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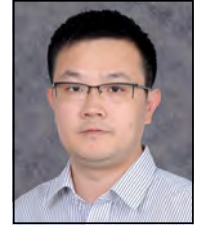

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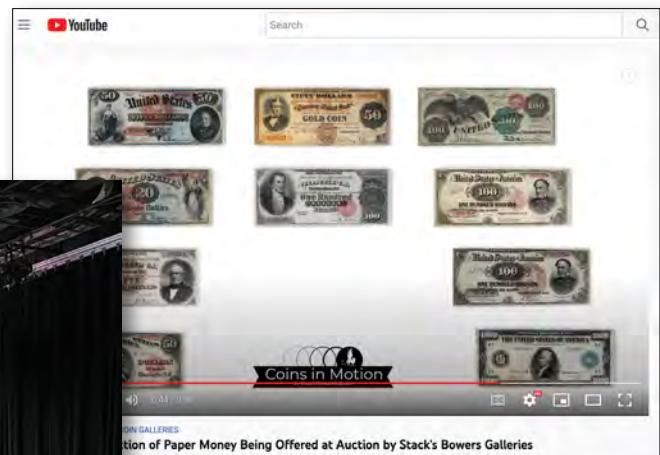

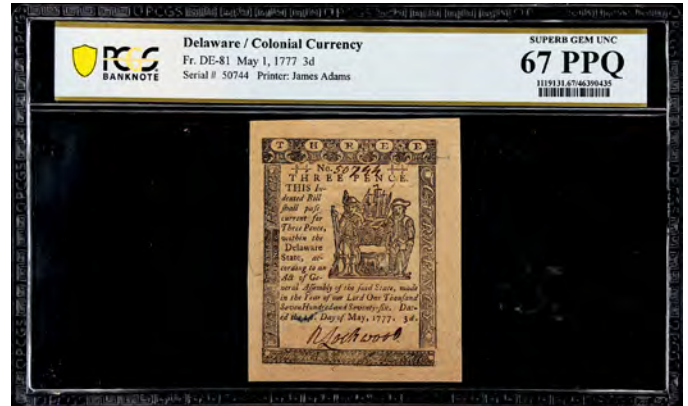

CT-211. Connecticut. June 19, 1776. 2 Shillings, 6 Pence. PMG Gem Uncirculated 65 EPQ. No. 1049. Signed by Jabez Hamlin. He was a Colonel in the state militia during the Revolutionary War and also served in the state legislature, ultimately becoming a judge. Printed in New London by T. Green, 1776. There were only 7,500 of this denomination printed. It is seen with deeply embossed devices, wide margins, and excellent centering. Most importantly, and particularly so in this lofty state of preservation, is that the note is Uncancelled. According to the PMG Population Report, this odd denomination is the second scarcest from the entire issue. This exquisite gem is as good as it gets. PMG Pop 1/None Finer.

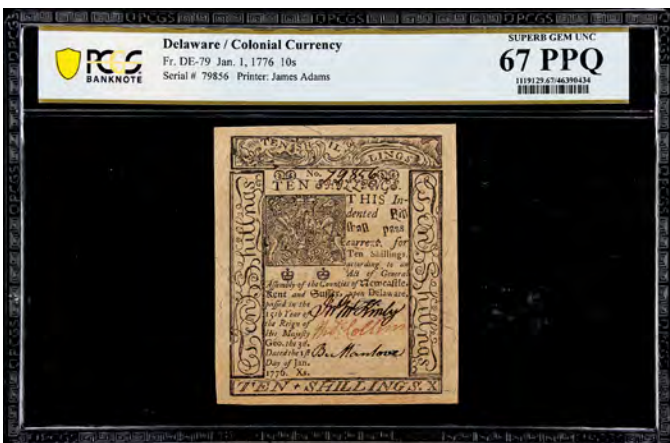

DE-81. Delaware. May 1, 1777. 3 Pence. PCGS Banknote Superb Gem Uncirculated 67 PPQ. No. 50744. Signed by Richard Lockwood. He was a well-known merchant in Middletown and he served admirably during our nation's struggle for independence. Printed by James Adams, 1777. The small change Pence notes of Delaware's Act of May 1, 1777 were slightly smaller than the larger denomination Shilling notes. However, both exhibit large, oversized borders and generally good print quality leading to several survivors at the superb gem level. With a relatively small print run of only 5,455, these are scarcer than the notes from the previous 1776 issue. Notes from the 1777 Delaware issue have long been coveted as an excellent type note for a Thirteen Colony set. While this is the only 67 PPQ graded so far by PCGS Banknote, PMG records three with one finer on their current census. PCGS Banknote Pop 1/None Finer.

