 916, and in the Garrett IV Sale, Lot 1942 at \$900, an extraordinary price. This specimen is ex Lester Merkin Sale, Sept. 25 and 26, 1970 Lot 642 at \$80, and then ex Quality Sales Corp. Mail Sale, Lot 1336 of June 29, 1970. This piece is a lovely toned silver Proof and about as nice as any in existence. (\$400-500)
- 122 U.S. Assay Commission medal 1873 in copper. Also listed as Julian AC-12, and probably about as rare as a silver piece. Not represented in Garrett holding but in Rarcoa's Boosel Sale as Lot 917, this specimen is ex Quality Sales Corp. Mail Bid Sale, Lot 725 of Sept. 13, 1971 at \$80. It is a choice Proof, with most original red toning. (\$350-450)
- 123 U.S. Assay Commission medal 1873 in aluminum. Listed as Julian AC-12, and excluding the very rare white metal issue, the rarest of the three regular metals. Aluminum was still a precious metal in 1873, having been used mostly for some Mint patterns. We feel that this fabric was issued in very limited quantities. Not in Rarcoa's Boosel Sale or Garrett IV Sale. Ex Quality Sales Corp. Mail Bid Sale, Lot 726 on Sept. 13, 1971 at \$90. A lovely virtually hairline-free Proof. (Estimate) (\$400-500)

U.S. Assay Commission Medals; Colombia Pattern Series



124 Morgan & Orr, Phila. Coinage Press for the San Francisco Mint, Oct. 1873 struck in silver. This pieced in silver, is the extremely rare recognized fabric of silver, listed as Wright 722, Kenney 179 and H-K 1003 (in the rarity section reserved for pieces with 1-3 known). Approximately 4-5 pieces are now known in silver, the only auction record noted being in a PCAC Sale of 1975, at \$500. Later in the sale we offer in Lot 3739, the only known specimen in brass.

Of major importance as directly related to the U.S. Mint and similar to the 1906 Denver so-called dollar (\$20 gold size) struck for the opening of the Mint. Both pieces should be included in the Judd pattern book, in one of the appendices. About Very Fine, weakly struck as are all, 418.5 grns in weight - almost exactly the weight of a silver dollar, plain edge. Due to low relief, all appear to have weak lettering. 37 mm. in diameter. Of major importance to pattern, so-called dollar, and California collectors. Of interest, included with the lot, is a tear page from a 1960 vintage Kagin Sale, Lot 1431 offering the same piece in bronze (maybe brass?) with a plain edge, and it is possible that one or two of the other known silver pieces have reeded edges. A copy with one side only was offered in the Bowers and Ruddy Roy Harte I sale, as Lot 445.

The piece differs from the regular issue, having nine stars below the bust, and the engravers initials, "A.B." (Albert Barre.) beneath the hair. The word "ESSAII" appears nears lower right border. Reverse is similar to regular design, but words "LEI 0,900." face inward, and not outward. "ESSAII" appears below the shield. Apparently struck in brassgilt, with blank reverses, plain edges. 128 Colombian 1873 10 Peso struck in copper almost identical to regular issue. See Krause 40.1 and Friedberg 104. 264 **1872 MS-65, brilliant golden Choice Uncirculated**, attractive red lustre, different dies than last with 2 in date closed at bottom and diecracks extending from both ribbon ends. WE weakly struck, rims highly rounded. Not merely a dull Proof, but a true business strike and many times rarer than the Proof so. Only 65,000 of these struck, some undoubtedly melted in or after July, 1873, when the denomination was terminated; few saved at time of issue by collectors since proofs were issued for demand. This beautiful piece should create active bidding.

269 **1879 MS-65, Choice Brilliant Uncirculated**, completely frosty light gray with faint obverse flyspecks and two or three tiny nicks. Very scarce as a non-proof, only 38,000 pieces struck and seldom seen even in circulated grade.



270 **1879 MS-65, Choice Brilliant Uncirculated**, gray to brilliant, nearly as nice as last, few spots on either side. Scarce.



271 **1880 Choice Brilliant Proof-65**, a warm golden obverse, and steel blue reverse. A beautiful coin of which only 3,955 Proofs were minted. Worthy of a bid of close to \$1000 or more.



- 272 **1880 Choice Brilliant Proof-65**, same colors as last, two obverse surface chips as made, and quite common on these coins.
- 273 1883 Select Brilliant Proof-63, excellent color and depth, but spotted.
- 274 1883 Select Brilliant Proof-63, similar, spotting heavier on obverse.



275 **1885 Select Brilliant Proof-63**, a gorgeous gem, but there are three or four moderate obverse spots; if these could be removed even partially without harming the surfaces, the value of this coin would soar. Scarce item; recent records to \$500-600 for dull gray Proofs, this should easily be worth \$1000. U.S. Nickel Three-Cent Pieces; Nickel Five-Cent Pieces



276 **1887 Select Brilliant Proof-63**, good color and depth but spotted. Still worth more than the \$500-600 dull gray ones bring. Scarce.

- 277 1866 Rays. MS-60, Uncirculated, obverse fingerprint, light spots. Fairly well struck for this date.
- 278 1866 Rays. MS-60, Uncirculated, harshly cleaned, mostly dull, fairly well struck for issue.

- 282 1869 MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated, attractive, though not the best strike imaginable. Die polish lines and a couple of flan chips, both very typical on shield nickels.
- 283 1869 MS-60, Uncirculated, the usual dull lustre and strike. Entire date lightly repunched, but no sign of an overdate. First S in STATES unfinished at top (defective punch). Original engraver guide lines for laying out die visible around STATES, most interesting. Actually we have seen this feature on a few other dates, so it was evidently on the reverse hub.
- 284 1870 MS-60, Uncirculated, dull, usual weak strike, same die characteristics at STATES.
- 285 1870 MS-60, Uncirculated, much better lustre than last, all S's on reverse now defective.
- 286 1872 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, gray. Both S's in STATES now perfect (punch replaced) but the S in CENTS unfinished at bottom loop.
- 287 1872 MS-63, gray Select Uncirculated, identical dies to last; shows the same obverse diecrack through cross and leaves at left.



288 **1879 MS-63, Select gray Uncirculated,** completely frosty and mostly choice. Rarer than a Proof by far, only 25,900 pieces struck and few saved due to the availability of Proofs. Like the three-cent nickel of this date, undervalued compared to the 1878, which has been touted as a proof-only date for decades, but it is really no rarer than the 1879.

289 1879 MS-60, partly dull and with some obverse carbon at left border.



- 290 1882 MS-65, Choice Brilliant Uncirculated, a golden beauty, but has light reverse fingerprint.
- 291 1882 MS-65, Choice Brilliant Uncirculated, as the last, but here the fingerprint is on the obverse, thus, this one will bring a bit less. Ultraheavy reverse die polish on both of these; nothing subtle here, the die must have been gone over with a heavy wire brush or something similar, possibly to remove rust or clash marks.



- 292 1883 Shield. Select Brilliant Proof-63, spotted and some light hairlines mingled with the usual die polish lines.
- 293 1883 Shield. Select Brilliant Uncirculated-63, attractive, few obverse spots. Last year of type.



- 294 1883 Liberty type, no CENTS. Choice Proof-65. Unusual copper and silver mottled toning on obverse. Scarce Proof issue.
- 295 1883 No CENTS. MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated. Prooflike.
- 296 1883 With CENTS. A pair of MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated, with golden, toning. (Total: 2 pieces)



- 297 **1884 Choice Uncirculated-65**, brilliant to attractively golden. A beautiful business strike sure to find its way into the finest collection.
- 298 1884 Select Brilliant Proof-63, partly cloudy obverse with some light spots.

- 299 **1885 MS-65**, **Choice Uncirculated**, lavender gray obverse, brilliant golden reverse, heavy mint frost on both sides. The obverse exhibits several cracks, the most interesting one a jagged line from forehead sloping down to rim. Really a premium coin and has to be ten times rarer than a Proof of the same date, based on what we see offered. The 1885 is the key date of the Liberty nickel series. Most are well-worn with even fully Fine examples amazingly hard to find; VF and EF-AU ones are much, much rarer than the Proofs, as are Uncirculated examples. This one should be worth \$2000 or more.
- 300 1887 and 1896 (2 pcs.). All three AU-50. Attractive lot. (Total: 3 pieces)
- 301 1889 Select Proof-63, mostly brilliant but with mottled greenish gray tones, the mottling accounting for our conservative grade.



- 302 **1892 Choice Brilliant Proof-65.** A beautiful lightly golden toned specimen that is exceptionally well struck. One of only 2,745 proofs issued. Should bring a bid near the \$800 level or more.
- 303 1892 Choice Brilliant Proof-65, faint attractive pastel toning.
- 304 1893 MS-63, gray Select Uncirculated, brilliant reverse.
- 305 1894 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, light gray, scarce and seldom comes better.
- 306 1894 MS-63, Very close to MS-65, Select Uncirculated. Light toning.
- 307 1895 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, gray, spot on rim below 5 in date.
- 308 1895 MS-60, Brilliant Uncirculated, spotted obverse.
- 309 1897 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, gray and gold toning.
- 310 1897 MS-63, gray Uncirculated, similar, perhaps just a bit nicer. The same type that other cataloguers blindly called "Brilliant Uncirculated." We think the term "brilliant" is very overused, particularly on nickel and copper coins. Most original (i.e. not cleaned) early nickels are a light frosty gray in color, attractive, though hardly deserving of the term brilliant.
- 311 1898 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, golden gray.
- 312 1898 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, similar, but with light obverse spotting.
- 313 1908 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, brilliant golden, light carbon at rims.
- 314 1908 MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated, light obverse spots.
- 315 1909 MS-65, Choice Brilliant Uncirculated, few tiny abrasions in fields, but really just about flawless.
- 316 1909 MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated, rim defect at Of, otherwise as nice as last.

- 317 1910 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, choice, but too softly struck to make MS-65 rating by our standards. Deep red and olive toning.
- 318 1910 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, lightly toned, nicely lustrous, but softly struck.
- 319 1911 Choice Proof-65, brilliant golden obverse, deeply mottled reverse toning, and just a bit dull.
- 320 1911 MS-60, lightly toned Uncirculated.
- 321 1912 Select Proof-63, heavy iridescent tarnish, attractive in its own way.
- 322 1912 MS-60, Uncirculated, light golden toning, few tiny spots.
- 323 1912-D MS-63, Select Uncirculated. Lovely rose-gold toning and sharply struck. One of the key dates in the series.



324 **1912-S MS-63**, **Select Uncirculated**, reddish gold and gray toning, slightly weak on obverse, but considerably more detail in the hair than we have seen on some of this date. Only 238,000 pieces struck, about 100 times as rare as 1912-P. A fairly large quantity of these wre saved at the time of issue, as date and mintmark collecting had just begun to be popular and this was the first nickel from the San Francisco Mint. Evidently there was quite a bit of speculation in Uncirculated 1912-D and 1912-S nickels around the time of issue, judging from the various contemporary ads we have seen during this period.

Note: EF and AU 1912-S nickels appear to be actually scarcer than Uncirculateds, probably partly because of the hoarding mentioned above, and also because the majority of 1912-S nickels are poorly struck, so much so that once the lustre has been worn off, the coin looks no better than VG-Fine!

- 325 **1912-S MS-60**, **Uncirculated**, similar, a little duller than last, same striking characteristics.
- 326 1913 Buffalo, Type I. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, nicely iridescent.
- 327 1913 Buffalo, Type I. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, also nicely iridescent. Prices on this type coin were run up to \$300 or more during the 1979-80 coin boom, and huge quantities flooded the market at those inflated prices. The present level of about \$150 is much more reasonable, and we can finally recommend this coin after calling it overvalued for the past several years.
- 328 1913-D Type I. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, rich gold toning, an extra sharp strike.
- 329 1913-D Type I. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, gray, not too well struck on obverse.
- 330 1913-S Type I. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated. The most difficult of the type.
- 331 1913-S Type I. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, golden-gray.
- 332 **1913-S Type II. MS-60, Uncirculated**, semi-prooflike gold toning but somewhat softly struck up and lightly spotted. Still a nice example of this scarce issue, which is quite difficult to find even in VF; the usual weak strikes being the culprit.

333 **1914 Choice Matte Proof-65**, brilliant to lightly iridescent, few faint scattered spots. Rare, only 1,275 pieces struck, many spent. Prices on matte Proofs have always been depressed by floods of sharply struck business strikes offered as Proofs; the real thing is very rare.

334 **1914 Choice Matte Proof-65**, lightly iridescent, really attractive and will attract attention. Borders not quite as broad as on many we have seen but definitely a Proof.



335 **1914-D MS-65**, **Choice gray Uncirculated**, beautifully lustrous and just about a full strike. Our glass reveals some tiny flyspecks but this is a solid gem overall with definite eye-appeal.



- 336 **1914-D MS-63**, **Select Uncirculated**, deep golden-gray, few spots, strike not as strong as last and the lustre is a little more subdued. Still above average for the Uncirculated population of this date.
- 337 **1914-S MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, golden gray, lightly oxidized on obverse, a semi-prooflike effect on reverse with device weakly brought up, as usual.
- 338 1914-S MS-60, Uncirculated, deep iridescent gray with moderate obverse spotting and a weak hair braid, reverse prooflike in fields and attractive with an above average strike.
- 339 1915 MS-65, Choice gray Uncirculated, extra sharp strike, has some of the characteristics of a matte Proof but not all .
- 340 1915 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated with sunset toning, partial wire rim on reverse.
- 341 1915 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, attractive like the last, but the obverse is lightly spotted.



- 342 **1915-S MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, nicely iridescent, boldly struck and nearly a gem, but there is a nick nearly camouflaged in detail of hair above braid.
- 343 **1915-S MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated**, not as well struck as the preceding, weak at braid and hair detail above it.

- 344 **1916 Choice Matte Proof-65**, brilliant to lightly iridescent, attractive. Rims not as broad as on many, but the mirror edges and overwhelmingly sharp strike leave no doubt about the attribution. Very rare, only 600 pieces struck in proof, and not all saved. Worth \$2000 or more.
- 345 Pair of 1916 nickels. Both MS-63, Select Uncirculated overall, one lightly spotted, the other an iridescent beauty but weakly struck. (Total: 2 pieces)
- 346 1916-S MS-60, Uncirculated, very weakly struck, gray toning. Another issue surprisingly hard to find in even full EF simply because most were so poorly struck that once the lustre was gone, the piece would immediately grade VG.
- 347 1917 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, nicely iridescent, obverse perfect, reverse with some spots on buffalo only visible under magnification. Buffalo nickel collectors would do well to bid on these coins, despite the occasional mention of light spots or other factors in our detailed descriptions. These are all completely original nickels, most stored carefully since the year of issue. Many will be dipped or cleaned by dealers and resold to collectors as "MS-65" or "Gem BU" with no further description, at much higher prices than you can buy the coins for here.
- 348 1917 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, light gray and sunset tones, a mediocre strike for this date, which often comes sharp.
- 349 1917 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, lightly iridescent and sharply struck.



- 350 **1917-S MS-65, Choice Uncirculated**, bluish olive and golden tones over semi-prooflike surfaces, well struck except at the rims which are abnormally rounded. Scarce this nice, and much preferred over the dipped "brilliant" ones seen at coin shows.
- 351 1918 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, sunset toning, and a super strong strike.
- 352 1918 and 1918-S. First MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated; second MS-60, BU, but very poorly struck from badly corroded dies. This is really the way it looked when struck; one of the most poorly produced coins ever to leave a U.S. Mint, and another that would wear directly from BU to VG with nothing in between. Interesting for educational purposes! (Total: 2 pieces)

353 1919 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, lightly iridescent.



- 354 **1919-D MS-65**, **Choice Uncirculated**, brilliant golden, and an excellent sharp strike. Really scarce this nice, will be an asset to any collection.
- 355 1919-D MS-60, Uncirculated, like the last, but there is a planchet pit at center of reverse on shoulder of buffalo. Lower feather tip is doubled on both of these, a feature quite common on 1919-D nickels.



- 356 1919-5 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, attractive original sunset toning. A bold strike. A very scarce issue and rarely offered in original choice condition.
- 357 1920 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, brilliant to lightly iridescent, traces of carbon.
- 358 1920 MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated, not well struck on hair braid.



- 359 **1920-D MS-63, Select Uncirculated** with gorgeous olive lustre, bold except at left obverse and reverse rims and head of buffalo. A trace of carbon in front of legs, but overall singularly attractive and beats most "MS-65" examples offered in overall eye-appeal.
- 360 1921 MS-65, Choice Brilliant Uncirculated, weakly defined at the rims.
- 361 Pair of 1921 nickels. Both MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated. Light scratches on both.(Total: 2 pieces)



- 362 **1923-S MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, brilliant bluish golden and a gem except there is a tarnish line across buffalo, probably from the glue on the seam of an old cellophane coin envelope. About as well struck as this difficult date and mint comes and very scarce so fine. Another that should bring a very firm price from the knowing date collector.
- 363 1924 MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, bluish gold tones.
- 364 1924 Pair. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, gray. (Total: 2 pieces)



365 **1924-D MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, pale lavender and gray-gold toning, obverse is spotted. Not too well struck up near the rims but at least average for this date.



366 **1924-S MS-65, Choice Uncirculated**, brilliant golden and a strong strike. Very scarce, really difficult to locate this nice, usually comes dull.



- 367 **1924-S MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, similar to last, also attractive but carbon tarnish around some letters in LIBERTY.
- 368 1928 Lot. MS-63, Select Brilliant Uncirculated, weak to mediocre strikes. (Total: 3 pieces)
- 369 1928-D MS-63, Select Uncirculated, golden, well struck, light scattered carbon.
- 370 1928-S MS-60, Brilliant Uncirculated, the usual very weak strike, but more or less the same as it was when it left the dies.

391 **1796**/5 V-2, Hilt 12-I (R-6). **Strictly Good-4**, possibly could be called VG or better, taking into account the weakness in strike seen on a few of the high grade examples of this rarity. Deep iridescent toning with a few nicks and scratches, none requiring description except a cut at the third star. A most interesting variety, as the die was cut in October, 1795 and shows that a 1795 draped bust with small eagle reverse half dime type was planned for, however coinage did not resume until March 1796, and the die was overdated to read 1796. A former high R-7 variety, we estimate the population of this variety at about 20 pieces.



- 392 **1797 15 stars obverse.** V-2, Hilt 14-J. **Fine-12 or better**, many details fully VF, others weaker, especially top of obverse, as always. Nice red and gold obverse and steel gray reverse and defect-free. This obverse die also probably made in late 1795 and dated 179 with the last digit left blank and added later. A high R-3, called R-4 in Hilt.
- 393 **1801 V-1.** Good-4, nice deep olive and bluish gray toning, but somewhat marred by four crisscross pin scratches on obverse and slightly bent as often on these early half dimes. Rare in any condition.