DE-79. Delaware. January 1, 1776. 10 Shillings. PCGS Banknote Superb Gem Uncirculated 67 PPQ. No. 79856. Signed by John McKinly, Thomas Collins and Boaz Manlove. Printed by James Adams, 1776. Adams had previously worked for Benjamin Franklin in Philadelphia. Large sheaf of wheat on verso. This 10 Shilling note has been blessed with jumbo sheet margins, sharp signatures and superb paper quality. Any note that has survived from the 18th century to the present in this advanced state of preservation is to be lauded as a relatively rare treat. PCGS Banknote Pop 1/None Finer.

DE-87. Delaware. May 1, 1777. 2 Shillings, 6 Pence. PCGS Banknote Gem Uncirculated 66 PPQ. No. 34626. Signed by John Laws and John Wiltbank. Wiltbank was from Lewes and fought in the Revolutionary War. He helped in getting Delaware to statehood and served in a number of political positions. Printed by James Adams, 1777. Gem examples of the larger denomination notes from this 1777 series are far scarcer than the small change notes. The PMG Population Report shows that this 2s6d denomination is the scarcest by far from this 1777 issue. Their highest grade assigned for this Friedberg number is AU 58. PCGS Banknote Pop 1/None Finer.

MD-41. Maryland. January 1, 1767. \$1/3. PCGS Currency Gem New 66 PPQ. No. 11365. Signed by R. Couden and J. Clapham. Printed by Jonas Green, Annapolis, 1767. The one and only Gem Uncirculated copy of this scarce Maryland issue, most of which are found in well-circulated and faulty condition - few are seen above VF. From a small group sold years ago, all near this serial number, with a pedigree to the Eric P. Newman collection. This note retains most of the indent at left and has three large margins, particularly at top and right. Wonderful print registration highlighting the coat of arms on the front and the

nature print on the back. The ink signatures are sharp and clear. PMG has graded a single 65 EPQ and is the only Uncirculated MD-41 on their census. The T&P Census indicates this note, and the PMG 65 are the only certified Uncirculated notes known. This is a rare opportunity to acquire an extremely rare note in high grade and should draw considerable attention.

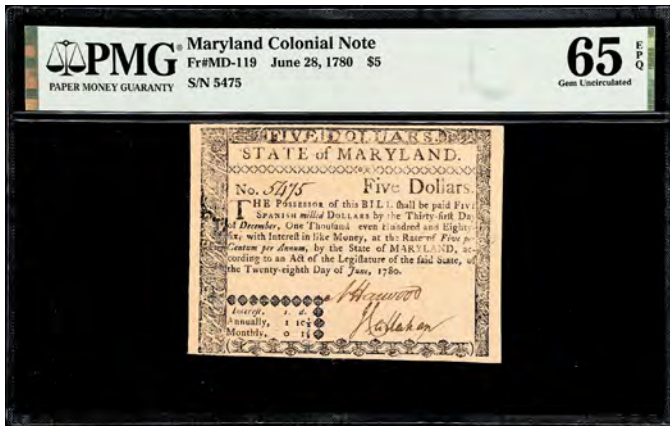

MD-44. Maryland. January 1, 1767. \$1. PCGS Currency Gem New 65 PPQ. No. 11363. Signed by R. Couden and J. Clapham. Printed by Jonas Green, Annapolis, 1767. A stunning One Dollar denominated note, and the first governmental use of that denomination on American currency. As such, its historical significance is obvious and without parallel. Of interest is the small vignette of a Spanish Dollar above the coat of arms on the front, making its value clear to all. Extra wide margins at top and right, with nearly all of the indent visible at the left border. The nature print on the back is beautifully reproduced, revealing nearly all the fine detail, particularly in the leaf at right. The Track and Price Census shows only two Uncirculated notes of this denomination, this PCGS 65 PPQ