- 394 1803 V-1. Fine-12 or better, details in hair near VF, weaker at the rims. Dark gray obverse, lighter golden-gray reverse, couple of faint scratches and marks but these are not disturbing or serious in any way. Another interesting obverse die with the 8 figure made up from two vertically overlapping zeros, and the 3 smaller and sharper than the other figures, suggesting it was added later. Since the 1801 has a perfectly formed 8, it is likely that this obverse was made in 1800 at the same time as the 1800 V-1 obverse, also with the same makeshift 8. Originally this obverse could have been dated 180 with the last digit blank and the 3 added just before use.
- 395 1829 Obverse of V-2, reverse of V-6, called B-13 in the revised notes in the Valentine reprint. EF-40, deeply iridescent obverse; medium gray reverse. Rare.
- 396 1830 V-3. EF-40 with light greenish gray obverse and dark violet reverse.
- 397 Group of early half dimes: 1831 VF-20, 1835 large date, small 5C VF-20, 1835 large date, large 5C (2 pcs.) VG-8 and VF-20, 1836 VG-8, 1837 bust with large 5C in VG-8, 1844-O also VG-8. All with medium to dark original toning. (Total: 7 pieces)
- 398 1832 V-3. EF-40, light gray obverse, deep greenish purple reverse, struck from worn dies, no berries. Rare.
- 399 1834 V-5, with 3 in date over backwards 3 and lump in bottom loop of 8. MS-60, iridescent Uncirculated, reverse is attractive but obverse is tarnished. Dish-shaped as usual on V-5 (the dies overly bevelled).
- 400 1837 Seated type, no stars. Choice EF-45, nice iridescent toning, but initials "HD" lightly pinscratched in right obverse field.
- 401 1848 Large date, Good-4; and a pair of 1872-S pieces: VG-8, mintmark within wreath and EF-40, mintmark below wreath. (Total: 3 pieces)
- 402 1853 Arrows. Choice AU-55, lustrous silvery gray with moderate tarnish, clashed dies as usual.

403 1860 "Transitional". Obverse type of 1859 (from the 1859 hub) with stars; reverse type of 1860-73 with broad flat wreath. The inscription UNITED STATES OF AMERICA does not appear on the coin. Strictly a piece de caprice made by Col. Snowden for sale to collectors, and listed as Judd-267, but included here as it is widely collected as a regular half dime due to its listing in the popular coin catalogues. Choice Uncirculated, MS-65, deep attractive greenish gold fields deepening to antique gold and purple at rims, reverse a more even bluish steel. Much evidence of mint frost in the fields and imperfectly struck with head and upper left arm weak as well as bow of wreath on reverse. Obviously given a single blow from the press on a regular (not polished) blank, i.e. a "business strike" not a Proof, as all evidently are. Small heavy date, die line slants up from left base of rock. Reportedly 100 pieces were struck, this figure from Snowden's notebook, but the actual figure may be closer to 200 pieces. Extra popular as an 1860 half dime with stars and also as a "coin without a country."

409 **1875-CC** Mintmark within wreath. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, highly attractive greenish silvery tones over frosty surfaces, but not fully struck up on the upper half of the obverse.



- 410 **1875-S** Mintmark within wreath. **MS-65**, **Choice Uncirculated**, silvery gold obverse, olive and gray reverse, excellent lustre and surfaces, but not well struck up near the rims. An excellent match for the last, and the two would make an impressive pair indeed; they have probably been together in this collection since the time of issue.
- 411 1917 Mercury. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated group of four pieces. All toned, couple tarnished on one side, one with full split bands. (Total: 4 pieces)
- 412 1917 and 1923. Two pieces of each. All more or less MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, heavily toned, some with tarnish. Both 1923s have full split bands. (Total: 4 pieces)
- 413 1923 and 1925. Both MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, full split bands on first only. The 1923 is deeply iridescent, the 1925 is silvery gray with light tarnish spots. (Total: 2 pieces)

- 440 1811/10 O-101, fairly early die state with part of curve of 0 visible to right of last 1. Also called the 18.11 punctuated date variety. EF-40, greenish steel, tarnish spot on the cheek.
- 441 Three early varieties: 1811 O-105, Good-4; 1824/various dates, O-103, Choice VF-30; 1820/19, O-101, VF-20, all with deep attractive toning. (Total: 3 pieces)
- 442 1814 O-102. Sharp EF-40, medium gray with deep iridescence on portions of the reverse. A variety that is ridiculously underrated in Overton; listed as only R-1 but really one of the two or three rarest of the date.
- 443 Group of early halves: 1819/8 small 9, 1830 large 0, 1832 normal letters, 1834 small date, 1834 large date, 1836 lettered edge. All VF-20 except the 1834 large date at only VG-8. Light to medium gray and iridescent toning on all. (Total: 6 pieces)



- 444 **1836 Reeded edge, Gobrecht design.** VF-20, deep bluish gold toning, but signs of an early polishing. Few surface digs on either side, not too serious, and some light graffiti in upper reverse field, obverse rim nick at 3 o'clock. Overall can be rated a strong Fine.
- 445 1842 Small date. Choice EF-45, deep green and purple obverse, brilliant silvery reverse. With the familiar rim break over TAT. Scarce, only the single obverse and reverse die for the small date type.
- 446 1866-S No motto. VG-8, warm gray toning, clean for the grade. Weak at rims, edge reeding very weak, as always (one in the Neil Sale was catalogued as having a plain edge). Very scarce and the only 1866 regular issue half dollar lacking the motto.



447 **1892 Choice Proof-65**, but very deep mottled iridescent red toning on obverse that might be considered as unattractive by some; brilliant golden reverse. A coin which should be examined prior to bidding.



448 **1928-S MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, deep bluish gray with light obverse tarnish, well struck for date.



449 **1929-D MS-65, Choice Uncirculated**, attractive iridescent gray and violet toning, well struck, scarce in choice original condition.

533 **1863 Cent. J-299.** Bronze, no L. Same as above, but on a thin flan, weight 49.8 grains. Reverse die is rotated 180 degrees. **Lovely deep gold and olive Proof**, choice except the obverse wire rim at left appears to have been filed down, probably at the mint.



534 1863 2C. J-312. Presumably bronze, though struck on a very thin planchet (weight only 76.1 grains; normal is 96 grains for bronze). Possibly a restrike, if so, unlisted at anything near this weight. Proof, greenish red overtones, few minor flyspecks and undoubtedly cleaned decades ago.



535 **1869 10C. J-696.** Standard silver. Weight 30.9 grains. Proof, deep greenish gray obverse, light gray reverse.

Extraordinary Collection of Late Date Large Cents

Complete Die Variety Set of 1816 Cents

1816 marks the first year of the Coronet or "Matron head" style. This design was by Robert Scot, Mint engraver since 1794. From an artistic point of view Scot's portrait of Ms. Liberty is surely one of the poorest ever to appear on a U.S. coin, rivalling Scot's 1821 quarter-eagle in overall ugliness. The design on the cents was considerably sharpened up and improved by William Kneass in the 1830s, and later revised considerably by Gobrecht in the 1840s, but in essence remained unchanged in concept until the termination of the large cent in 1857. The reverse design on the 1816 cent remains unchanged from Reich's Classic Head cents of 1808-1814. The year 1816 is distinguished by the fact that the copper cent was the only denomination produced, thus if one were to try to obtain an example of one coin of each date 1793-1983, the cent would be needed to show the year 1816. A mint fire in January, 1816 was responsible for the lack of silver and gold coins, as it destroyed the planchet preparation equipment. Half cents had been discontinued in 1811 due to lack of demand and lack of planchets. The cents were able to be coined because ready to use planchets were imported from Boulton and Watt of Birmingham, England. A total of 2,820,982 cents were struck in 1816, the largest coinage since 1803. All are bluntly impressed on the obverse, especially at the forelock and coronet; evidently the dies were hubbed too

deeply for metal to flow fully into the recesses under normal striking pressure. The other feature peculiar to 1816 is the use of a defective 6 punch in the date on all six obverse dies; the punch results in a lump appearing on the top loop of the figure. The present selection of 1816 cents is complete in all nine known die varieties.



536 **1816 N-1 (R-5).** Wide date, divided 18 16 with 81 faintly repunched; both I's in legend dotted by denticles. **Choice VF-30**, medium brown obverse, bluish golden tones on reverse, tiny chip in planchet to right of F in OF. Lightly broken obverse rim at top right. Rarest of the 1816 varieties and one of the nicer examples around; the Anderson-Dupont coin was only Fine!



537 1816 N-2 (R-1). Randall hoard variety. Same obverse as last with the rim crumbling at right heavier; new reverse with N in ONE repunched (this reverse was carried over to 1817). MS-60, greenish gold and steel toned Uncirculated, a little on the dull side, as is usual for 1816 cents, otherwise choice, and actually considerably more attractive than the spotted red ones often met with. Reverse die rotated 30 degrees to right. Typical blunt strike at forelock. By far the most common 1816 cent in Uncirculated condition due to the Randall hoard, but even so, 1816 cents from this source are many times scarcer than those dated 1818 or 1820.



538 1816 N-3 (R-5). Same obverse as above, slightly earlier state of the rim crumbling at right, proving that N-3 came before N-2; double denticle over E in UNITED. Choice VF-30, smooth light brown with hints of bluish gray and easily a commercial "EF." Reverse slightly off-center towards 3 o'clock. As always' the reverse die was evidently misaligned on all the cents of this marriage. Only slightly less rare than N-1, and often claimed to be equally rare. The present piece is within the top dozen with only five Uncirculateds being reported, plus an AU-55 that appeared in the Anderson-Dupont sale, Lot 527.



539 1816 N-4 (R-3). Wide date, open mouth: leaf tip left of F in OF. MS-60, Uncirculated, lustrous golden brown. Struck from worn and lapped dies, weak at rims with denticles mostly faint or missing and letters in legend partly drawn toward the rim. One of possibly 50-75 pieces of this variety known to exist in Uncirculated and therefore scarce, though the rarity of this variety has been ridiculously exaggerated in the past with comments like "three known in Uncirculated" reaching print on a number of occasions. The present piece is from former Philadelphia dealer David Bullowa's Collection.

540 1816 N-5 (R-3). Top border of coronet doubled; leaf under upright of D. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, mint red and greenish steel, beautifully lustrous and lovely despite a few faint scratches through ONE CENT at the center of the reverse. Beautiful bold impression except at two highest clusters of leaves. An exquisite cent with a pedigree to match: Stickney (1907); New Netherlands 59th sale, Lot 1246.

Note: One of the top two or three pieces of this variety, equal to Helfenstein, Lot 54, which realized an ultra-high \$200 way back in 1964. Interestingly enough, the consignor of the present piece also owned the Helfenstein coin, but sold it as Lot 884 of our Fairfield Sale in 1977; obviously the present piece is considered the finer of the two by the consignor.



541 **1816 N-6 (R-2).** Small center dots on either side (these result from the use of a compass which is employed by the engraver to layout the die); three fused denticles under left ribbon end. **MS-63**, **Select Uncirculated**, bluish chocolate and mint red, a beauty. Couple of faint stains on obverse, really noticeable only with a glass. Heavily rusted obverse die, especially in fields and about the star points. Faint but unmistakable traces of what appears to be edge reeding (most noticeable opposite 10 o'clock of obverse rim); this is extraordinary in view of the fact that these cents were struck without a collar and the planchets were sent over ready to use from Boulton and Watt. However this effect does occur on many of the coins of this die variety; does anyone have an explanation? The present piece is from Richard Picker and is doubtless in the Condition Census.

542 1816 N-6. EF-40, golden steel, few field nicks on either side, otherwise highly attractive. Early die state: lacks the obverse field rust seen on the preceding and the denticles are well-defined. Same partial reeding on edge as last, and in the same position (the probability of this happening by chance is quite remote).

Extraordinary Choice 1816, N-7

543 1816 N-7 (R-1). Tip of 1 under bust tip; ON(E) recut. Perfect dies. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, lustrous light brown with prooflike blue and rose overtones; a real beauty. Stars at top weak, otherwise a splendid bold impression. Another Condition Census cent and not impossibly the finest known. There are three or four others that could conceivably gives this some competition, but choosing among them would mostly involve slight differences in color and surface finish. Will be bid up well into four figures.

Note: The question of what constitutes the most desirable color on a large cent has been argued and discussed since the beginning of cent collecting. As long ago as 1924, collector B. H. Collins stated his criteria for a perfect cent: "A smooth lustrous round planchet. An early impression from a deeply-cut die, not cracked or worn. A 'Dempsey' strike-bold, strong, and centered, and milling geometrically even. The design, lettering, etc., both obverse and reverse (surely the former), forceful and sharp. Stars up, with center lines. Any fixed color, light olive preferred, though black or dark very acceptable. Red secondary, which, though beautiful, will not 'stay put'.... "the worship accorded red cents is properly on the decline and in a few decades will not exist, except in isolated cases, where a brilliant red cent of early date is like King Tut resurrected from its tomb Such pieces are rare and even these change in color-to what? I have perfect cents that were red 30 years ago, but have changed to various colors, beautiful light olive to lustrous steel or black. Shall I discard them on account of changing to dark color and seek red, to duplicate my experience?" Collins goes on to point out the disadvantages of mint red cents: "So, if you require early red cents, bury them securely against atmospheric influences, don't look at or handle them; assert you have them, but don't produce for comparison, etc. What pleasure is that? I am, perforce, willing to dispense with red cents and content myself with any fixed color perfect cents". The worship of mint red cents, to use Mr. Collins' phrase has not died out, though it is most prevelant in type collectors rather than among specialists. For example in our 1981 ANA Sale a gem mint red 1850 cent brought a fantastic \$7000, a price that would easily purchase ten or more brown or light olive ones. On the other hand there are instances of light bluish olive cents selling for many multiples of stained or spotty red specimens. We suspect the subject will still be a topic of discussion as long as there are people collecting large cents.



544 **1816 N-8** (R-1). Date spaced 1 8 16, long denticles below 8; "comma" die chip left of center dot. **MS-60, Uncirculated**, medium brown with tinges of faded red in the protected areas. Intermediate die state with the reverse crack and the two rim breaks at right obverse, as well as pronounced flow lines between the stars. One of 7 or 8 Uncirculated examples of the variety; ex Garrett Collection via Stack's March, 1976 sale, Lot 44.

- 545 1816 N-8. Choice EF-45, glossy chestnut brown, attractive. Similar die state to last.
- 546 1816 N-8. EF-40, beautifully glossy mahogany and sea-green. Early die state: obverse perfect; reverse with only faint evidence of the crack at the tops of ITED. Better than many actually offered as "Uncirculated".
- 547 1816 N-8. EF-40, dark charcoal, glossy. Clashed and worn dies with the two obverse rim breaks at right and the usual reverse crack. Graded "VF-35" by the consignor, but sold at a major auction in 1972 as "AU"; the worn state of the dies makes the coin difficult to grade.
- 548 1816 N-8. EF-40, sea-green to golden brown with considerable underlying lustre. Small rough area in planchet at STA. The latest die state with the additional obverse rim break at 9 o'clock.
- 549 1816 N-8. EF-40 in sharpness, but obverse is completely porous; reverse smooth but lightly scratched up inside wreath. Fairly early die state with only the single obverse rim break at 3:30.



- 550 1816 N-9 (R-4). Very wide date; double denticle over E in UNITED, unusual STATESOF (one word) spacing. MS-60, Uncirculated, pale red to pinkish gray, underlying lustre, but struck from extremely worn dies, causing loss of detail from area around obverse rim and stars, uneven fields, and pronounced flow lines from radial expansion of blank during striking. Reverse die also worn, but not as badly as the obverse. Ex Anderson-Dupont sale, Lot 533 with the comment: "rare coin, third rarest of the date and seldom seen above Very Fine". No more than three or four pieces exist in Uncirculated.
- 551 1816 N-9. Choice EF-45, strong claims to AU, bluish steel, really attractive. Earlier die state than last with nearly full obverse dentilation. Close to Condition Census level and an opportunity for the specialist; ex Stearns sale.
- 552 1816 "N-9½". Earliest die state; shows traces of a mispunched 8 well to left of the corrected figure (this feature soon fades). Faint double profile, most noticeable at chin and throat. EF-40, medium golden brown, sharp and attractive. Reportedly R-8 with the double profile.

Outstanding Set of 1817 Cents

The following group of 1817 cents is one of the finest ever auctioned, containing at least one specimen of each Newcomb variety except two: N-16, N-17. Only two denominations were produced in 1817, the cent and the half dollar. The cent production took up where 1816 left off, using the fine Boulton planchets imported from Birmingham. Coinage amounted to 3,948,400 pieces, the largest in history up to that time. It later turned out that cent production between 1816 and 1820 was excessive and could not be absorbed; delivery to banks lagged far behind the coinages and cents clogged the delivery channels. This problem became quite serious in 1820-21 and resulted in only a small coinage of cents in 1821 and none at all during 1823 (the 1823 dated cents were struck in 1824 or later). The other denomination coined in 1817, the half dollar, was started up again, as the rolling and planchet-making equipment destroyed in the 1816 mint fire was replaced. Starting in June, 1817, the Bank of the United States began importing bullion and delivering it to the mint for coinage. This was an effort to encourage the eventual resumption of specie payments which had been suspended by the banks due to the War of 1812 and resulting financial panic of 1814. Silver coinage did not really gear up fully until 1818, however, leaving the mint relatively free to concentrate on copper cents. Both the cents and half dollars use the same set of number punches, and many of the die characteristics are similar, implying the same engraver worked on both.



553 **1817 N-1 (R-4).** Close date with pointed 1s; double denticle under left ribbon. **EF-40**, dark steel, considerable underlying lustre, spot at third star. Strike a trifle off-center, as usual. Pair of obverse diecracks from tip of coronet and tip of bust; small rim break at A of AMERICA, as also seen on the late strikes of N-16 which use the same reverse die. This die state not in Newcomb and rare. Twenty years ago the present specimen would have been far up in the Condition Census; even today it ranks far, far above average for a variety that normally comes wellworn.



- 554 **1817 N-2 (R-4).** Obverse as last; N in ONE leans far to left, this reverse carried over from 1816 N-2. **MS-60, Uncirculated,** lustrous glossy chocolate brown with an obverse rim dent at 10 o'clock. Shattered reverse die with the diagonal bisecting crack described in Newcomb. Ex Helfenstein, Lot 56 and one of just 7 or 8 Uncirculated survivors.
- 555 1817 N-2. EF-40, dark glossy steel, many tiny surface pits, none serious. Early state of the dies without the bisecting reverse crack on the previous coin. Far above average.

556 **1817 N-3**. Pincer 8; irregular N in CENT. **MS-65**, **Choice Uncirculated**, iridescent light greenish olive with full underlying mint lustre; a splendid beauty. Denticles weak on both sides; faint beginnings of the "mouse" break at top of head. Ex Hines, Sheldon, Helfenstein, Lot 57, where called second finest known, and where this realized an impressive \$125 back in 1964.

Note: The 8 figure in the date has the bottom loop broken open; hence the name "pincer 8". The same defective punch was used on an 1818 half dollar die (O-108) but here the broken loop is the top one, indicating the figure was punched upside down. Since this broken punch occurs only on these two dies, and in particular on no 1817 half dollar die, this might imply that the N-3 cent was actually struck in 1818.



557 1817 N-4 (R-4). Crack through base of date; A too high in STATES. Choice EF-45, reddish brown to deep chocolate, interestingly mottled, faint traces of mint red in some of the letters on the reverse. Early state of the reverse die with the crack at TATE very faint. Very scarce, seldom seen better than Fine, only four or five Uncirculated pieces exist and this is within the top dozen. None in Helfenstein and the Anderson-Dupont example was a half-grade or more below this one.



558 1817 N-5(R-4). Close date, no crack; A high in STATES, same reverse as above. MS-60, Uncirculated, mint red fading to pale reddish olive and light walnut brown, stain at left ribbon end. Earliest die state, full dentilation, crack through tops of TATES very faint. Ex Hines, Sheldon, Helfenstein (Lot 58; the Helfenstein cents were sold in a 1964 Lester Merkin auction which created a sensation at the time and resulted in record prices which were not exceeded for many years thereafter). This piece was called the second finest known in the Helfenstein offering. About a dozen Uncirculateds exist of the variety with only one of them really much choicer than this.



559 1817 N-6 (R-1). Close date, spaced 1.817; leaf extends far beyond stand of F. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, beautifully lustrous golden brown. Bold, even strike as usual and one of the more attractive varieties of both the year and the entire type for this reason. Ex Elder, Holmes, Helfenstein, Lot 59.



560 **1817 N-6. MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, glittering bluish steel and mint red, few faint pinscratches from MS-65 level, none of these disturbing the lovely colors or are particularly serious. Another highly attractive 1817 cent.





561 1817 N-7½ (R-3 as a variety). Obverse of last with the "mouse" break atop head; double denticle at left stand of N in UNITED. Choice AU-55, beautifully lustrous golden-olive, enhanced by judicious brushing, faintest friction on a few obverse high points, probably never really in circulation. Faint obverse cracks from tip of nose and bust truncation; clash marks show at central reverse. Scarcest of the "mouse tops" and very popular. About six MS-60s survive plus an equal number of AUs, placing the present piece in the top dozen. Ex Geiss Collection (Mehl, 1947); Lot 130.

Note: One of the mysteries of the 1817 cents is the "mouse-top" obverses. Evidently the rim of depression produced by the Liberty head on the die crumbled during use, producing a break on the top of the head that large cent fanciers have likened to the profile of a mouse. The fact that this same kind of failure occurs on four different obverse dies of this year (N-3, N-7, N-8, N-9) in the same location, yet is absent on all of the 1816 dies and on those of later years is quite puzzling. The explanation will never be known, but evidently there was some slight change in how the obverses were hubbed and this was later corrected when the "mice" began appearing. John D. Wright, in his Penny Wise series notes that "a collection of the four mice has been one of the goals of many cent collectors over the past hundred years or so".



562 1817 N-8 (R-1). Stray hair over back of ear, mouse break on head; reverse of N-7. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, mint red fading to light golden brown, nicely lustrous and really MS-65 except that there are two small shallow surface chips on obverse which are barely noticeable and were on the planchet before it was struck. Late strike from worn and lapped dies, small "mouse" break at top of head, denticles weak, stars drawn to edge as are all letters in reverse legend. Obtained from the Irving M. Moskovitz sale (Kreisberg and Cohen), Lot 1282. Another opportunity for the "mouse" collector!



563 1817 N-9 (R-2). Wide divided date, 18 17; E low in ONE, T low in CENT. MS-60, Uncirculated, red and brown obverse, attractively mottled bluish olive and tan reverse. Slight friction on nostril and forelock. Early die state with full dentilation on both sides and without the pronounced radial flow lines seen on the later strikes. No sign of the familiar "mouse" break atop the head. An old familiar cent: ex Dr. French, Mehl sale of 9/30/48, Lot 389.



564 **1817 N-9. MS-60, Uncirculated**, lustrous golden tan with traces of seagreen in center of reverse, spot on reverse rim near left ribbon end. Late die state with denticles mostly gone and stars joined to rim. Mouse break with "tail" at top of head; this break looking more like the mischievous little rodent for which it is named than any of the other three dies. From our MacFarland sale, Lot 109 at \$650; earlier from the 1976 ANA sale, Lot 260.



565 1817 N-10 (R-1). Wide, evenly spaced date with flanking stars unusually close; NIT aligned in "stair-step" fashion. MS-60, Uncirculated, dull steel and greenish olive obverse; golden olive reverse with underlying mint lustre apparent. Late rim break at second star; traces of doubling on wreath opposite T of CENT. Ex Chris Petersen, Jon Hanson collections.



- 566 1817 N-11 (R-1). Wide date, spaced 1 817; high leaf under center of S. MS-60, Uncirculated, rich glossy chocolate brown. Dies somewhat worn with denticles fading and light clashing in central reverse. Second or third finest, based on evenness of color and quality of lustre. From the Eugene H. Gardener Collection, Feb., 1965, Lot 1153.
- 567 1817 N-12 (R-4). 17 in date fused together by a diecrack; narrow denticle below left ribbon. Fine-12 or better, attractive for grade. Scarce, usually seen Good or VG.



568 1817 N-13. Randall hoard variety. Close date, doubled denticle left of date; C in CENT tipped sharply right, die scratch connects IC in AMERICA. MS-60, Uncirculated, olive-brown with bluish pink overtones on obverse, nicely mottled on both sides. Small spot at second star. Ex Dr. French (described therein by Mehl as a "semi-proof", a term popular among the old-timers but having no real meaning), T. James Clarke, Helfenstein, Lot 61. Common due to the Randall hoard but more attractive than most from this source.

Note: Shortly after the Civil War several mint kegs of cents were found hidden under an old railway platform in Georgia. The kegs contained cents dated 1816, 1817, 1818, 1819, 1820 and all were bright mint red and in perfect new condition. It has been estimated that a full keg held between 11,000 and 15,000 cents and that probably seven kegs were found, one each of 1816, 1817, 1819, and two each of 1818 and 1820, bringing the total in the hoard to over 75,000 pieces! The kegs had obviously been obtained from the Mint at the same time and illustrates the backlog of 1816-1820 cents alluded to earlier.

The cents were shipped to a New York merchant, reportedly in payment of a debt. This merchant sold them to William P. Chapman & Co., a dry goods store in Norwich, Connecticut for 90 cents per hundred or less than face value. The Chapman firm tried to give them out in change as a promotion, but the scheme backfired when many of the customers rejected the coins as being counterfeits; this was understandable in light of the fact that large cents must have been something of a novelty in the 1870s, and when seen were always well-worn, dark and corroded; bright new ones were bound to arouse suspicion. Chapman sold the remainder of the cents to J. S. Randall, a coin collector from Norwich. For many years even knowledgeable collectors of the day branded the coins as restrikes, but this can be proven beyond doubt not to be true. The Randall hoard, one of the largest hoards of U.S. coins in history is of course the reason why 1816-1820 cents of certain varieties are very common today in Uncirculated, while other varieties of the same years are scarce to rare, as are all cents dated between 1821-1835 or so.

568a **1817 N-13. MS-60, Uncirculated**, mostly red, starting to tone down to light brown in the fields. Late state of the dies with obverse denticles gone and die scratch at IC worn (or lapped) away. From our MacFarland sale Lot 110 at a very high \$950; earlier from our Garrett I sale, Lot 132 at \$800.

One of Two Finest Known N-15 Cents

569 **1817 N-15 (R-4).** 1 in date far to left of truncation; leaf centered under upright of F. **MS-60**, **Uncirculated**, lovely bluish olive and faded mint red with full underlying lustre, a beauty. Finer than the Helfenstein piece or any other offered in recent years; one of only two or three Uncirculated pieces in existence. Should be bid up toward four figures, another remarkable opportunity for the specialist.



570 **1818 N-5 (R-3).** Divided date 1 81 8; feet of NITED progressively lower. **Choice AU-55**, greenish olive with underlying lustre. Late state with both of the obverse cracks and most of the dentilation faded. Fifth finest known.



571 **1818** "N-61/3" (R-7 with the double profile). Close heavy date; heavy crack below STATES OF. Double profile under nose, bust, back of hair, outline of ear. **MS-60, Uncirculated**, light chocolate with seagreen overtones, spot on cheek, few smaller ones on reverse. Well struck, as usual for the variety. Ex 1968 NASC auction (Numismatic Enterprises), Lot 104.



572 1822 N-1 (R-4). Closest date of year; A's in legend with flat tops, unlike the pointed top A's seen on any other reverse before 1824. MS-60, Uncirculated, deep, rich brown, beautifully mottled, faint hints of cabinet friction on a few high points. Microscopic traces of doubling on nose, chin, earlobe, etc., called "N-1½" by the consignor. Ex Frank Hussey ("Old North Carolina"), New Netherlands 54th sale, Lot 1532; C. Douglass Smith, Helfenstein, Lot 87 (as MS-65), Frank Masters, Lot 215.

Note: Choice 1822 cents are many times scarcer than those dated 1816-1820 as none turned up in the huge Randall hoard. The actual mintage of 1822 cents is unknown. Mint records only state that 2,072,339 cents were delivered during the year 1822. However it is nearly certain that many of these were actually dated 1820. We have pointed out how the coinage of 1816-1820 was excessive. This caused cent coinage of later years to be curtailed or simply postponed. For example in April, 1820, there were still 496,000 cents dated 1819 and earlier in the vaults that had not been distributed. The August 1820 coinage was not exhausted until July 1822, when there was still on hand 1,457,600 pieces of the December 1820 shipment; it took until December 1823 for all of these to be delivered. The year 1822 was also remarkable in that the silver coinage fell far below expectations, evidently due to a shortage of bullion. Only the half dollar was coined in quantity. The 1822 dime was coined only to the extent of less than 50,000 pieces, with no less than three obverse dies leftover and overdated in 1823 and 1824. The 1822 quarter had only a slightly larger mintage and again three obverse dies were leftover to be used in 1823 and 1824.

- 573 1822 N-5 (R-2). Medium date, IBE progressively higher; E in ONE and T in CENT low. Choice EF-45 with beautiful original "autumn leaves" color and traces of lustre. Late rust pits on neck (from a rusted die; we suspect the weather in the late summer of 1822 was unusually muggy as the worst yellow fever epidemic since the 1790s occurred in that year). Not rare, but a highly attractive coin. If an 1881-S Morgan is really worth \$100, this coin should be worth \$200 or more.
- 574 1827 N-2 (R-3). Close date; A's in AMERICA with extra long right feet (evidently a broken punch repaired by hand in the die, this occurs on several other reverses of this year). Glossy brown EF-40, light scratches in right obverse field. Scarce, usually seen well below VF.



- 575 1827 N-4 (R-3). Heavy sawtooth denticles; extra long feet on A's. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, much original mint red, deepening and turning to bluish steel in obverse fields. Couple of minor obverse spots. Probably the third finest known; about a dozen Uncirculateds exist but are mostly entirely brown.
- 576 1827 N-6 (R-4). Close date, 82 nearly touch; two wide denticles at 6:30 reverse. Choice VF-30, dark steel, attractive for grade. With the light obverse crack through stars at right. Ex S. W. Freeman (Kreisberg sale, May, 1958, Lot 1226).



577 **1827 N-7 (R-3).** TY touch; STA higher than TES. **MS-60, Uncirculated**, a lovely rich ebony brown, at first glance appears to be a gem, but obverse fields have been skillfully smoothed down; reverse is choice. One of less than 10 surviving Uncirculated examples of the variety.

- 578 **1827 N-8 (R-3).** Wide date, heavy inner circle at left. **MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, beautiful deep greenish olive with excellent reflectivity. The usual cracks through the stars. **One of only four Uncirculated specimens and probably the finest known.**
- 579 1827 N-10 (R-6). Obverse of N-11; reverse of N-6. VG-8. Rare, one of less than 25 pieces known in all grades (best is EF-45). None in the great Anderson-Dupont sale. Rated the rarest 1827 by Newcomb.



580 1828 N-1 (R-2). Large narrow date, as in 1827, with 82 close; dash between S O. MS-60, Uncirculated, mint red fading to bluish rose (obverse) and "autumn leaves" colors (reverse). Few light scattered scratches, including a fairly recent one on the cheek, but overall highly attractive.

Note: The date punches were changed in 1828 as on most of the other denominations. All of the obverse dies except one use number punches like those of 1827 and earlier, large figures with broad 8's having a thin horizontal stroke at the center. A single 1828 obverse is the small date type with punches the same as used on the 1828 bust quarter (8 punch has a thick stroke at the center and resembles a closed letter S). This small date style was continued into later years. In general, 1828 was a year of wide experimentation at the Mint with William Kneass determined to improve the rather crude appearance of our coins and make them closer to the uniform standards common in England and certain European countries. For the first time, edge collars were introduced (on the dime) to give the coins a uniform diameter and better striking quality at the rims. Also the number punches were changed to give the coins a more modern appearance. On dimes we find a large date with curled 2 and a small date with squared base 2. On the half dollars, there are four distinctly different styles of dates, as both the figure 8 and 2 were changed twice: in general Kneass strived for smaller dates, and sharp, compact designs.

- 581 1828 N-3 (R-2). Large close date, 82 nearly touch: A in STATES closer to right T than left T. Choice EF-45, golden steel, the lustrous reverse fully AU. Hardly common, though not of Condition Census quality.
- 582 1828 N-5 (R-2). Large close date, traces of a mispunched 2 at bottoms of 82; spike extends from leaf tip over O in ONE. Choice VF-30, chocolate brown, perfect for the grade and the kind always offered as "EF-AU."
- 583 1828 N-6. Large close date, traces of an extra 8 show between 8 and 2, a gross mispunching error (often called 1828/1888). EF-40, recovering nicely from an old cleaning. Heavily rusted obverse die (raised lumps of metal in fields of coin). We suspect that this die was put aside unused because of the blunder at the date, then was pressed into service much later during some shortage of obverse dies, perhaps well after 1828.



584 1828 N-9 (R-4). Large close date, 1 low; raised dashes between F and A, evidence of a repair of some kind on the die, similar to the crisscross right of the date on the 1826 half cent (this reverse appears again in 1829 on N-8). Choice AU-55, pinkish olive and sea-green with underlying mint lustre; really a beauty in spite of its not being strictly mint state. Tied for seventh finest behind the six known Uncirculateds. Seldom offered; none in any grade in the Anderson-Dupont Sale.



585 1828 N-10. The famous small date, punches identical to those on the 1828 bust quarter; the last variety of the year on the basis of style. MS-60, Uncirculated, greenish iridescence blended with pale gold resulting in an overall color somewhat resembling khaki. Beautiful, strong strike. An impressive cent with a pedigree to match: Dr. French, Hines, Sheldon, C. Douglass Smith, Helfenstein (Lot 125, called second finest known and sold at a very firm \$210 in 1964).



586 1828 N-11. Large close date, 82 not too close; blundered reverse die: first S in STATES and O in OF both punched much too far left, then corrected, ample traces of the misplaced letters remain. This reverse die was probably done by the same apprentice that gave us the famous 12 star half cent; evidently too many pints of ale were being consumed by the workman doing the dies. Choice AU-55, iridescent light olive and tan with touches of a darker reddish brown. Another excellent pedigree: H. P. Smith (May, 1906, Lot 1138), New Netherlands' 59th sale, Lot 1275.



587 **1828 N-12 (R-5).** Sharpness of EF-40, but with scattered surface scale and porosity on both sides and a sharp obverse rim nick at 10 o'clock, reducing the overall grade down to a mid-range VF. Still this qualifies as the fifth finest known and fourth best in collector's hands.

Note: A famous variety, the rarest 1828 cent. The obverse die was used on N-5, N-2, N-4, N-3, and N-12 in that order. It can be distinguished from the obverse of N-1, which it closely resembles by noting that in LIBERTY, B is sharply above I, and E is well above the R. The reverse die is immediately identified by the short dash between the last S in STATES and O. This reverse die was first used on 1827 N-12, then 1828 N-12, and finally on 1828 N-1.

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588 1829 N-2 (R-1). Large 1 in date, crack at the first three stars; large letters in legend, high leaf midway between S O. AU-50, prooflike dark steel, an excellent piece. Large letters in legend as in 1828 and earlier; a new smaller set of letter punches was put into use this year, but due to a large number of old reverse dies, large letter reverses continue to appear for many years afterward.



- 589 1829 N-3 (R-4). Obverse as last, later state; new reverse with small letters in legend, final A boldly recut to left. AU-50, medium golden brown, and unusually well struck for these with most stars showing their radials and no sign of the usual weakness in the central portion of the reverse. Third finest known behind two Uncirculated examples, one of which is in ANS and therefore forever off the market. From Stack's October, 1978 sale, Lot 617.
- 590 1829 N-5 (R-3). Close date, large 1, complete inner circle; small letters, same die as N-3 above. EF-40, chestnut brown deepening to charcoal, few dark stains on reverse. Flatly struck on head, as usual, but stars are mostly sharp. Borderline Condition Census coin, seldom seen even in full VF.
- 591 1829 N-9 (R-4). Wide date with a small 1 leaning sharply right; small letters reverse, same as on last two pieces. Choice VF-30, medium to dark brown. Late die state with the fine crack down from bust tip to rim below (this crack is rare). Seldom offered even in Fine, and this piece crowds the Condition Census.
- 592 1829 N-5, small letters. Fine-12, dark steel, lighter on the relief areas.
- 593 1830 N-5 (R-4). Close date, semi-blunt 1; large letters on reverse. VF-20, perfect chocolate brown. One of the scarcer ones, usually seen VG or worse.



594 **1830 N-6 (R-4), the famous small letters reverse;** obverse as last. **Choice EF-45,** with claims to full AU as the fine rich chocolate surfaces display unmistakable signs of mint lustre. Fifth or sixth finest, perhaps even higher, as this variety is notoriously overgraded when offered. Seldom seen above Fine, most are on dark, rough planchets. Many times rarer than the 1829 small letters, of course. Ex C.A. Allenburger, Lot 869 (Mehl, March, 1948).

Note: The only reverse die of this year with small letters in legend. The new small letters style was introduced in 1829 as mentioned above. This parallels the small letters reverse first seen on the 1828 half dollar (O-119). However, old style large letter reverses turn up on the cents as late as 1834. Either we have to assume that the engravers were making up reverses dies with both large and small lefters randomly, which seems illogical, or the changeover occurred sometime in 1829, with all new reverse dies made after that having small lefters. The latter possibility then implies that there was a huge backlog of unused large lefter reverses made in early 1829 or before that had to be worked off, and these were mixed in with the new reverse dies and pulled for the presses in nearly random order. As one progresses from 1829-1834, the small lefter reverses generally become more numerous, indicating the supply of old reverses was gradually running out. We obviously favor the second possibility, as it also fits the data in the half dollar series. Here the changeover occurred in late 1828, with most of the dies in 1829 and later having small lefters but occasional old large lefter dies persisted for many years thereafter (two dies in 1829, one in 1830), another in 1832). The same pattern of random use of old dies occurs in many of the overdates in all series, and was obviously a very common practice.