and an uncertified example sold in 2002 (#11364) which was graded "Superb Gem New" by the auctioneer, but has apparently not yet been independently graded. The photograph indicates it is a bit more generously trimmed at bottom but is tighter at left. The opportunity to acquire the first "one dollar bill" to be printed and circulated in the United States is not one to be casually passed by. This is a most important and historic note, and fully deserving of the attention of any serious collector. Ex. Eric P. Newman Collection. PCGS Pop 1/None Finer.

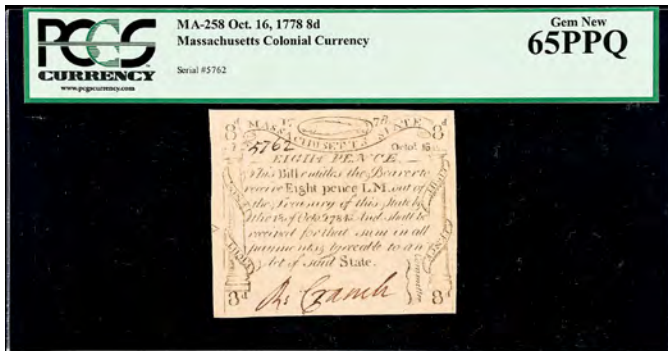

MD-119. Maryland. June 28, 1780. \$5. PMG Gem Uncirculated 65 EPQ. No. 5475. Signed by N. Harwood and J. Callahan. Guaranty countersigned on back by B. Harwood. Printed by Hall and Sellers, 1780. An exceptionally well-preserved June 28, 1780 \$5 note that comes on pristine paper. The printed inks are dark and vividly detailed while the issuing signatures are neatly penned. The back employed the red ink technique used on the last Continental Currency issue of January 1779, using both the strip on the left border and the geometric shape over the emblem. A guarantee from the United States ensuring "Payment of the within Bill..." also appears on the back. This guarantee was adopted by the Continental Congress in 1780, and eight of the thirteen colonies issued notes under this resolution. This is the single finest example of MD-119 to be graded by PMG. An outstanding note. PMG Pop 1/None Finer.

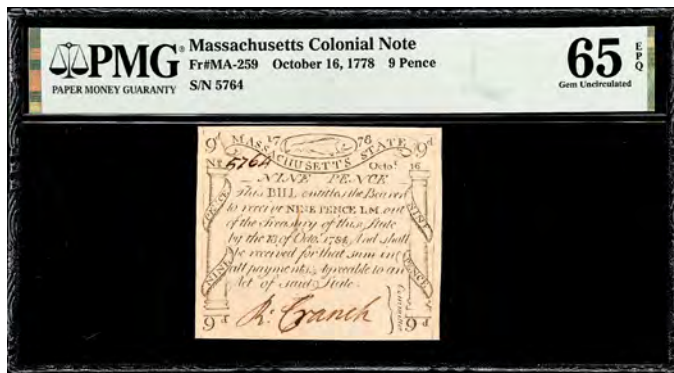

One of only two 65 PPQ's graded by PCGS Currency, with PMG's highest to date a solitary 63, this gem Codfish note certainly has a claim to the finest known. Most of these notes display light printing on the front, but the engraving on the back is particularly sharp and detailed with even the individual needles on the pine tree fully defined.

This is the second of two "Codfish" series, the faces of which were engraved and printed by Paul Revere. The wonderfully-detailed "Pine Tree" back was the work of Thomas Fleet. A nice uncirculated piece as many of them are, cut from a group of sheets long ago. Bright, well printed, perfectly-centered on the front and bearing a bold, well-executed signature. PMG Pop 2/None Finer.