Extraordinary Set of 1831 Cents

The following set of 1831 large cents, complete in all known Newcomb varieties, ranks as one of the finest ever to come up for public competition, eclipsing the Helfenstein offering and coming very close to the fantastic selection in the Anderson-Dupont sale, held nearly thirty years ago. 1831 was obviously one of our consignor's favorite years and choice type pieces, rare varieties in top condition, and Condition Census coins abound.

For the type or date collector we emphasize again that large cents in the early 1830s are seldom available in strict Uncirculated condition. There are two reasons for this. First, all were apparently distributed at the time of issue, as no hoards containing these dates have ever been found. It has been estimated that perhaps 200 Uncirculated 1831 cents of all varieties survive. Second, even this low figure does not fully reflect the availability of choice pieces because of the well-known fact that most of the top ones are in the hands of large cent specialists. These usually trade privately, seldom appearing for public competition or in dealer inventories. So, if you were to write to your dealer asking to buy a nice Uncirculated 1831 cent, for example, we would guess that you would have a very long wait, perhaps even several years. Consider that the following collection has five Uncirculated examples and a couple more that would be called Uncirculated by many dealers and you can see that a few dozen variety specialists can easily gobble up every choice condition piece that comes up for sale. So a selection like this is truly an opportunity for the alert collector looking to buy scarce, undervalued items.

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595 1831 N-1 (R-1). Heavy circular crack through top of date; large letters. MS-63, Select Uncirculated, gorgeous dark bluish steel with iridescent overtones on reverse. Usual uneven strike with top cluster of leaves in wreath weak. Cluster of faint hairlines on obverse above the head. Graded "MS-60" by the consignor, no doubt due to the uneven strike, but we believe the lovely colors pull the overall grade up above that level. Only two pieces known that are distinctly finer than this, one of them in the ANS Collection. None in the Helfenstein offering, and the Anderson-Dupont piece was just shy of Mint State. From a 1975 Pine Tree Auction Co. sale, ex Charles Southwick.

Note: The cents of 1831 feature a more forceful Ms. Liberty. The original Scot figure was sharpened up and improved considerably under the able hand of Mint engraver William Kneass, who succeeded Scot to that post upon the latter's death in 1823. The nose, mouth, and chin have been considerably strengthened, giving the profile a different look from Scot's original 1816 design. Actually the profile now resembles quite strongly Kneass's work on the dimes and half dollars of this era, as well as the gold pieces. It is not exactly clear whether Kneass fashioned an entirely new head punch or merely touched up the old one, but the overall result is much improved from the Scot design. The only criticism is that Kneass deepened the recess for the cheek and forehead a little too much, so that the die required a high relief that was not able to be fully brought up on normal strikes. So these areas are often weak, along with the areas opposite to them on the reverse.

- 596 1831 N-2 (R-2). First 1 in date high; small letters in legend, large letters in ONE CENT. EF-40, dark brown, smooth. Long, fine denticles as in 1834. This reverse die was also used on three different varieties of 1835, and was evidently made in 1835. Die state evidence proves that the present 1831 cent was struck in 1835 after N-18 and N-12 of that year.
- 597 1831 N-2. Also EF-40, medium brown. Late state of the obverse, now worn with uneven fields and a rim break at 3 o'clock.

598 1831 N-3 Obverse of N-2; different small letters reverse with smaller letters in ONE CENT. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, bluish steel and chocolate with a full cartwheel effect; a splendid beauty. From Lester Merkin's October, 1972 sale, Lot 589 at \$325; probably worth triple that price today.

Note: Probably struck during the 1833-1835 period, despite the 1831 date, as the reverse die also appears on 1834 N-5 and 1835 N-1. It has long been known that the mintage figures given for coins dated between about 1831 and 1836 are notoriously unreliable. From studying the coins in various denominations we know that there was an unusual amount of restriking activity going on during this period

with obverse and reverse dies several years old muled indiscriminately with new dies, indicating some kind of an emergency situation. Also coins struck in a given year were often held in Mint vaults and released up to several years later. Because of these factors, the mintages listed for these dates offer no help in determining how many coins of each date were actually struck. Indeed, analysis based on actual observed rarity and number of die varieties per year indicates sharp disagreements with the mintage figures. The well-known lack of overdates during this period was evidently a deliberate policy designed to prevent excessive numbers of coins being struck with multiply overdated dies (like a teacher correcting a schoolboy's paper, if there are occasional spelling errors, these will be pointed out, but if every second or third word is period with poor strikes from dies showing ample amounts of rust, etc., indicating dilapidated equipment.



599 1831 N-4 (R-4). Strong serifs on 1's; small letters, die dot between tops of TA in STATES. AU-50, sea-green and steel mottled with tan and chocolate shades, much underlying lustre. Characteristic blunt impression on head, as mentioned in note above, die was too strongly hubbed so that there was not enough metal to fill in the recesses fully upon normal striking pressure. The cheek is in particularly high relief and has robbed some metal from the opposite side, producing the typical weakness at CE(NT). With the circular reverse cracks but without any sign of the fine obverse cracks. Second finest known, exceeded only by the Naftzger piece which is AU-55. A well-known, pedigreed cent: ex Gaskill, Landau, TAD collection (Stack's, Feb. 1976, Lot 107).

600 1831 N-5. VG-8, dark, nick on reverse at OF. R-4, second rarest 1831.

- 601 **1831 N-6** (R-1). Broad flat denticles; large letters with leaf close to D in UNITED. **MS-65**, **Choice Uncirculated**, bluish olive obverse with traces of darkened mint red; pinkish tan reverse, faded from the original mint color. **Second or third finest**, and another fantastic condition 1831. From Lester Merkin's Oct., 1972 sale, Lot 590 at a strong (for a decade ago) \$310.
- 602 1831 N-7½. Obverse as last; new reverse with large letters, C nearly closed in AMERICA. AU-50, poorly cleaned, exposing the red copper, green stains about obverse rim. Double profile evident from throat to nose, especially on lips.
- 603 1831 N-8 (R-3). Obverse as last two; large letter reverse, RI well apart at bases and even. Choice EF-45, deep brick red, verdigris fills in a few letters on reverse, sharpness near AU-50 level. With the light reverse diecracks. Formerly a Condition Census cent with only four known in Uncirculated, but many AU-Unc. pieces have turned up in the past decade. From New Netherlands 59th sale, Lot 1284.



604 **1831 N-9a** (R-3). Circular crack through top of date; reverse of N-6 but this was struck first. Plain straight tail to R in LIBERTY as seen on cents dated 1808-1820. **MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, medium brown with bluish golden overtones on the somewhat prooflike obverse. **Second or third best** with only a single piece (the Newcomb coin) distinctly better. Should see spirited bidding!



605 **1831 N-10c** (R-3). Wide date with heavy serifs on both 1's (new punch); large letter reverse of N-7. **AU-50**, dark brown with underlying lustre, usual blunt strike on forehead and center of reverse (obverse die cut too deeply). Late rim break at the 9th star. Ex Howard Newcomb (one of the most desirable of any imaginable pedigree on a late date cent!), Lot 632; 1949 ANA Sale, Lot 1661.



606 **1831 N-11** (R-1). Heavy circular obverse crack, nearly a full 360 degrees; small letter reverse, large letters in ONE CENT. First variety of the year, using an old reverse previously used in 1830. **Choice AU-55**, greenish olive with underlying lustre, faintest cabinet friction on a few high points but obviously never really in circulation. Displays the light rim break at TES. Another attractive cent from Lester Merkin's Oct., 1972 sale, Lot 593 at \$260.



- 607 **1831 N-12** (R-1). Obverse as last; large letter reverse of N-9. **Choice AU-55**, grayish olive, two slight obverse spots, otherwise attractive. An excellent type coin for someone wanting something more than the usual spotty Randall hoard cent to illustrate this design. Ex Lou Riggs June 24, 1957 Sale, Lot 121.
- 608 1831 N-14 (High R-5). Obverse of N-7 with the rim break at 9th star; large letter reverse. Just Fine-12, unusual gold surfaces, probably cleaned and recolored. Reportedly from the "Great Eastern Collection"

handled by dealer Joel Rettew about a decade ago. Rare, only about 35 pieces known in all grades, really a borderline R-6 variety.

Note: The variety listed as A-13 probably does not exist. This was listed by Frank Andrews in his 1883 book on large cents (Andrews was the standard text on the late dates until the Newcomb book came out during the War). Newcomb states "A-13 unknown to me" but left a number for it just in case it ever turned up. It never has and presumably does not exist, the original Andrews listing being a mistake.



- 609 **1834 N-1**. Small date, large stars, narrows denticles; small letters reverse. **MS-60**, **Uncirculated**, greenish olive with faint tinges of red. Usual circular diecracks on both sides at peripheries. Ex R. J. Reynolds (June, 1945), Dr. Satoris, Del Bland.
 - Note: The 1834 cents form a most interesting series, rivalling the 1834 half dollars for sheer variety. The major varieties are:
 - 1) Small date, large stars, broad denticles (obverse type of 1833 and earlier); small letters on reverse. N-2.

2) Small date, large stars, narrow denticles as first introduced this year; small letters on reverse with narrow denticles. N-1.

- 3) Large date with a broad 8, large stars, narrow denticles; large letters on reverse with narrow denticles. N-6, N-7.
- 4) Large date, large stars, narrow denticles; small letters, old-style broad denticles. N-5.

5) Large date, small stars, blunt denticles as in 1838 and later; small letters with narrow denticles. N-3, N-4.

610 **1834 N-4 (R-3).** Large date, small stars; small letters in legend, large letters in ONE CENT. **MS-65, Choice Uncirculated,** light iridescent olive with mint red, nearly flawless, a real prize. Both cracks mentioned in Newcomb, and reverse die heavily rusted at UNITED STATES. **One of the top two or three pieces,** excelled only by the MS-70 Dr. French coin and perhaps equalled by the Oscar Pearl/ Neil coin. Should attract attention with this pedigree: F.C.C. Boyd, New Netherlands 50th sale, Lot 1556, to Landau, New Netherlands 52nd sale, Lot 147, Louis Helfenstein, Lot 151 (at \$210 back in 1964) to Frank Masters, Lot 243.

Note: An interesting coin as the obverse dentilation pattern is different from other 1834 cents and is actually similar to that appearing on cents struck in 1838 and after. Note short blunt denticles inside a raised lip or rim. This type of pattern was probably an experiment, and was probably designed by Kneass to be used with the close collar that had been implemented on the smaller denominations during 1828-1832 but so far had not been attempted on the larger diameter coins (the cent and the half dollar). The same type of raised rim is found on the famous 1834 Proof cent included in the diplomatic presentation set that yielded the 1804 dollar (see Newman and Bressett's "Fantastic 1804 Dollar").

Spectacular Double Profile



611 **1834 N-6**^{1/2} (R-7). Large date, large stars, 3 in date low, circular crack; large letters reverse. Broad double profile, visible literally at "arm's length". **MS-60**, **Uncirculated**, dark chestnut brown, glossy. Faint traces of cabinet friction on one or two high points, but the color and underlying lustre pull the grade up above AU-55; beautiful whatever it is graded. Fifth finest known of the variety but the second best with the double profile, which is one of the more spectacular in the series.

Note: Double profiles exist on practically every date of U.S. cent, but become especially common in the 1833-1835 period, when, as we have seen, dilapidated equipment was being used to turn out coins in record numbers. The double profile is not a die characteristic, but results from rebounds of the upper (i.e. obverse) die in a worn or poorly adjusted screw press. Evidently only the cent press was affected, as this phenomenon does not occur on the other denominations of this period (although it is quite common on 1823-1824 dated half dollars). After the old screw presses were finally scrapped in 1835, the double profiles abruptly disappear.



612 1839 N-8. Type of 1840: "petite" head by Gobrecht tipped sharply forward with respect to date; smaller letters in legend and denomination, no line below CENT. MS-60, Uncirculated, glossy brown, struck from much worn dies, especially the reverse. Tiny planchet flake above N in UNITED.



- 613 1841 N-2. (R-2). Traces of an earlier mispunched date around 1, 4 and peak of last 1; bold die scratches slant down to right through ON(E). MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, sea-green with considerable faded mint red, especially on the reverse. Ex Downing (privately), Helfenstein, Lot 201, where not graded (!) but illustrated and called "second finest seen;" it brought \$140 back in 1964 when a \$10 bag of groceries cost less than \$3.
- 614 1841 N-4. Arc crack through top few stars; die scratches between ONE and CENT diverge to left. MS-60, Uncirculated, reddish brown with the lustre on the dull side, as seems to be the usual case on cents of this date. Two minor reverse planchet chips. Faint diecrack through UNITED S.

615 1841 N-5. Circular crack through all stars; thin spine down from left top of N in CENT. Choice AU-55, olive and steel, minor rim irregularity below date. Scarce, probably R-4.



- 616 **1841 N-7a** (R-1). First 1 recut at top, dot below bases of 4 and 1. **MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, light olive with traces of red, a lovely example and rare like this. From the 1976 ANA sale, Lot 688. 1841 cents of all varieties are hardly common in strict mint condition, any with mint red are rare, and brilliant red (uncleaned) gems are unobtainable; Proofs are more common!
- 617 **1843** Type of 1840-1842. Evidently N-9: 843 in date all recut below, round hole in ear. **MS-60**, **Uncirculated**, medium brown to chestnut. Thin obverse rim break at top.

618 **1844/81 N-2. MS-63, Select Uncirculated**, sea-green and orange, usual blunt strike. Second finest known with a very impressive pedigree: Ex. R.C. Johnson (Elder, 1912), Hillyes Ryder (New Netherlands 41st sale, Lot 918); Helfenstein Lot 220; Masters, Lot 271. The most famous of all of the blundered dates of the 1840s. The entire 1844 date (four digit logotype) was punched into the die *upside down* before the engraver realized his mistake and corrected it. It is fun to contemplate what would have happened if this error had not been corrected and the resulting upside down dated coins had been released into circulation!



- 619 **1846 N-19 (R-4).** Small date; heavy die file marks from rim through E in AMERICA. **MS-60, Uncirculated**, light bluish golden brown with a couple of obverse spots. Reverse is somewhat streaky but semiprooflike. Rare.
- 620 1847 N-21 (R-5). Line parallel to ribbon through first outside leaf. Choice AU-55, reddish brown, two small reverse rim bumps.
- 621 1848 N-16 (R-2). Diagonal line in center of 4, possibly a minor recutting. MS-60, Uncirculated, sunset and rose tones, possibly cleaned decades ago. Open 4 in date, which like the 1847 cents, has the crosslet well away from the base of the 4. Later varieties have a closed 4 with a long crosslet that nearly touches the base; this style does not recur in 1849. Both punches are also seen on the 1849 half dollars.
- 622 1848 N-16 (R-1). Closed 4, dot below left base, vertical lines right of upright below crossbar. MS-60, cleaned Uncirculated, now light olive to tan with a semi-prooflike obverse.
- 623 1849 N-13 (R-6). Lines under 1 and 4, minute dot under 9. Choice AU-55, chestnut to dark brown, nicely mottled with reflective surfaces.
- 624 1849 N-19 (R-5). Faint lines from LIBERT to curls. EF-40, reverse rim bump, dark brown with reflective surfaces.
- 625 1849 N-20 (R-1). Spike up from between denticles right of date; early state of reverse with heavy die scratches throughout. EF-40.
- 626 1849 N-20 (R-1). This from the late state of the same dies with the obverse spike mostly faded, reverse die lines worn away. EF-40.
- 627 1849 N-9 (R-3). Sharp die lines at back on neck; heavy die crumbling on reverse. AU-50, deep reddish brown. Ex Frank Masters, May 1971 Lot 279.
- 628 1849 N-17 (R-5). Spike down from throat rusted dies. AU-50, medium brown, few faint scratches between stars at top obverse.

629 1849 "N-27," not in Newcomb. Heavy sharp spike down to left from upright of E in ONE opposite crossbar. Probably an R-5. Choice AU-55, recovering from an old cleaning.



- 630 1850 N-23 (R-2). Open 5; sharp point up from right tip of T in CENT. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, nearly full mint red, just starting to tone to bluish gray in fields. Splendid prooflike surfaces. Probably finest known of the variety; much finer than Helfenstein, Lot 258.
- 631 1852 MS-63, Select Uncirculated, red and brown, struck with very worn dies.



- 632 1855 N-8 (R-1). Upright 5's in date. MS-65, Choice Uncirculated, reddish golden, glossy from an application of "Care" or something similar.
- 633 1856 N-2 (R-1). Italic 5 in date. Crack from rim grazes left side of 8th star. MS-60, Uncirculated, golden steel, signs of an old cleaning. From an unknown Bluestone sale, Lot 982.
- 634 1856 N-12 (R-1). Hole in ear; vertical lines around E in CENT. MS-60, Uncirculated, sharp reddish brown, somewhat dull. From Lester Merkin's Sept. 1970 sale, Lot 152.

The 1908 \$5, 1907 \$10, 1908 \$10, and MCMVII \$20 were the personal property of President Theodore Roosevelt and were given by him to his daughter, Ethel Carow Roosevelt, from whom they passed to the present consignor.

Unlike any president before or since, Theodore Roosevelt used his office to elevate the nation's coinage to what he considered to be new highs of artistic merit. In the recentlypublished book, *United States Gold Coins: An Illustrated History*, by Q. David Bowers, many pages are devoted to the relationship between Theodore Roosevelt and Augustus Saint-Gaudens. The reader is referred to that source for additional information. However, it is appropriate to give a synopsis of Roosevelt and his numismatic involvement here.

Born to a wealthy New York family in 1858, Theodore Roosevelt overcame a sickly youth by rigorous exercise, including horseback riding, shooting, and boxing. Graduating from Harvard with a law degree in 1880, he spurned his chosen profession to become an author. During the next few decades his pen produced numerous books as well as many articles and essays.

Elected Republican assemblyman for New York's 21st District, a term which he served 1882-1884, he sought to reform every area of misconduct which came to his attention, thus setting the stage for battles with perceived wrongdoers which were to become a Roosevelt trademark.

After numerous political and military accomplishments, culminating with heroic service with the Rough Riders in Cuba during the Spanish-American War, Roosevelt was nominated as McKinkey's vice-president on the 1900 Republican ticket. Following McKinley's death in September 1901, Roosevelt became president.

A competent administrator, he brought to the office an intense dislike of complicated procedures and red tape. Seeking a broad contact with the electorate, Roosevelt was truly a president of the people. Representatives of the arts, sciences, and letters had a contact with the White House hitherto unknown. The Washington social scene sparkled, and lavish parties provided endless newspaper copy.

By 1904 his popularity was widespread and reelection came by a landslide. Today Roosevelt's presidency, which lasted through 1908, is remembered for its trustbusting activities, for the 1906 Pure Food and Drug Act, his daring display of American force when he sent the "Great White Fleet" around the world (from December 1907 through February 1909) with his policy voiced as "Speak softly and carry a big stick," and his dynamic and colorful involvement in every aspect of American life which interested him. It is not known when Theodore Roosevelt first formulated the idea of having Augustus Saint-Gaudens, one of America's most prominent sculptors, redesign the nation's coinage, but by December 27, 1904, the concept was sufficiently entrenched in the president's mind that he wrote to Secretary of the Treasury Leslie Mortier Shaw:

I think our coinage is artistically of atrocious hideousness. Would it be possible, without asking permission of Congress, to employ a man like Saint-Gaudens to give us a coinage that would have some beauty?

On January 16, 1905, President Roosevelt further pursued the situation with Shaw:

In accordance with our conversation and the agreement we came to in connection with the coinage, I would like you to submit this letter to the Director of the Mint. I suppose it comes under his immediate supervision.

In the first place, about the coinage. How soon will it be possible to have Saint-Gaudens employed for at least one set of coins? Of course he is to be given an absolutely free hand. This is not a reflection upon the Director of the Mint or any of his subordinates. It is out of the question that great artists should be put in the position of Director of the Mint or of his subordinates, if only for the reason that they would probably be wholly incompetent to do the work; but it is of the utmost importance that the artist should be left absolutely unhampered in working out the design and execution of the coin or medal. I do not wish there to be the slightest interference with Saint-Gaudens in connection with the coinage from its artistic side. Please have the matter taken up at the earliest possible moment, and advise me about it . . .

Then began a collaboration between the artist and Roosevelt which the president characterized as "his pet crime." The staff of the Mint was dead set against interference by Augustus Saint-Gaudens, an outsider, and placed every obstacle they could in his way. This only served to stimulate Roosevelt's desire to back Saint-Gaudens to the fullest extent.

After much discussion, a figure taken from Saint-Gaudens' statue of *Victory*, a part of the Sherman Monument in Central Park, New York City, was used as the motif for the obverse of the proposed new \$20 issue. Unlike previous designs of the denomination, the new motif was to be in sculptured-appearing high relief. In keeping with classical tradition, the date appeared in Roman numerals, MCMVII, rather than the standard 1907.

Difficulties were encountered with striking the novel highrelief issues, and it was found that multiple impressions of the coining dies had to be made in order to bring all of the design details to the required sharpness. Obviously the situation was not suitable for high-speed production coinage. After a couple dozen Extremely High Relief MCMVII pieces were made as patterns, 11,250 were struck for production purposes, each piece receiving multiple blows from the coinage press, as noted. Designated as the "regular" High Relief issues, these

coins are highly prized by numismatists today, many of whom consider the issue to be the finest ever produced in America.

Following the production run of 11,250 coins, the design was modified to a shallow relief and the Roman numerals were abandoned.

Around the same time a related Saint-Gaudens design featuring the portrait of a female in an Indian headdress was adopted for the obverse of the \$10. This basic design was used from 1907 through 1933 and today is likewise popular with numismatists.

Originally it was President Roosevelt's desire to have Saint-Gaudens redesign *every* United States denomination from the cent onward. However, the artist's failing health, culminating with his death in the summer of 1907, precluded this. After the Saint-Gaudens \$10 and \$20 pieces were a reality, Roosevelt turned his attention to the $$2\frac{1}{2}$ and \$5 gold pieces, calling upon Bela Lyon Pratt, a Boston sculptor to produce them. The result was an innovative design in American coinage: an incuse style in which the motifs, an Indian head on the obverse and a perched eagle on the reverse were, together with the lettering and date, the *lowest* parts of the coin, while the fields, normally the lowest parts of the coin, were the highest. Coins of this design were produced from 1908 through 1929.

Had Roosevelt's presidency continued beyond 1908, no doubt he would have had a say in the redoing of other denominations. But, that task fell to others. During the next decade the Lincoln cent, buffalo nickel, and the redesigned silver issues of 1916 made their appearance. Each of these was designed by an artist who was not in the regular employ of the Mint, a departure from earlier procedures pioneered by Roosevelt's designation of Saint-Gaudens.

The beautiful \$10 and \$20 designs of 1907 by Augustus Saint-Gaudens and the 1908 designs by Bela Lyon Pratt, and the personal involvement of President Theodore Roosevelt with them, stand today as one of the most interesting and colorful chapters in American numismatics.

A very pleasing specimen of this highly-desired early half eagle issue.





636 **1908 S5. Matte Proof-55.** A Proof which has been subject to light polishing and slight mishandling over the years (for it was not kept by numismatists). Still, a sharply-struck and thoroughly attractive example of this issue. Just 167 Matte Proofs were distributed in 1908, and of that number many have since disappeared. Probably only a few dozen exist today.

Formerly the property of President Theodore Roosevelt; given by him to his daughter, from whom it passed to the consignor.



637 1795 \$10. 13 leaves below eagle. AU-50, brilliant.

A sharply-struck and very pleasing example of the first United States \$10 issue. Abundant lustre remains on the obverse and reverse, the latter also having a suggestion of prooflike surface. Some horizontal mintcaused adjustment marks can be seen on the breast of the eagle. A few scattered rim marks on the obverse are mentioned.


Very elusive in this condition. A major opportunity for the specialist or for the type collector.



638 **1800 \$10.** Capped Bust to right obverse, Heraldic Eagle reverse. Mintage of 5,999 pieces, substantially lower than the preceding and following years.

Extremely Fine-40. A few scattered marks, including a minute depression in the right obverse field opposite the mouth, several reverse rim nicks, and some reverse rim adjustment marks (mint-caused).

A pleasing example of this popular issue.

Perfectly centered and struck with full beading on both sides. The kind often inflated to "EF," but then Liberty cap 1793s are almost always severely overgraded, and have been for decades. The chance to buy an attractive, **properly graded**, strict VF at auction is highly significant. Worth several thousand dollars and a coin that will always be in fantastic demand. For comparison purposes, this should sell at roughly the same price as a 1936 U.S. Proof set but potentially worth far more.


785 1944 steel cent (struck on a 1943 blank in error). Weight 42.9 grains, or close to standard for the zinc plated steel blanks used in 1943 (regular copper 1944 cents weigh close to 48 grains). AU-50 or so, but processed, just like the popular 1943 cents sold in jewelry stores. Large lamination type depression on lower reverse. Very weak about the rims; this is diagnostic as the steel planchets were thinner than the regular bronze ones intended for 1944. Detailed X-ray diffraction and X-ray flourescence data supplied by the consignor indicate strong spectral peaks at frequencies characteristic of zinc and iron, and only minor peaks at frequencies corresponding to copper; the graphs match exactly runs done on a 1943 steel cent for comparison, and prove conclusively that the present 1944 cent was struck on a planchet of the type used for the 1943 cents. Just about as rare as the corresponding 1943 cent in copper, but not quite as well publicized. Judd, appendix B states eight or nine pieces known of each; Taxay (Scott's Encyclopedia, pg. 352) lists the 1943 copper as R-7 and the 1944 steel as R-6, but does not break down these estimates by mint. We have handled two of these in the past five years, one comparable to the present specimen in our Bartlett sale (November, 1979), Lot 2199 at \$3700 and an Uncirculated directly from the Sinnock estate in our 1981 ANA sale at \$3500.

Note: The 1944 cent is also known struck in silver on a dime planchet, in aluminum-bronze and in brass, both of these being meant for foreign coins which were being struck at the same time at the Philadelphia Mint. The large number of off-planchet errors during the period 1942-1944 compared to earlier years was a direct effect of the emergency coinage conditions during the War years. The same type of off-planchet errors occur in the Jefferson nickels (pre-war types struck on war-time planchets and vice-versa), but these have not received anywhere near the popularity of the cents, probably because the difference in color between the copper and zinc plated steel blanks is so dramatic.

786 **1944-D Steel cent. 42.3 grains. Brilliant Uncirculated**, mostly choice, though displays signs of a cleaning. Not quite as nice as the piece in our 1981 ANA sale, though this mintmark is considerably rarer in error form. Also weak at the rims (an alleged 1944 steel cent would be immediately suspect of being a forgery were it sharp at the rims, as explained above). This particular piece can be identified by a slight diagonal tarnish streak running across the reverse, bisecting C in CENT, and touching top point of left wheat stalk and bottom point of right one. Listed in Judd, Appendix B as "two known." The fact that this same error occurred at all three mints is quite remarkable.

787 1944-S Steel cent. 41.5 grains. EF, cleaned, very weak about the rims. With ANACS certification No. E-1089-A. Rarest of the three mints and completely unlisted in both Judd and Taxay (Judd only lists the 1943-S cent struck on a silver dime planchet). As far as we know, this is the first time in auction history that all three of these have been offered at once; an extraordinary opportunity.





- 788 **1955 Double die cent. MS-60 or better, full mint red Uncirculated** with some light traces of fingerprints. ANACS certified as genuine and graded "MS-60/63," which we agree with.
- 789 **1955 Double die cent. MS-60 or better, Uncirculated**, mint red and greenish olive; very attractive.

Most obvious are traces of both loops of an original 8 punched much too far left inside the loops of the corrected 8. There is also some trace of what is probably an underlying 7: a tiny spike in field in front of top loop of final 8, and a triangular projection on the top upper right corner of the 8 (these two projections are evidently the remnants of the top bar of a 7 and resemble the 1858/7 cent in this regard). There is also a faint trace of extra metal between the crossbar of the 4 and the lower loop of the final 8 which the consignor claims is part of the loop of a 6. The final 8 was punched into the die separately from the other three figures, close to the 4, and extra heavily to hide these undercuttings. The entire surface of the die was first given a fine polishing resulting in the prooflike surface on the present piece. The recuttings are easily visible under magnification if the coin is tilted in a strong light, but our attempts to illustrate the recuttings on an enlarged photograph of the date area were not successful and we did not wish to resort to retouching the photographs. The present variety, unlisted in Taxay is the first to be offered publicly, to our knowledge. A few other worn ones have been reported from these dies, and the piece will be listed in the future Breen U.S. coin Encyclopedia when that long-awaited reference finally appears.

Note: Evidently this marriage was struck first, and the reverse die was replaced with a new one to form B-1 after the dies had clashed badly. The reverse must have been discarded, as it appears on no other 1805 variety, and does not turn up in 1806 either. The variety was first discovered by Herbert Bergen, who specialized in early quarters by die variety; the Bergen collection was sold at auction by Abner Kreisberg and Jerry Cohen in 1979. The Bergen piece (Lot 9) was listed as VF and it appears to be about equal in sharpness to the present piece; the photo is too blurry to determine if it is the same coin without the toning.

- 1153 1795 O-103a (R-6). Heavy rim break at AME. VG-8 obverse; Good-4 reverse, the difference due to die failure. Far better than the Overton plate coin with all stars visible at right and sharpness near Fine in center of obverse. Light gray with signs of an old cleaning, few scratches on either side, the most serious of which goes from rim to final S in STATES. Rare variety, but even rarer in this die state; apparently unavailable even in fully Fine.
- 1154 1795 AG-3, obverse nearly Good-4, reverse weaker. Rather harshly cleaned.

Unusually Choice 1803, O-103

1155 1803 O-103 (large 3 with vertical serif; large stars on reverse, as in 1805-7). MS-60, gold, lilac, and bluish gray toned Uncirculated, light cabinet friction on highest points of obverse, well brought up on devices with hair detail, drapery lines, definition in feathers on wings, breast and tail all as sharp as seen on this type, however not well struck at the rims; much of the obverse dentilation is blurry or missing. Some of this is due to die failure, with various tiny rimbreaks visible under a glass, along with some overlaps of the edge lettering machine (these resemble rim dents but were actually on the planchet before the coin was struck). Sharply clashed dies with much of the reverse embossed on the obverse, including lines of shield at the ear, etc. Light diecrack through tops of letters in LIBERTY. Really rare condition; the only record we have for this variety in really choice condition is Lot 470 of the 1975 ANA sale, ex New Netherlands 54th sale, Lot 356 at \$3900. The Garrett 1803 half dollar was variety O-101 and was extra sharp, but cleaned AU-50, it brought \$2900. Another example of O-101 brought \$2300 (a record price!) nearly ten years ago in our Terrell sale. This one, which comes to us without pedigree, will certainly attract attention.

Note: Mintage on the 1803 is listed as only 31,715 coined. However another 156,519 were struck during the year 1804, and most of these were surely dated 1803. This brings the total up to about 188,234 pieces, which seems reasonable as this date is fairly common in grades up to about Fine. In EF and above, however it is very scarce, and in Uncirculated condition any 1803 is a great rarity. The half dollar denomination was very popular and circulated extensively; hence choice examples of any date before 1807 are rare and some dates (1801, 1802) are unknown in full Uncirculated. In fact, all half dollars before about 1810 are rare in full mint state condition, as all were absorbed by the economy and none piled up in bank vaults, as happened in the 1820s. In fact, the 1975 ANA coin quoted above, was obtained from England, having been brought over there and carefully preserved from the year of issue.



- 1156 **1807 Bust right. O-110. Choice VF-30**, bluish silvery tones with lustre in the protected areas. Smooth surfaces suggest EF but details in centers too weak for us to call it that, though some of the weakness is surely due to striking. Very early die state (unlisted) with only a faint obverse diecrack through stars at left.
- 1157 1807 Bust right. O-102. VF-20, some lustre suggesting a higher grade, but the usual weak strike with the reverse die much worn and letters in legend heavily drawn to rim. Light steel gray toning and free of the usual defects.
- 1158 1807 Bust right. O-105. VF-20, dark gray toning, two shallow obverse edge dents, but very pleasing for the grade.
- 1159 **1807 Bust right. O-108 (R-6).** VF-20, cleaned, some lustre in the protected areas, usual blunt strike in the centers, very weak at stars above head of eagle (compare with the Overton plate coin, which is about equal in sharpness to the present piece). A really difficult variety to locate.
- 1160 1807 Bust right. O-105. Fine-12, once cleaned, recovering to a smooth warm gray.
- 1161 1807 Bust right. O-106. Probably should be called Fine-12 for the coin, extremely weak obverse impression, with sharpness close to Good-4, reverse stronger with traces of lustre near the rims. Light gray toning. Seldom offered, and unknown really sharp.
- 1162 1807 Bust left, 50/20 reverse. Good-4, graffiti in fields; 1834 AU-50, lustrous, but three small, sharp rim cuts at 2:00 obverse. (Total: 2 pieces)
- 1163 1808 VF-20, obverse scratches; 1833 VF-20; 1833 EF-40, light obverse scratches. (Total: 3 pieces)



- 1164 1814 O-109, but unlisted state of reverse die: heavy straight die cut from right shoulder of eagle up toward scroll, and ending below UN(UM), another shorter one in field between wing and right end of scroll, a third from left wing near tip downward into field. Choice AU-55, full mint lustre, attractive olive-gold toning at the rims.

- 1166 1814/3 O-101. VF-20 or better, some lustre, deep blue-gold toning on obverse; reverse more of a steel gray, also with lustre. Usual weak strike in many areas, but the lovely surfaces suggest a grade of EF. Ex Garrett Collection, Lot 296.

- 1167 **1823 O-107** (tall 1 with long thin serifs; ME joined at bases and small C in 50C). **MS-65**, **Choice Brilliant Uncirculated**, **frosty**, just about flawless. An excellent type coin in top condition.
- 1168 1823 O-111a, extended reverse cracks. Choice AU-55 with nearly full lustre.
- 1169 1823 VF-20 with double profile; 1857-S EF-40, dark gray toning. (Total: 2 pieces)

1170 **1824 O-105** (irregular date, 4 low; 50C wide with a large C). **MS-65**, **Choice Uncirculated**, glittering brilliance with rich antique gold toning developing in places. Excellent quality lustre and strike, and only the faintest signs of ever having been in a mint sack. A sensational type coin which will probably provoke a bidding war; it could be a runaway.

Note: This piece is from our Getty Sale (a nearly complete variety collection of capped bust halves in top condition), Lot 833 and brought \$700 back in 1977 at a time when run-of-the-mill Uncs. (with the usual friction on the bust) were bringing less than \$200 each. More recently, the gem Garrett Collection piece, also an O-105, was bid up to \$5500 in November, 1979.





2161 **1851 Cent. J-129.** Perforated ring cent struck in copper. (R-7). Lightly cleaned **Proof** with red-gold toning. A continuation of attempts started in 1850 to produce a ring cent. Specimens from these dies are known in billon (10 percent silver, 90 percent copper), copper, copper-nickel, or pure nickel, the latter two being restrikes and normally unperforated. The ring cent idea was dropped because of the difficulty of ejecting the coins from the press after they had been stamped.



- 2162 **1859 Cent. J-228.** Regular obverse for the 1859 cent; reverse later adopted in 1860 with narrow shield at top of wreath. Very popular as a transitional issue. Copper-nickel, business strike, as usual. Dull gray **Uncirculated.**
- 2163 **1859 Half dollar. J-241.** The Longacre design. Silver. (R-4). **Proof**, cleaned, retoned blue about the rims. Some slide marks on the face of Ms. Liberty.
- 2164 1859 Half dollar. J-241, as above. Impaired Proof, mirror surfaces dulled from an old cleaning, has since retoned to a mottled pinkish gray with a few obverse tarnish spots. About equal to the preceding overall.



2165 **1862 \$10. J-298**, copper, R-3. Dulled Proof, mostly a khaki green with hints of rose at the center of the obverse.



2166 **1868 5C nickel. J-633 (R-4).** Head of the regular 3 cent nickel with star on coronet; V in laurel wreath with scroll at top. Struck in regular copper-nickel (Judd states nickel). **Proof**, some brilliance with light streaking common to coins in nickel alloys.



2167 **1869 25C. J-733.** Silver, reeded edge. (R-5). The Standard Silver type. **Pinkish gray Proof**, mostly choice. The patchwork of lines in the fields are raised and were on the dies; ditto for the heavy lines on face and neck. As far as we are aware, all specimens of J-733 have them, as well as many other patterns of this year. From our Henry Clifford sale, Lot 2499.



2168 **1869 50C. J-742 (R-5).** Silver, reeded edge. The Standard Silver type. **Proof**, lightly cleaned, imparting light to moderate hairlines; mirror surfaces mostly intact. Reverse shows two tiny rust pits aligned vertically under D of STANDARD as well as the usual patchwork of raised lines common to proofs of this era. Also from our Clifford sale, Lot 2501.



2169 **1869 50C. J-742**, as above. Same reverse die with the two rust pits under D. **Proof**, cleaned like the last, hairlines a little more severe and mirror surface on reverse is partly dulled at right. From the 1966 NASC sale, Lot 211; marked "J-742a" but we have never heard of such a piece and wonder if the Judd listing is based on a cataloguing error by someone.



2170 **1870 10C. J-843 (R-6).** Silver, reeded edge. **Bluish gold Proof**, dies extensively rusted, especially the obverse, resulting in a semi-frosty, rather than a mirror surface. Few lintmarks on reverse, also as struck. Also from the Clifford sale, Lot 2498.



2171 **1870 25C. J-894.** Silver, reeded edge (R-6). **Brilliant Proof**, cleaned, starting to retone to a pale gold at the rims. Mirror surfaces mostly intact, though there is evidence of light hairlines.