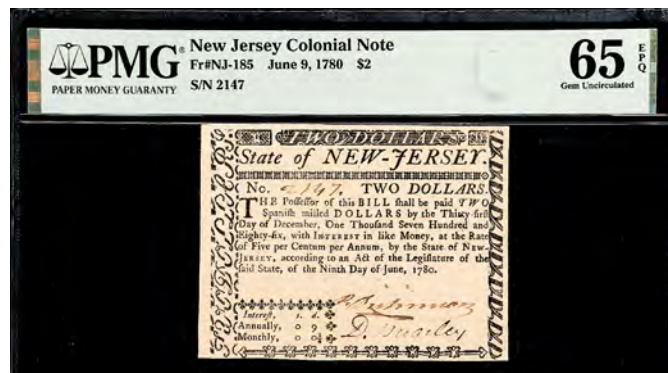

Stevens, Jr. Printed by Isaac Collins, Burlington, New Jersey, 1776. Even though more than half a dozen 12 Shilling notes from the New Jersey issue of March 25, 1776 have merited the 67 PPQ/EPQ grade, only one has achieved a grade of 68 PPQ, this being that note. In addition to being the finest-graded to date from both major services, it bears the signature of John Hart, a signer of the Declaration, making this particular note considerably more desirable than simply its grade would indicate. The physical attributes of this note fully confirm its lofty grade as it features incredibly wide, jumbo borders with nearly perfect balance in both directions, rich red print, razor sharp ink signatures, ideal embossing and splendid paper quality. Truly one of the top Colonial notes available and certain to draw the interest of discriminating collectors. A real showpiece! PCGS Banknote Pop 1/None Finer.

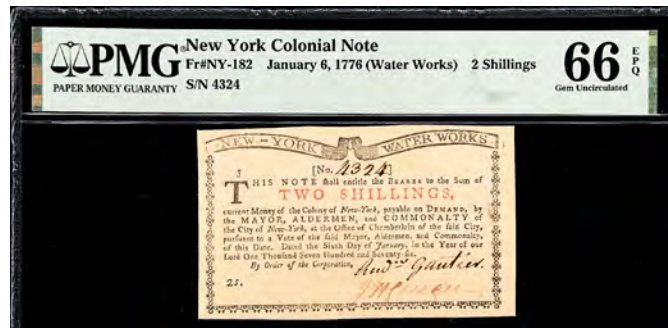

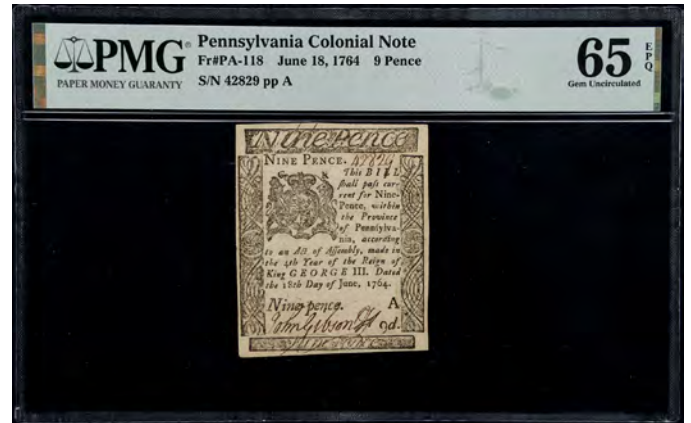
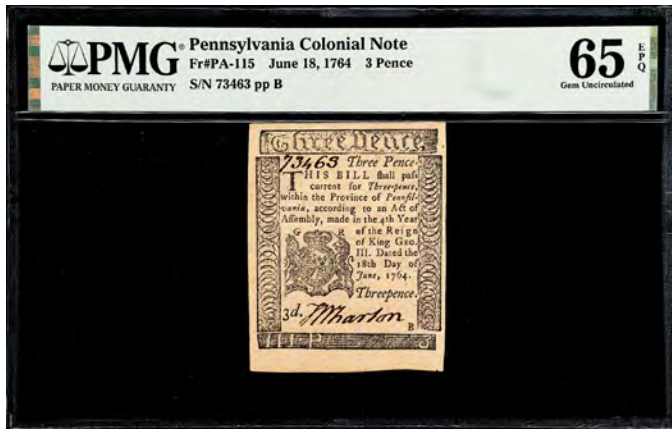

(PMG’s highest grade awarded to date is a 65 EPQ.) With extremely wide and perfectly-balanced borders and lovely cream-colored paper, only a slight fading of the red ink signature and serial number prevent an even higher grade. PCGS Banknote Pop 1/None Finer.