Complete Set of Standard Silver Dimes Struck in Aluminum

The following set of nine pattern dimes in aluminum are from the Roy Harte Collection and represent a complete set of all nine types of Standard Silver dimes (3 types dated 1869; 6 more dated 1870), all struck in aluminum with plain edges. All are very rare (listed as R-6 in Judd but many are noticeably rarer than the silver impression from the same dies). The set would make a wonderful display, and although we list each piece individually, we would encourage the serious collector to try to obtain all nine pieces, thus keeping the set intact.

The Standard Silver series forms one of the most remarkable series of patterns issued by the mint. At the time, 1869, essentially no regular U.S. coins were in circulation due to the suspension of specie payments by the banks during the Civil War and the resulting depreciation of greenbacks relative to gold or silver. Thus silver coins were worth more than face as bullion, if melted and converted into greenbacks. Thus the regular silver coins were hoarded, melted and exported, and small change was accomplished mainly using fractional currency notes. The Standard Silver coins were designed to be purposefully lightweight in order that they might stay in circulation, the reduced weight exactly compensating for the percent depreciation of greenbacks. They were to be struck in the same silver alloy (900 fine) as regular U.S. coins, hence the legend STANDARD SILVER appearing on the coins. William Barber made all of the dies, copying earlier designs by Longacre. The mint struck and sold these to coin collectors, and the pieces must have been popular as they were struck in a bewildering number of types and varieties. Nine piece sets (three designs for each of the three denominations, 10C, 25C, 50C) were sold directly at the mint for \$15 per set (face value: \$2.55) and collectors could order sets in copper, silver, or aluminum, with plain or reeded edges. Thus in 1869 alone a total of six different such sets could be assembled for a remarkable total of 54 coins.

In 1870, Standard Silver coins were issued again in even more varieties as two different reverse types were made. This in combination with the three different obverse styles, resulted in six different types for each denomination. Each design type, in turn, was in six different fabrics: silver, copper, aluminum, with plain or reeded edges.

For the half dollar, a total of nine different types were issued, each in six different sub-varieties as before (this counts only the regular issues and ignores obvious mules and restrikes that would swell the number of varieties even further). Thus a total of 126 different pieces exists for the 1870 series, which when combined with the 1869 total yields a staggering 180 different Standard Silver coins of the regular types, all dated 1869 or 1870! One cannot fail to be impressed with this when one realizes that Judd lists a total of 665 different patterns of all types through 1868, so that the Standard Silver productions of 1869-70 totalled nearly 25 percent of all patterns produced at the mint from 1792 to 1868!

Looking at this in a different way, we can see that a total of 54 different Standard Silver dimes were produced, dated 1869-70. A full set of 54 pieces would probably be possible to assemble in principle, as there are no super-rarities, but we would guess that such a project would prove to be surprisingly challenging and would probably take several years to complete (this of course is what coin collecting on an advanced level is all about). The present selection of 9 pieces in aluminum is complete in type and would also make a fine start on a complete variety set of 54 pieces, which to our knowledge has never been completed in the history of numismatics!



2172 1869 10C. J-701, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Liberty cap of Longacre type with stars and motto on scroll below; usual Standard Silver reverse (identifiable by two heavy die-scratches at E in SILVER). Brilliant Gem Proof, as fine as when issued. Usual evidence of die rust, lines on die and tiny lintmarks, and not perfectly centered with some weaknesses at rims.



2173 **1869 10C. J-707**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Liberty wearing a diadem with plain ribbon; reverse die of last. **Brilliant Proof**, not as choice as last, tarnish spot at obverse rim and a couple of tiny reverse corrosion spots common on aluminum coins; lintmark through S of SILVER. Obverse die is heavily rusted.



2174 **1869 10C. J-713**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Coronet with one star; reverse die same as last two. **Brilliant Gem Proof**, as fine as when issued. With a fantastic wire rim at top of obverse (metal squeezed out between lip of die and edge collar); thickness of coin is nearly doubled in this area. Definitely struck after the last two, as the reverse die has now developed a prominent pair of rust pits just before S in SILVER.



2175 **1870 10C. J-842**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Liberty head with cap, the identical obverse die used on J-701 of 1869 (rust pit in field below R in AMERICA, faint die scratches under eye). Reverse different from the 1869 type, wreath of cotton and corn with the single word STANDARD above (by now the main purpose of these coins must have been to sell to collectors, and fully two-thirds of them were struck in metals other than silver). **Brilliant Gem Proof**, very minor streaking at lower obverse, otherwise as fine as when issued. Not fully brought up at the rims.



2176 **1870 10C. J-848**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Liberty wearing a diadem, the identical die used on J-707 of 1869 (faint die scatch from tip of chin, another vertical one in field behind hair knot). Reverse die same as last. **Brilliant Gem Proof**, pristine. Obverse die heavily rusted, as on J-707.



2177 **1870 10C. J-854**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Coronet with one star, the identical die used on J-713 of 1869 (prominent diagonal diescratch through ITED). Reverse die as on the last two. **Brilliant Gem Proof**, few microscopic planchet irregularities but as nice as when struck.



2178 **1870 10C. J-860**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Obverse die of J-842 and J-701 of 1869 (described above); new reverse die like that used in 1869, STANDARD SILVER spelled out in full above wreath. **Brilliant Gem Proof**, pristine, unusually brilliant for aluminum patterns, especially for this period.



2179 **1870 10C. J-866**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Obverse die of J-848 and J-707 of 1869, similarly rusted; same reverse die as on last with tiny rust pit at S of STANDARD. **Brilliant Proof**, almost a gem, few tiny tarnish spots on rim, and reverse is ever so slightly cloudy, but this is barely noticeable.



2180 **1870 10C. J-872**, aluminum, plain edge. R-6. Obverse die of J-854 and J-713 of 1869 (described above); reverse of last two with a few more rust pits. **Brilliant Gem Proof**, as fine as they come.



2181 **1871 10C. J-1086**, aluminum, reeded edge. R-7. The Longacre Indian Princess design as copied by William Barber; regular dime reverse die. **Brilliant Proof**, few faint hairlines. A rare one and intensely popular as a Longacre seated princess pattern.

Note: Here is another pattern design that could be used to form a fantastic collection. In the 1871 dimes alone there are four different design types, with each of these struck in silver, copper, and aluminum for a total of 12 pieces (plus J-1083 in nickel making a total of 13). If one broadened the collection to include the similar half dimes, quarters, half dollars, silver dollars, and commercial dollars, one could build a set containing well over 100 pieces. Needless to say a set like this (which would take years to assemble) would be one of the most remarkable ever formed in the history of numismatics. Of course, these patterns are not inexpensive, but we would guess that such a set could be put together for the same amount of money many investors spend on haphazard groups of overpriced, common coins. As for the investment potential, we would place our bets on the pattern set, especially if the group were later sold intact at a major auction.



2182 1878 Metric dollar. J-1564. R-7. Silver, weight 219.6 grains (standard for the goloid pieces is 14.25 grams or 219.9 grains). Proof, with light toning at the rims, mostly choice, though with slight evidence of prior cleaning. Raised die rust pits on both sides, indicating that this is a restrike, but it is not markedly underweight. A rare pattern, very much undervalued when compared to the common 1879 goloid metrics.

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2183 **1879 Dollar. J-1612 (R-7).** The regular Morgan obverse; Barber's standing eagle reverse without the motto. Copper. **Proof**, cleaned, retoning a pale green at the rims, has acquired some fingerprints in the obverse field. Very rare, as are all Morgan 1879 pattern dollars, there being three different types, each struck in silver and copper for a total of six varieties; all these are listed in Judd as R-7. Some were issued in sets, but only three such sets were known to David Proskey at the time of the Woodside sale in 1892. Records to \$2800 for this pattern as far back as 1976.



2184 **1879** Metric dollar. J-1619, struck in copper. R-7. Sunset toned **Proof**, moderately reflective. Really rare in comparison to both of the silver alloy strikes from these dies (J-1617, J-1618) of which more than 1000 pieces exist, due to extensive restriking. The copper impressions do not exhibit die rust seen on the silver restrikes, and probably were never restruck.



2185 **1879 Goloid metric dollar. J-1626.** Goloid, 217.0 grains (standard is 14 grams or 216 grains). No die rust, no flan striations, undoubtedly an original. Listed as R-6 but we have seen too many for that level, perhaps R-3 and often confused with J-1627. EF, slight wear (carried as a pocket piece?), cleaned, about 50 percent of the mirror surfaces survive.





Order of Leopold (Leopoldsorden) circa 1915. Werlich 120, civil 3004 type. Established by Emperor Franz I of Austria on January 7, 1808, in memory of his father, Emperor Leopold II, as an award for civil and military merit. The dark red enamelled cross has white borders edged in gold, while the center medallion is red and portrays the gold initials of Franz surrounded by a gold-rimmed white band on which is inscribed in gold the Latin words INTEGRITATI ET MERITO (Integrity and Merit). The reverse of the medallion, on a white enamelled background, has the inscription OPES REGUM CORDA SUB-DITO RUM (The Power of the King Rests on the Heart of the People). The cross is suspended from a gold and red Imperial crown. Undoubtedly a World War I era issue since two laurel sprays in pale green were added under the crown. Red and white ribbon. 




Great Britain

The outstanding grouping of Great Britain orders and campaign medals is almost as comprehensive as that in our Springfield II Sale in 1981. This group includes important orders, starting with the Order of the Bath, many Victorian campaign medals, plus badges and military patches. Now on with the show.



3129 The Most Honorable Order of the Bath, apparently the Military Division (G.C.B.) star, no ribbon. Instituted in 1725, expanded to include Civil awards in 1815, all were issued in pure gold prior to 1887. This star hanger appears to be gilt on silver with appropriate enamelling in blue, white, red, and green and closely follows the illustration of Joslin 4i, Dorling 10 and Werlich Fig. 570. This star (military) is gold rimmed, white enamel, eight-pointed cross; each point tipped with a gold ball. Within each of the four arms of the cross appears a gold lion. Center medallion consists of three gold crowns separated by a Rose, Thistle, and a Shamrock; surrounded by a red enamel band with the motto "TRIA JUNCTA IN UNO" (Three united in one) in gold letters, in turn surrounded by a green enamel laurel wreath. Below this is a blue enamel scroll with the words "ICH DIEN" (I serve).

The conferees of this order, the Knight Grand Cross, have the 4th highest award from the King. It weighs 481 grains, has a hallmark "IE" on the loop suspender holder and has the slightest enamel irregularity at two points on the white background. It has no ribbons attached, a situation that can be remedied by the new owner. Overall Extremely Fine and important. (\$1250-1500)



3130 Miniature of the Order of the Bath, Military Companion order and close copy of the larger original in gilt on silver with full enamelling. This piece lacks the detail of the original, with a short maroon ribbon. It measures 31 x 31 mm. with a few minor enamel nicks and grades almost Extremely Fine. (\$35-60)

3131 Order of St. Michael and St. George, Companion (C.M.G.) on suspender bar. This order, established in 1818, in badge form is limited to 1435 gentlemen. Foreigners can be admitted on an honorary basis. Listed as Werlich Fig. 579, Dorling 13 and Joslin 5i. It consists of a seven rayed, fourteen-pointed, gold edged, white enamel star. The center medallion portrays in natural colors, the Archangel St. Michael trampling Satan, surrounded by a blue band with the inscription in gold. "AUSPICIUM MELIORIS AEVI" (Omen of a better time). Reverse portrays St. George on horseback killing the dragon in natural colors surrounded by the same inscription as the obverse. The badge is suspended from a gold crown attached to a blue ribbon with center red stripe with central pin attachment. In superb condition, enamel perfect, little wear on moire ribbon. About Uncirculated. (\$300-400) 3133 Hanover-Waterloo 1815 silver medal, 34 mm. Dorling 66, Joslin 89h. Allied Hanover with laureate bust of "Georg Prinz Regent." Reverse is rather weakly struck. Edge inscription "HUSAR HEINRICH JAHNS. HUS. RGT. BREMEN...VEROEN." Important medal issued to a German fighting on the British side. Superficially the medal looks British but undoubtedly German made. Light lilac and maroon ribbon. About Fine. (\$80-125)



3134 Naval General Service medal, dated 1848. Joslin 86t with bar for "SYRIA" fleet encounter of November, 1840. Crowned Victoria portrait, reverse Britannia trident riding the waves. In silver, 36 mm. engraved by W. Wyon. Edge apparently renamed, reading "D. Holliday A.B." Has white ribbon with black edge stripes, and attached bar reading "Syria." Medal is About Uncirculated, ribbon near perfect. (\$300-350)



3132 The Distinguished Service Order (D.S.O.) established by Queen Victoria in 1886. Over 9,000 were awarded during World War I, but with tightened criteria for the award only 4,880 were issued during WW II. Listed as Werlich 594, Dorling 22, and Joslin 27d. A heavy gilt on silver cross, with white enamel predominate. Badge is in excellent condition, no enamel damage, but upper ribbon bar and ribbon missing which can be replaced. Choice Extremely Fine and very scarce. (\$400-500)



3135 Jellalabad medal, mural crown type minted in Calcutta, 1842. Gordon 48, Joslin 93a. Dated "VII April 1842" in silver, with simple suspender and short multicolored ribbon. Sutton.H.M.S.Edinburgh", also by L. C. Wyon. Golden ribbon with blue edge stripes. Medal nicely toned, Extremely Fine. (\$90-130)
- 3140 Turkish Crimean War, 1855. Joslin 103e also in silver, 35 mm. made in many variations. Sultan's Toughra within ornate wreath, reverse flags above cannon, "La Crimea 1855." This is the Sardinian type. Edge inscription, "2657 T. Williams 19th Regt." Pink ribbon with two green edge stripes. Medal Fine to Very Fine toned, ribbon slight fraying at top. (\$50-75)





The cross features 20 gold-rimmed white enamelled rays of descending length inward. The center of the medallion consists of an eight-pointed silver mirror on blue enamel background surrounded by a gold border. Encircling this is an irregular collar of 16 rubies, eight small eight large. This decoration is symbolic of two of the treasures bequeathed by the first Emperor of Japan (Jimmu) to his successor: a mirror (center), and the sacred beads. 




Order of African Redemption Badge, 1st Class. Werlich 852. First 3249 founded in 1879 as the Order of African Liberation, the name was changed in 1897 to the Order of African Redemption, the specimen is circa 1900-1910. A quite large handsome medal in silver gilt, it has a five-pointed, gold-rimmed, white enamel star with a gold ball on the tip of each ray. Between each ray of the star are gold flames, Center medallion portrays a colored man and woman on their knees praying to a cross surrounded by a gold band containing green laurel leaves with red enamel berries. This specimen appears to have much larger leaves than the Werlich description. Reverse of medallion portrays in full color the Liberian Coat of Arms which includes a schooner under full sail, a rising sun and a bird in flight. The medallion is surrounded by a blue enamel band with the motto "THE LOVE OF LIBERTY BROUGHT US HERE." Entire badge is suspended from a green and gold laurel wreath, with an oval gold hanger above. No ribbon. The badge superficially resembles the seal of the Anti-Slavery Society of London, but there are no chains on the arms. Prince Johann II, 50th anniversary of his reign in 1908. Bronze medal,

Malta



The (Badge) Order of Malta, the oldest order of Knighthood con-3251 tinually in existence. The Catholic Order of Malta was founded in the 12th century, and the badge described here is the non-Bohemian and Austrian type as shown in Werlich Fig. 899. However, the hanger part of the badge above the crown is a close copy of the hanger part of Werlich Fig. 900. This issue is the one for Knights of Justice and Knights of Honor and Devotion, and since the former category is a very limited one, the badge is undoubtedly for Knights of Honor and Devotion. As the oldest and certainly one of the most prestigious of orders, the appearance of a Order of Malta is a noteworthy event. 





Medals and Tokens Portraying Adolf Hitler

The World War II Memento Collection of John Ford Jr.

Erstwhile Sergeant Ford commenced collecting Hitler medallic memorabilia while serving with the United States Army in Europe, 1944-46, during World War II. The first four medals acquired for his collection came from the Braun House in Munich where NSDAP (Nazi) party meetings were held, and where Hitler maintained living quarters. These are all in silver, each is 36 mm. in size, and all were found in their original white presentation boxes. Listed in the recently published *Medallic Portraits of Adolf Hitler*, by R. W. Colbert and W. D. Hyder (TAMS, 1981) as No. C-30, C-115, C-116 and C-117 (and offered as Lots 3394, 3452, 3453, and 3455 of the present offering), three originated at the Prussian State Mint in Berlin, and one at the Vienna Mint. (Researchers Colbert & Hyder did not know of C-115 in silver, listing it only in copper.)

Although detached for temporary duty about Europe (during and after VE-Day), Ford's basic assignment was to the Communications Center of ETOUSA (Theater) Headquarters, located in Paris. Upon his return there, early in the

summer of 1945, with his newly developed numismatic interest in Hitleriana, Sgt. Ford found himself spending a great deal of his free time adding to his modest collection. New additions were invariably obtained from GI's on leave to the French capital from the recently conquered (and systematically pillaged) Third Reich. Upon his reversion to civilian life, early in 1946, John Ford returned to his previous job (left in December, 1942) at the New York City family numismatic firm of Stack's. The Stack's street level store on West 46th Street in the Spring of 1946 was a literal bee hive of activity. A constant stream of returning soldiers, fresh from Europe, brought in all types of material for sale, some of which was not particularly numismatic. Huge Nazi battle flags, German naval binoculars, antique pistols, autographed copies of "Mein Kampf," and even Mussolini's party membership card, his tasseled hat, and violin, among other items, found their way to the Stack's establishment.

Joe and Morton Stack both took kindly to their employee's newly acquired interest, making sure that the former sergeant had his pick of any Hitler portrait material that came in over the counter. Many pieces were sold to him at house cost, others were outright gifts. Before leaving Stack's for college in the fall of 1946, John J. Ford, Jr. had greatly enlarged his holdings. Many medallic souvenirs of the late, unlamented Fuhrer, some of great rarity, were obtained in that six month period. It is believed that at least one of the gold medals purchased at that time may well turn out to be unique.

Collector Ford continued to pick-up Hitler portrait medals and tokens as time and opportunity permitted, particularly after he joined forces with Charles Wormser in the operation of New Netherlands Coin Co. in 1951. Many pieces were obtained abroad, some at continental auction sales, others by direct purchase. A number of fine and important medals were obtained directly from the cabinets of famed medallist Karl Goetz of Munich, as a result of correspondence with his son, Guido Goetz. The last piece added to the Ford collection came from New Jersey dealer Charles McSorley in 1964, shortly prior to the ANA Convention gathering in Cleveland. As John Ford puts it, "My interest gradually waned as the years came and went, separating me from the memories of my service in World War II. Fewer pieces of interest appeared, and without any kind of a book on the subject, it got to a point where I was not sure of what I already had." According to Colbert & Hyder, the first Hitler portrait medal appeared in 1923, the last in 1942; a period of nineteen years. Coincidently, John Ford commenced his collection in 1945, adding to it until 1964, also a period of nineteen years!

Our consignor has disposed of just about all his non (North and South) American material in recent years. A number of his foreign coins and medals have appeared in various auction offerings, including our own 1981 ANA sale. John Ford has told us that his Hitler portrait medals and tokens are about the last to go, "mainly because I was awaiting the publication of a text on the subject, but also because the collection represented in tangible form a period of my life which comprised my modest contribution to the destruction of that tyranny which inspired them." Long time dealer - collector Ford adds: "As an intermittant numismatic historian, I have long considered the contents of my Hitler collection to be important historical artifacts, well worthy of scrutiny and careful study." To this we can only add the words of authors Colbert and Hyder, as expressed in the preface of their recently published reference: "Were we to shun any area of study, no matter how insignificant, merely because of our negative emotional reactions to it, we would be guilty of the same errors that contributed to the ultimate destruction of Adolf Hitler and the National Socialist state. Instead, we would hope that the objects represented within this work would be collected and studied for what they are — physical documents of a very real period in the history of mankind."

Hitler Medals

As stated in the introduction to this series by John J. Ford, Ir, the collecting of the medallic productions of Adolph Hitler must be viewed from the strict historical perspective. Regardless of ones feelings towards the man himself, one cannot deny that he existed, and that historically important medallic relics do exist depicting his life and times. In the past decade, the literature relating to Adolph Hitler medals has matured, culminating in the publication by The Token and Medal Society in 1981 of R.W. Colbert and William D. Hyder's book Medallic Portraits of Adolf Hitler. This book, little more than a year old was the state of art at that time. With the public offering of the Ford collection of Hitler medals in the following lots, well over three dozen completely unpublished medals are offered. In addition, a number of medals never seen by the authors are offered, where new details are gleaned from the actual specimens — not just from reported descriptions.

The medals offered herewith are either fully described by Colbert and Hyder, or completely described herewith if published for the first time. The arrangement follows that of C & H, dated medals first, C-1 to C-127, pinbacks from C-200 to C-231, plaques from C-300 to C-364, and noncontemporary issues from C-400 to C-411. The newly reported pieces are inserted in the approximate correct position they would lie by the date or approximate date of issue. No attempt to give the new pieces pseudo C & H numbers is made. The metallic composition of a number of the pieces is open for discussion, and new information from the Ford collection is stated. The edge markings of the medals is quite important, as outlined in Colbert & Hyder on page 37, and edge types are reported for all pieces.

It is our sincere hope that this catalogue listing plus the Colbert & Hyder book will bring this series even more up to date as of this time.



3375 **The Hittler (sic) Putsch (Hitler Revolt) of Nov. 8, 1923.** C&H C-1. This 60 mm. bronzecast medal by famous Munich medallist Karl Goetz portrays Hitler as both a criminal and a clown. The November, 1923 Putsch was Hitler's first attempt at national recognition, but resulted in his arrest — the die was cast. It is especially interesting to note the semi-satirical nature of this medal, especially the deliberate (?) misspelling of Hitler. An important and rare piece. Edge "K. GOETZ" incuse. 3376 Unpublished ceramic or porcelain piece, dated 1924. Not in C&H. Facing bust of distinguished appearing Hitler. Above, "* UNSER ADOLF HITLER *", below "1924". Reverse ten line inscription, "JCH/ FUHLE MICH ALS/BESTER DEUTSCHER, DER/DAS BESTE FUR DAS DEUTSCHE / VOLK GEWOLLT HAT. / TAU-SEND NATIONALE / HABEN DAS RECHT, EINER / MEHRHEIT GEGENUBER, / DIE NATION ZU / VERTRETEN." (I feel that I am the best German who wants the best for the German people. A thousand patriots have the right of the majority to represent the nation.) Red-brown in color, 42.5 mm. February 6, 1960 at \$95, a high price for the time. It is clearly contemporary, has edge E (PREUSS. STAATSMUENZE GOLD 18 KAR), type II(4). It weighs 100.3 grains with a slightly matte surface, with the edges highly polished. It should be that a standard German 20 Mark piece weighs 122.9 grains., so this piece is woefully underweight if conceivably it is a pattern. Reverse pascal lamb to left, standing upon grassy knoll, holding staff bearing cross inscribed banner, around, "GEWIDMET VON DER FLEISCHERIN-NUNG ZU DRESDEN *" (Dedicated by the Butcher's Guild of Dresden). Struck in copper-plated bronze, 80 mm. weighing 4090.5 grains. Certainly the most intriguing piece in the collection, the interpretation of the inscriptions and devices can lead to much speculation. This only known specimen was bought over the counter by J. B. Stack in 1946 or 47. J. B. Stack held onto the piece for about 8 years as he was intrigued by it, and eventually it was acquired by the consignor as part of a complex trade. Uncirculated, but lamb has slight rub on highest point. Of the utmost historical importance. (\$700-900)



Completely unpublished 1933 piece, head right, reverse unin-3404 scribed wreath. Early bust of Hitler right in SA uniform. Around, ".30.1.1933. ADOLF HITLER." Very wide plain rim on obverse. Reverse is a closed oak wreath, tied with bow at base. Uninscribed, with space at center for engraving, somewhat similar to C&H C-44. Gilt bronze, 50 mm. edge plain. Uncirculated and obviously very rare. (\$75-150)



3405 Unpublished metal dated 1933, gold, listed in C&H as C-32 only from rubbing. This piece has engraver's name at lower edge, not mentioned by C&H, "OERTEL BERLIN." Edge marked, "GOLD 900" or slightly over 21K gold, Type II(4). Has slight matte surface, weight 349.9 grns. In square black box, with purple velvet lining. Obtained from German dealer Gaettens about 1957 who stated it was unique. Uncirculated, 35 mm. and excessively rare. (Total: 1 medal, 1 box)

3406 Same medal as preceding in silver, C&H C-32. This piece also has maker's name on obverse, not mentioned by C&H. Edge stamped "SILBER 835", Type II(4). Matte finish, 35 mm. Extremely Fine. Estimate (\$125-175)



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3407 Unpublished medal, similar to preceding lot, C&H C-32, but larger 40 mm. in silver. More of the lower part of the bust is visible, with signature, "OERTEL BERLIN." Reverse lettering same as C-32, but larger. Edge marked, "SILBER 935," Type II(5). Toned About Uncirculated and obviously very rare. (\$250-350)



- 3408 Completely unpublished large medal of Hitler, January 1, 1933. Unlike any piece shown in C&H but obverse bust resembles design of C&H 41, which is 39.5 mm. Obverse bust of Hitler left in SA uniform, around, "REICHSKANZLER ADOLF HITLER." Reverse is blank, with upset rim, engraved in large letters in center "30.1.1933." Medium brown bronze, 106 mm. Uncirculated. Ex German dealer Gaettens, Munich circa 1957-8 for \$60, ticket enclosed. (\$225-275)
- 3409 Busts of Hitler and Hindenberg in bronze 36 mm. C&H 33. Clearly an original, edge is plain. Medium bronze, Uncirculated. (\$35-50)
- 3410 Goetz medal for March 5, 1933 in bronze, 60 mm. C&H C-34, Kienast 483. Edge marked "H", Type I(1) in Choice Uncirculated. Ex Guido Goetz, December, 1959 at 50 D.M. (\$225-350)



- 3411 Smaller Goetz medal, like C&H C-34, Kienast 483 but in gold. Identical to preceding design but 36 mm. in gold. Edge H with addition of "(period within O) 985." Type II(4). Matte surface, thin, weighs 337.5 grains. Over 22 K pure gold. Originally in box, but box damaged and destroyed. Lovely Uncirculated and excessively rare. *Ex Stack's, New York in 1946 at unheard of price of \$100.* (\$800-1000)
- 3412Identical to preceding lot, C&H 34, in 36 mm. silver. Edge G, Type
I(1) in matte finish. About Uncirculated.(\$125-200)
- 3413 Similar to preceding lot, C&H 34, but 22.5 mm. in silver. Edge G, Type I(1) in partial matte finish. Has original ring and loop attached (C&H's locket note?), Extremely Fine or better. (\$100-150)
- 3414 Large 108.5 mm. Goetz bronze medal, C&H C-36. Kienast 493. The Potsdam medal of March 21, 1933 showing Hindenburg and Hitler shaking hands. Edge stamped, "K.GOETZ," in Choice Uncirculated. *Ex Guido Goetz, November 18, 1958.* (\$300-400)
- 3415 Similar to preceding lot struck in silver, 60 mm., C&H C-36, Kienast 493. Edge G, Type I(1). Dull finish, choice Uncirculated. All of these larger medals in silver must be extremely rare due to the scarity of precious metals in Europe during World War II. (\$275-350)
- 3416 Similar to preceding lot struck in bronze, 60 mm., C&H C-36. Edge J (BAYFR (sic) HAUPTMUNZAMT), Type I (1). Yellow bronze, Uncirculated. (\$150-250)



3417 Listed as C&H C-38 showing conjoined busts of Hitler and Hindenburg, but only illustrated from a rubbing. The notable addition to the description of the piece is the initials of the maker "F.H." at the junction of the busts, not mentioned by C&H. F.H. is noted as occurring on two other medals by C&H, C-91 and C-339, but he remains unidentified. In addition, this medal does not show the rectangular stamp on the right reverse, possibly indicating a restrike. This metal has a completely unlisted major edge Type, not included on p. 37 in C&H. This Saxony Mint is the other official German mint in addition to Berlin (Prussia), Munich (Bavaria), and Vienna. It reads "SACHS.MUNZE (O with period inside) 999 f." and should be added to the standard listing of edges in a new edition. About Uncirculated, 45 mm. and important. (\$350-500) 3418 Awakening of the Nation, March 21, 1933, C&H C-39. Listed by C&H as silvered bronze, this piece may well be pure silver, but we are conservatively calling it silvered. Weight is 307.2 grains., in very high relief, 34 mm. and in Extremely Fine with some mottled toning. Estimate (\$100-135)



- 3419 **Unpublished medal, with obverse similar to C&H C-41.** The obverse is almost identical to C-41, with Hitler left, around, "REICHSKANZLER ADOLF HITLER." The reverse is an uninscribed wreath of oak leaves, with bow at bottom, with plain center. Possibly made as a rifle club "Exaltation" medal, with the reverse to be engraved. In gilt bronze, edge plain, 40 mm. Uncirculated with slightest rub on cheek. Certainly extremely rare. (\$75-110)
- Rifle Club for Munich for National Exaltation on August 27 through September 10, 1933, C&H C-45 in silver. Edge is plain. An important shooting medal by G. Weber, in 40 mm. size. Matte surface, About Uncirculated. (\$225-300)
- 3421 Medal issued November 12, 1933 honoring Hitler, C&H C-47. Struck in bronze, 36 mm. it features the first medallion head of Hitler, and is attractive. Edge D, Type II(4), an uncommon edge marking. Medium brown bronze, Uncirculated. (\$100-125)



 3422 Completely unpublished issue for Potsdam March 21, 1933. Obverse has two small facing busts of Hitler and Hindenburg in field, tower in center. Crossed flags, laurel branches below. Around, "REICHSKANZLER ADOLF HITLER REICHSPRASIDENT v.HINDENBURG / POTSDAM 21.3.1933." The reverse, although smaller is very similar to C&H C-55, but stamped in small numbers "990". Struck in silver, 40 mm. by B. H. Mayer of Pforzheim, whose initials appear below the leaves on the obverse, weight 307.7 grains. Edge is plain, Choice About Uncirculated. Again an uncommonly rare medal of great importance. (\$300-350)



3423 Still another completely unpublished medal, but utilizing dies similar to listed ones. Obverse is apparently identical to C-218, a plaque, with Hitler left, around, ".WER LEBEN WILL DER KAMPFE." Below, "ADOLF HITLER". The translation differs slightly from C&H, (Who Wants to Live will Fight) using 'wants' rather than 'wishes'. The reverse is identical to C&H C-58, but in a larger size, 51 mm. Thin, plain edge, but lower reverse is stamped "990" indicating nearly pure silver. Undoubtedly by B. H. Mayer of Pforzheim. Dull finish silver, About Uncirculated. Once again excessively rare and desirable. (\$175-250)



- 3424 Another unpublished medal, identical in design to C&H C-58, but in bronze, 51 mm. This piece is identical to C-58, but larger and struck in solid bronze. The initials, "BHM" for B. H. Mayer are prominent below the bust. In light brown bronze, with plain edge and About Uncirculated. Still another major rarity. (\$125-175)
- 3425 Regular C&H C-58 medal, struck in base metal as noted by C&H, but we are uncertain if it was ever silver washed. Material appears to be a zinc alloy. By B. H. Mayer, 41 mm. Some streakiness on obverse due to alloy, About Uncirculated. (\$60-90)
- 3426 Winter Relief Work medal of 1933/34, C&H C-60, struck in bronze with a copper plating. C&H note that the script signature in the center of the reverse, reads as "MEBELHRES" may be incorrect, but it appears to be correct by the observer. Extremely Fine or better, 35 mm. (\$50-70)
- 3427 Large bronze, 127 mm. (note again difference from C&H size) medal by K. Goetz, January 30, 1934. Listed as C&H C-62, Kienast 494. Edge plain. Uncirculated. A magnificent showpiece medal weighing almost 2 pounds. Ex E. Button, Frankfurter Munzhandlung circa 1959. Estimate (\$275-375)
- 3428 Same design as preceding lot, but reduced size 60 mm. listed as C&H C-62, Kienast 494 in yellow bronze. Another Goetz production, with edge H, Type II(4). Actually the edge stamp bearly shows BAYER, but it is there. Nice Uncirculated. (\$200-275)

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- 3429 Same design as preceding lot, but in reduced size of 36 mm., C&H C-62. Actually, C&H probably never saw this, but inferred its existance from Kienast. Yellow bronze, edge G, Type II(4) in Choice About Uncirculated and obviously quite rare. Ex E. Button, Frankfurter Munzhandlung circa 1960. (\$120-150)
- Identical to preceding lot, but struck in zinc, 36 mm. Edge H, Type II(4) and actually quite an attractive medal for one struck in zinc. C&H C-62. About Uncirculated. (\$80-135)



3431 Still another completely unpublished 1934 medal, completely unlike any shown in C&H. Bust of Hitler right, incuse around, "ADOLF HITLER MCMXXXIV". Beneath the bust, also incuse initials "LE", an unidentified engraver. Reverse saint on horseback right (nimbus or halo above head), also signed, "LE". In bronze, 34 mm. unusual and quite different from other types. Appears to be a fine art casting, Extremely Fine. Obviously excessively rare. (\$75-100)



Completely unpublished Hitler Dog Exhibit medal, 60 mm. 1934. Unlike any medal in C&H. Large head of Hitler to right, above, "ADOLF HITLER." Raised initials "A" and "J" near border, divided by point of bust. Reverse stylized oak leaf designs at top and bottom, center engraved (or incuse die stamping), "JUB.-HUNDE- (Jubilee Dog) / AUSSTELLUNG (Exhibit) / MAINZ 1934." Bronze, 60 mm. Edge stamped "WIEDMANN, FRKF.aM." (the die sinking firm of E. Ferd. Wiedmann, Frankfurt am Main). The engraver, "A. J." remains unidentified. Medium yellow bronze, About Uncirculated. Obviously very rare and unpublished. (\$175-250)



3433 Nurnberg, September, 1935 C&H C-84 in unpublished silver. This piece with full faced Hitler has unusual design of two soldiers jugate to Hitler at left and right, listed as C-84. For Party Day, September 10-16, 1935, by Richard Klein, manufactured by Deschler. Edge stamped, "900," the listed piece is struck only in base metal. 50 mm., Extremely Fine and very rare. (\$200-300)



3434 Another completely unpublished medal with high relief bust of Hitler to left. Bust left in civilian suit, above around, "REICHSKANZLER ADOLF HITLER" inside a continuous olive wreath. Reverse oak, olive branches in panel above center, below blank field for engraving. In silvered bronze, unsigned. Extremely Fine. 40 mm. Certainly extremely rare. (\$100-125)



3435 Another unpublished medal from the previously unreported Saxony Mint in silver. Finely executed bust of Hitler left, around above, "ADOLF HITLER." On truncation of bust signed "F.H." (Friedrich August Hutte of Dresden, Saxony). On reverse in three lines, "DU BIST NICHTS / DAS VOLK ISTALLES / (Swastika)," (You are nothing / the people are everything.) Struck in silver, 40 mm. Edge marked by stamping (as previously noted on Lot 3417) "SACHS.MUNZE 999 f." Choice About Uncirculated and extremely rare. Obtained with following lot in Germany in 1945. (\$300-400)



3436 Companion piece to Lot 3435, also unpublished, but with variant reverse. Same obverse as preceding, reverse reads "DU BIST NICHTS / DEIN VOLK IST ALLES / (Swastika)" (You are nothing/your people are everything). The difference between Lot 3435 is the changing of the word DAS (the) to DEIN (your) on this piece. One design was rejected, probably this one as Hitler (or a representative) might have objected to use of word "your", preferring the less personal "the". Silver, 40 mm. same edge "SACHS. MUNZE 999 f." Extremely Fine with few minor handling marks. Obtained by the consignor with Lot 3435, as a pair in Germany, 1945. (\$400-500)



3437 Still another unpublished piece, with obverse similar to C&H C-92, but larger. Obverse bust of Hitler three-quarters to right, around above, "REICHSKANZLER ADOLF HITLER" continuously above the head. Signed on obverse on lower bust, "OERTEL BERLIN." Bust shows more of shoulders than the smaller C-92. Reverse is an uninscribed oak wreath similar to C-92. Center of field is plain. Silver, edge stamped, "SILBER 835" (C-92 is marked "990"), 40 mm. and medal neatly looped. About Uncirculated and again extremely rare. (\$150-250)



- 3438 Another unpublished medal, similar to Lot 3437, but from different dies." The obverse of this medal is virtually identical to Lot 3437, but from different dies as it is smaller by a full millimeter. Lettering a little stronger, especially the "OERTEL" signature. Reverse similar to Lot 3437, but delicate (and thinner) oak wreath, open at top and tied with bow. Uninscribed in center. Struck in heavy gilt bronze, no edge markings, 39 mm. and Uncirculated. Once again extremely rare. (\$100-135)
- 3439 Medal for Peace Plan of March 31, 1936 by Karl Goetz in bronze, C&H C-93, Kienast 517. Another of the Goetz series in the struck 36 mm. size, yellow bronze. Edge H, Type II(4), Uncirculated. (\$90-150)



- 3440 Still another unpublished medal, with obverse bust similar in design to C&H C-98. Bust of Hitler facing left in SA uniform, tie loose as on 34 mm. C-98. No inscription. Reverse has two olive branches, almost devoid of leaves and berries at bases, tied with long, narrow ribbon, with blank central space for engraving. Undoubtedly intended to be an award medal. In gilt-bronze, edge plain, 50 mm. and previously unknown. Choice About Uncirculated and obviously rare. (\$75-150)
- 3441 Small Hitler medal, April 10, 1938 by A. Hartig in copper, C&H C-99. Obverse gives date March 13, 1938, the date of the Austrian "Anschluss" announcement. Only 23 mm. in size — the medal looks like a coin, but of course it isn't. Some mint red, AU. (\$50-65)