Franklin" on the back. A stellar example with three boardwalk margins. Small change bills from this series were printed in 3 Pence, 4 Pence, 6 Pence, and 9 Pence denominations. Out of the five known Fr. 187k examples, two are permanently impounded in the collections of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York and the Smithsonian Institution. This leaves only the note being offered here and two others available to the collecting public. The catalog number features the engraved signatures of Treasury officials Vernon and Treat, with a small red scalloped Treasury Seal located near the bottom right corner. The engraved design elements, including the depiction of Columbus at left and the portrait of DeWitt Clinton at center, are boldly inked. The face of the note is elegantly framed by generous margins. On the back, a vividly printed design showcases countless ornate details, along with the Legal Tender clause and anti-counterfeiting language positioned on the left side.

The face design of this note follows the style used in the Series of 1869 and 1878, with some notable changes. Although the two vignettes on the face appear unrelated, it was not uncommon for this period to feature seemingly disparate scenes. On the left side, Columbus in His Study is depicted, with a globe on the floor nearby. At the center, DeWitt Clinton (1769-1828) is portrayed, with his right hand touching the side of his head. Perhaps the connection between the two men lies in their significance to water-related achievements. Columbus is renowned for his transatlantic voyage that led to the “discovery” of America, while Clinton played a crucial role in the completion of the Erie Canal in 1825, linking the Great Lakes with the Atlantic. Although this connection may seem tenuous, it offers an intriguing perspective on the selection of these vignettes.

The emergence of this Fr. 187k 1880 \$1000 is a momentous discovery, capturing the attention and admiration of collectors. With its rarity, exquisite design, and historical significance, this note represents a truly remarkable find in the world of paper money collecting.

My name is Mike Abramson and I am honored to have been retained by both the consignors and Stack's Bowers Galleries to write a portion of the paper money auction. Looking at The Issie Chaimovitch portion of today's sale, one might think that another collection of radar serial numbers could be lurking around the corner. I can say from nearly six decades of experience that no one before, no one now and no one likely in the future will ever assemble a collection of two digit radars to come close to what Issie has accomplished. While "Radar" Bob Johnson accumulated tens of thousands of \$1 radar notes back in 1980s and 1990s, his notes were 95% low value three and four digit radars, that have been disbursed decades ago. Remember that mathematically, there are only 128 two digit zero radars printed for every 99999999 notes produced vs. 9990 three and four digit radars printed in the same run. I would encourage you to stretch when bidding today on the notes you want in both Issie's Collection and the Wisconsin Collection, as the scope of serial number rarities in this offering is unprecedented.

Advanced collectors of these high serial numbers are well aware of the fact that the Bureau of Engraving and Printing has stopped printing \$1-\$20 Federal Reserve Notes at serial #96000000 back in the late 1980s. The highest serial number printed for \$50 and \$100 denominations has been 99200000

starting at about the same time. So locating any serial number well above this range has become a real challenge. There have been a number of uncut sheets issued, by the BEP, with serial numbers above this range, that were not meant for general circulation.

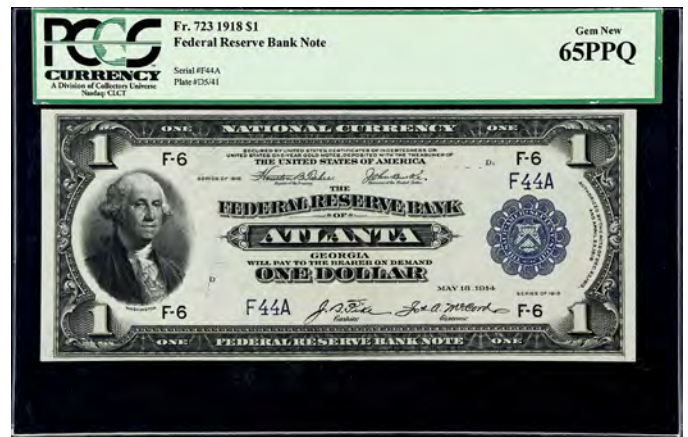

12. Disputes.