3442 Still another unpublished medal, uniface 60 mm. for the same rally as alluded to on previous Lot, C-99, in Vienna, March 13, 1938. High relief bust of Hitler to right, around above, "(Swastika)/ EIN VOLK — EIN REICH — EIN FUHRER (Swastika)," below, "WEIN AM 13. LENZMOND 1938." (One people-one country-one leader). In left field signed, "KARL PERL," another unreported engraver of Hitler medals. Struck in medium yellow bronze, uniface, 60 mm. with plain edge. EF and of course extremely rare. (\$125-200)

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- 3443 Another unpublished medal for the Austrian Anschluss, by Mayer with obverse of C&H C-54. Obverse bust of Hitler left, around "REICHKANZLER ADOLF HITLER," signed below bust, "BHM" (identical to obverse of C-54. Reverse full length male figure in native (Austrian?) costume waving large banner with Swastika. "13.MARZ / 1938" in right field. Around below, "EIN VOLK — EIN REICH - EIN FUHRER" as on previous two lots. Struck in bronze with dark gold finish, 41 mm, edge plain. By firm of B. H. Mayer of Pforzheim, portrait probably by Professor Rudolph Mayer of Karlsruhe. AU with a few spots on obverse and reverse due to finish breakdown. Important and extremely rare. (\$175-2.50)
- 3444 Uniface medal of Hitler, C&H C-102 engraved by A. Hartig. Only lettering is "ADOLF / HITLER" in field. Medium golden bronze, 60 mm. About Uncirculated. (\$120-175)
- 3445 Medal showing Mussolini and Hitler commemorating Rome and Berlin meetings of September, 1937 and May, 1938, C&H C-110. By F. Beyer, struck in silver with edge B, Type II(5). EF. (\$150-225)



Similar medal to preceding but by different unidentified engraver 3446 "KST", listed as C&H C-111. Struck in copper, plain edge, with full mint red, Uncirculated. In a near perfect light orange box with black velvet lining — all Hitler issues in the original box are rare.(Total: 1 medal, 1 box) (\$100-175)



3447 Completely unpublished medal for the Mussolini-Hitler meetings of 1937 and 1938. Obverse conjoined heads of Hitler (to left) and Mussolini (to right), above around, "ADOLF HITLER - BENITO MUSSOLINI." Reverse in center eagle on Swastika, fasces to right. Above, "September 1937 / Mai 1938." A most unusual piece, high relief struck in gilt-anodized aluminum, 40 mm. plain edge and About Uncirculated. Again, another extreme rarity. Price (\$90-150)

- 3448 Large Goetz medal, issued 1938 with the conjoined busts of Hitler, Mussolini, Chamberlain, and Daladier, listed as C&H 112 and Kienast 549. Medal cast in bronze measures 126 mm., and the size in C&H must be in error as they cite a previous report of 125 mm. Plain edge, Choice Uncirculated. Ex Guido Goetz, November, 1958. (\$300-450)
- 3449 Identical to the preceding medal, but in reduced size, 60 mm. struck in silver, C&H C-112, Kienast 549. Edge G, Type II(4), in Choice Uncirculated and a rare fabric. (\$225-275)
- 3450 Another medal referring to the Anschluss announcement of March 13, 1938 by Hanisch Concee, C&H C-113 struck in silver. A very low relief medal, 36 mm. with edge K, Type I(2). Extremely Fine with some rubs on high spots. (\$125-160)
- 3451 Same obverse as the preceding, reverse states the Greater German Empire is Arisen, C&H C-114. Also by Concee, struck in silver with different edge than noted in C&H. Edge reads, "MUNZAMT WIEN at 900" which is not listed with p. 37 types, Type II(5). 36 mm. Uncirculated with original finish. (\$125-150)



3452 Unlisted silver type of C&H C-39 dated September 29, 1939. This piece presumably came from Hitler's apartment, and was liberated in 1945 from the Braun Haus in Munich, along with three other medals, all in the same white, velvet lined boxes one of which is included with this medal. Edge type B, Type II(5), 36 mm. Very possibly this was specially struck for Hitler in silver and must be assumed to be excessively rare. Choice About Uncirculated. (Total: 1 piece, box)

- 3453 Silver medal dated 1939 by Concee (Austrian), listed as C&H C-116. This piece is one of the four found in the white boxes with velvet linings at the Braun Haus in Munich, 1945. Interestingly, the C&H plate shows a box, but it is not the same as the one here. Edge marked "MUNZAMT WIEN at 835" identical to the marking on Lot 3451, 36 mm. Uncirculated, and desirable due to the unusual pedigree. (Total: 1 medal, box) (\$200-275)
- 3454 Large medal for Hitler's 50th birthday, April 20, 1939 in silver, C&H C-117. This medal must have been struck in some quantity, as 3 different obverse dies are noted - this one being different from the C&H illustration. Silver was quite scarce in 1939 Germany, so very few of this large 60 mm. piece could have been struck in that fabric. Edge B, Type II(5). Toned Choice About Uncirculated. (\$250-350)
- 3455 Similar medal to preceding lot, but reduced size 36 mm. in silver, C&H 117. This medal, like the preceding Lots 3452 and 3453, is contained in one of the white, velvet lined boxes found at the Braun Haus in Munich in 1945. It has the edge B, Type II(4) and very likely belonged to Hitler personally. A most important historical piece in Choice Uncirculated. (Total: 1 piece, box) (\$175-225)
- 3456 Identical to the preceding lot in lovely light brown bronze, C&H C-117. The edge is plain and apparently the same die variety as Lot 3455. Choice Uncirculated. (\$90-125)




- 3457 Very large completely unpublished medal by G. Weber 1939. Obverse has head of Hitler left, above around ".FREUND-SCHAFTSFAHRT G.I.L. — HJ. 1939." (Friendship trip Fascist Youth Organizations? Hitler Youth 1939). Below, "ROM — BERLIN — ROM." Below head, G. Weber 39. Reverse has Swastika within a diamond emblem, fasces with shield and sword with no inscription.
- 3458 Porcelain medal of Hitler, April 20, 1939 for his 50th birthday, C&H
 C-118. In brown porcelain, 37 mm. made by Meissen Porcelain, about 200 to 500 struck according to Scheuch. About Uncirculated, but a slight edge irregularity as made. A specimen with a pin attached was sold in the Bowers & Ruddy Austin Sale as Lot 1560 in 1974. Ex H. Schulman Sale, Lot 651, April 4, 1959 at \$10. (\$175-225)
- 3459 Large Goetz medal of 1940 on formation of the second empire, C&H
 C-122, Kienast 578. Again, the size of the medal is 138 mm. confirming a list of 1941 cited by C&H, and not the reported 140 mm. Again an impressive large cast medal, quite rare in Choice Uncirculated. Ex
 Guido Goetz, November, 1958. (\$350-450)

Medal is in some type of plated zinc composition, but definitely struck, 80 mm. in moderately high relief. It is in a deluxe red fabricoid case, with black velvet lining. In the lid is "DESCHLER & SOHN / MUNCHEN." A most important and attractive piece in its original case. Choice Uncirculated. (Total: 1 medal, 1 box) (\$175-250)

- 3460 Same as preceding lot, but reduced size of 60 mm. listed as C&H C-122. This piece struck in silver is extremely rare, as all silver pieces had to have a like amount of silver coin deposited at the mint to replace that used. It has edge G, Type II(4) and probably not seen by C&H as they do not report this edge type. Again an exceptionally rare medal in nicely toned Choice Uncirculated. (\$400-550)
- 3461 Same as preceding lot, but in reduced size of 36 mm. also in exceptionally rare silver, C&H C-122. This piece has edge Type I, but has "f" instead of "FEIN", stamp style II (4). In Choice About Uncirculated and very rare. (\$250-325)





3462 Still another completely unpublished medal showing Hitler and Mussolini. Obverse conjoined bust of Mussolini (left) and Hitler (right) facing left, on truncation of busts is "M.u.W. St.", standing for firm of Mayer & Wilhelm of Stuttgart. Reverse has oblong panel (for engraving) with laurel branch at either side. Circa 1940, dark bronze, 40 mm. Obviously extremely rare. Choice Uncirculated. (\$100-125) Hitler Medals



3463 Again another completely unpublished Hitler and Mussolini medal, circa 1940. Obverse has conjoined heads right, with Hitler left and Mussolini right. Eagle above, fasces at right. Around above, "ADOLF HITLER.BENITO MUSSOLINI." Reverse has crossed pair of oak sprigs, Swastika in circle above, at top of reverse, blank space below for engraving. By B. H. Mayer, whose initials appear on obverse. Struck in bronze-plated base metal, 51 mm. and About Uncirculated. Again, exceptionally rare. (\$100-140)



3464 An unlisted (by C&H, but Kienast 576) Goetz medal for the surrender meeting in railroad car, June 21, 1940. This piece commemorating the French-German Armistice, shows Hitler as the figure standing on the left. This was confirmed by Guido Goetz in a letter to John J. Ford, Jr. in 1959, the medal is listed as Kienast 576. Obverse shows surrender meeting in a railroad car, two standing and eight seated. Below in panel, "21.JVNI / 1940." Reverse ten lines inscription in the center, with helmet and laurel branch below. Around, "DEUTSCH — FRANZOSISCHER — WAFFENSTILLSTAND" (German and French Armistice). The center ten lines translate, (In the historical trainwagon in the woods of Compiegne terminated the tragedy of the German disgrace which started Nov. 11, 1918 and had its origin there). Size 60 mm., silver, edge G, Type II(4). Choice Unc. A rare medal in any fabric, especially so in silver.


- 3465 Typical pinback, Hitler left "EIN VOLK(Swastika)EIN REICH(Swastika)EIN FUHRER," with pin attached. C&H C-201 in brass-plated steel, 28 mm. Brilliant Uncirculated. (\$15-20)
- Pair of pins identical to preceding lot, one with vertical pin, and one with horizontal clasp pin. C&H C-201, both brass-plated steel. About Uncirculated. (Total: 2 pieces) (\$25-40)
- 3467 Same type as preceding in nickel-plated steel. Reverse has metal flap instead of pin, C&H C-201. Brilliant Uncirculated. (\$15-20)



- 3468 Unlisted pinback in solid shell die strike. Early bust of Hitler in SA uniform left, star in field below. Around, "EIN VOLK,EIN / REICH, EIN FUHRER." Below the bust in very small letters, what appears to be "J. REINEMETAL." Silvered brass, 32 mm. with small intact horizontal clasp pin. (\$35-50)
- Solid type struck pin, type of C&H C-210. C&H only list copper, this piece is base metal, with copper plating, with silver cameo plating on the bust. Quite attractive, EF, 35 mm. with intact pin. (\$25-40)
- 3470 Pair of struck pins, C&H C-211. One piece without a pin is in silverplated copper, ex Charles McSorley, 1964; and other pin is in unlisted gilt-brass with an intact pin, both 35 mm. Both are Extremely Fine. (Total: 2 pieces) (\$35-50)
- 3471 Unusual three bust design (similar to C&H C-84), listed as C&H C-214. In variance to the footnote under this piece in the book, this piece is struck, probably in copper as it rings, as is dull gilt plate, 39.5 mm. Reverse has "BALMBERGER / NBG." It has an intact horizontal pin. A choice pin, over 2 mm. thick, About Uncirculated. (\$55-70)

3474 Unpublished pinback, with head left in plain field, different head than C-219. Struck apparently in brass, with 3 mm. tapered edge all around. About half silvering remains on obverse, reverse fully silvered. Reverse plain except for incuse impression of obverse, intact horizontal pin. Extremely Fine, 34 mm. (\$35-50)



- 3475 Still another unpublished pinback, with head like C&H C-57, but reduced in size to 25 mm. Engraved by "EMIL HUB" as is C-57, struck in bronze. 3477 Unpublished struck plaque of Hitler dated 1938. High relief head right, below, "GROSSDEUTSCHLAND IST ERSTANDEN!" (Greater Germany has emerged), below date, "1938". Unsigned, medium golden bronze, 44 x 60 mm. This medal undoubtedly refers to the Anschluss and the annexation of free Czechoslovakia. Of great importance and extremely rare. About Uncirculated. (\$125-150)



3478 Struck medal plaque by "STIASNY", 60 x 70 mm. like C&H C-331. However none of the variations listed in the book were struck. Not only was ths piece struck, it was obtained in Paris in 1945 by the consignor. Struck in bronze in high relief with heavy gilting. Extremely rare and Uncirculated. (\$125-175)



3479 Medal issued in Germany by Italo Venezuela Bank in 1957, C&H C-401 struck in 900 fine gold, 30 mm. There are two errors in the description given in the book (the piece is not illustrated). Below Hitler's collar on the obverse, the maker's initials are "R.B.", not "R.A." On the reverse, in the legend below the eagle, coin reads "ORO GR / 22.2" not "22.3" as shown in the book. The piece contains 20 grams of pure gold, or 22.2 grams of 900 fine gold or 308.7 grns. With gold at \$450 per Troy ounce, the melt value of this medal is \$289.40. Well struck, reeded edge, Proof. Very few of these pieces were issued, and undoubtedly many were melted during the gold boom. Quite a rare item — even C&H did not have one available for illustration. (\$400-550)

3480 Unpublished variation of the Leaders of the War series, dated 1958, but smaller, 26 mm. weighing only 6 grams net. Besides date the piece has a few other differences from C-401, due to space such as lacking gross weight. Piece contains 83.34 grns. of pure gold, or \$78.13 with gold at \$450. Reeded edge, attractive Proof. Extremely rare as evidenced by no listing in C&H and limited issue. (\$125-190)



3481 Another unlisted variation of C&H C-402, dated 1959. This issue of Leaders in the Second War series, is same size as Lot 3479, and 30 mm. in diameter. Edge reeding quite a bit finer than Lot 3479, but weighs only 15 grams of pure gold and not 20 grams. Contains 208.3 grns. of 999 gold, or a face of \$195.28 with gold at \$450 per ounce. Struck in Proof, unlisted in C&H and extremely rare. (\$275-350)



- 3482 The massive Leaders in the Second War piece, listed as C&H C-402. Struck in 900 fine gold, 50 mm. weighing 50 grams of 999 gold (55.5 grams gross). This has same reverse as Lot 3480, and it is obvious that C&H never saw the piece, as they state, "Reported to weigh 50 grams." This rather extravagant production has 694.5 grns. of 999 gold, or a face of \$651.09 with gold at \$450 per ounce. Probably the rarest piece of the four medal series, because of its high initial face value. Extremely rare. Proof with reeded edge. (\$750-950)
- 3483 Square mirror with photographic reproduction of Hitler with arms about school age children. Below, "ADOLF HITLER / DER FUHRER / MIT KINDER. 1936." Measures 50 x 76 mm., the mirror is intact. Background white, some edge marks but overall Very Fine. Quite a rare item. (\$50-75)





Important Group of Olympic Medals

The following group of three olympic medals is especially important. Rarely does the collector see the gold, silver or bronze olympic medals actually awarded — merely the commemorative medals from the event. Two of these medals were awarded to Canadian athletes, and one includes the actual printed citation award.



3575 Silver medal for 1912 Olympic Games in Stockholm. Beautifully struck 50 mm. silver medal, showing ancient four horse chariot on obverse with two drivers. Engraved by "B M", with "VAUGHTONS" in exergue. On reverse is Greek column with Zeus perched atop, with pole (or staff) and angel in right hand. In lower field, incuse "ERIK / LINDBERG." Above, around "TILL.MINNEAE.OLYMPISKA.SPELEN / STOCKHOLM.1912." Engraved on edge "EVERARD B. BUTLER ARGONAUT ROWING CLUB 1912.'

Included with the medal is a handsome 11 3/4 by 18 1/2 in. award certificate engraved by CENTRALTYCKERIET STOCKHOLM, drawn by "OLLE HJORTZBERG.1912." in black, dark green, blue and gold strongly resembling a Mucha print. For Olympiaden. / Olympiska Spelen i Stockhom 1912 / (rest hand lettered) Meritdiplom / for / Rodd: single sculls, / till E. B. Butler, Canada." Diploma in early Canadian frame in black, but with Plexiglass instead of glass so can be shipped. Diploma in perfect condition.

The reverse of the backing has circa 1920 writing indicating that Butler was an outstanding rower in U.S. and Canada, and signed by his father William C. Butler. His second place finish was from among 22 entries. The medal itself is beautiful, silver, probably 900 fine, weighing 729.2 grns. It is Extremely Fine and probably was lightly cleaned. Newly Discovered New York & Harlem R. R. Token in copper

3690 Unlisted New York & Harlem Railroad in copper with extremely rare counterstamp, circa 1840-1845. A major discovery specimen of this rare early transportation and store card token by Bale & Smith of New York. It is unlisted in copper in the standard reference by Atwood-Coffee Catalogue of United States and Canadian Transportation Tokens Fourth Edition, while Edgar Adams lists it in copper as No. 619 under New York, but without a counterstamp. Listing repeated with same number by Donald Miller, but most authorities have assumed the listed Adams 619 might be a electrotype. This discovery specimen is struck on a thin flan, from a very early die state - no breaks, marks or crumbling are apparent, and it has the previously unreported (although one has been reported to the writer in German silver) "floral branch countermark." The edges of the flan are fully sharp and evidences of wire edge flow can be seen.

This major rarity was recently discovered near Reinbeck, New York in a group of unassorted Civil War tokens. It is not illustrated in Rulau (one was not available to him), and dates to the period 1835-1848 when Bale & Smith were in business, after the formation of Wright & Bale in 1829 continuing until 1834. It clearly must be called a Hard Times token, which have a cutoff date of 1845. Although we hesitate to call the piece Uncirculated, it is clearly About Uncirculated. A major rarity for both the New York collector, Hard Times collector and transportation addict. At this time clearly unique, and so it may well remain for the next 150 years. Any estimate is pure speculation. Estimate

California Medals

The following major collection of California medals was formed over a 20 year period by Stephen Album of San Jose, and spans a period from about 1850 to 1960 — the arbitrary cutoff date. Many of the pieces collected can well be defined as tokens also, and are listed in C. V. Kappen *California Tokens* TAMS, 1976. This major holding of California medals (and tokens) is undoubtedly the finest ever offered at auction — collectors will find many pieces of noteworthy interest. The *unique* Morgan & Orr San Francisco Coining Press piece of 1873 is perhaps the most important single item, the offerings from the Panama-Pacific Exposition of 1915 is noteworthy, while virtually all so-called dollars listed by Hibler & Kappen from California are included. It will certainly be a long time, if ever, before such another collection of California is offered for sale.

The arrangement of material in this section is at best arbitrary. The following order makes the collector of various specialties more aware of their particular interests. First, "socalled" dollars will be listed, mainly those listed in Hibler & Kappen, but obvious unlisted ones will be included. Smaller size pieces, where the organization is directly listed by H-K will be included, especially the exposition pieces. Pieces that are listed by Kappen as tokens will then be listed by city. Finally other medals will be listed by city. After that issues of fraternal orders and related will be listed by organization.

California So-Called Dollars



3739 Morgan & Orr, Phila. Coinage Press for the San Francisco Mint, Oct. 1873 struck in brass. All other known specimens are in silver, it is listed as Wright 722, Kenney 179, and H-K 1003 (in the rarity section reserved for pieces with one to three known).
