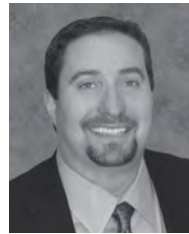

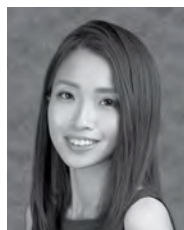

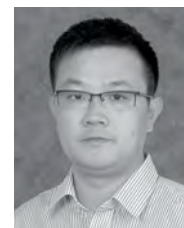

Typically, this welcome letter serves as an opportunity to single out individual items in the catalog, and occasionally impart information about the named collections it contains. 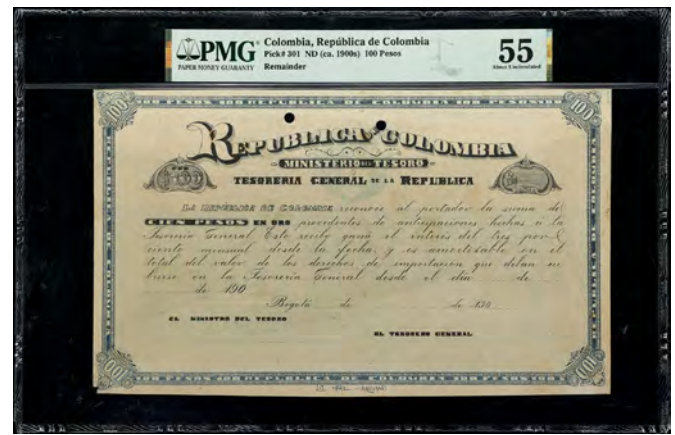

Having handled the Eldorado Collection, and the Rosenman collection just last year, we certainly aren't strangers to rare Latin American paper money. Even still, I have been in awe of these notes since I first laid eyes on them. I don't quite feel as though my voice alone should properly present this section so I reached out to a dear friend of mine, no stranger to rare notes, who belongs on the Mt. Rushmore of World Paper Money. He lends his voice here to properly introduce this collection.

Foreword to this Costa Rica selection by Pablo Hoffman of Nuevo Mundo World Paper Money

I have been into paper money as Nuevo Mundo World Paper Money for a very long time. Costa Rica has always been one of my favorite countries to collect and deal in. I've seen a lot of Costa Rica notes... a LOT. However, when the group in the upcoming Stack's Bowers Galleries auction came along, I was stunned. This group includes not one or two, but many notes I have never seen before, and quite a few that I know are unlikely to exist in any collection, anywhere.

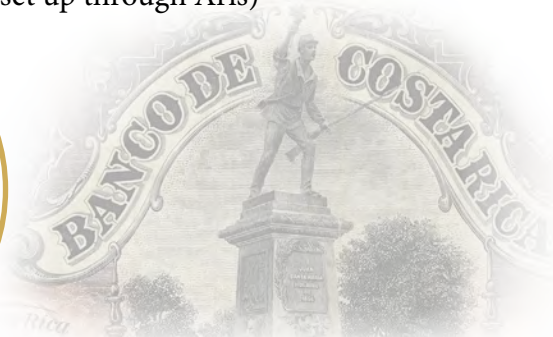
When the Frederick R. Mayer collection of Costa Rican banknotes was sold in New York City in 2008, I was there. It was thought at that time to be the pinnacle presentation of Costa Rican banknotes ever brought to light. And yet once again in New York City this January, Stack's Bowers Galleries and its Director of World Currency Auctions, Aris Maragoudakis, will bring to auction a new milestone in Costa Rica numismatic history and the collecting of its banknotes.

Collector interest in Costa Rican banknotes has been gradually but steadily ramping up over recent years. It seems likely that we may soon see a new impetus "right off the charts." Buckle up, because we are about to see spectacular items never before seen and accurately described in a major public auction. There are issuers never before seen. There are signed and dated examples where previously only specimens or proofs were known. There are denominations and varieties previously unknown. And there are unique pieces that will surface here, and are likely to pass into the most powerful collections on the planet, probably never to be seen again in our lifetimes.

The auction sale of this historic collection will take place at the New York International Numismatic Convention in January, 2024. I certainly plan to be there... come say hello! As a favor, I am making myself available through Stack's Bowers Galleries to discuss with you collectors and share our thoughts about some of these specific notes. (Please set up through Aris)

To protect those who had little wealth in the event of a bank failure, the government forbade the issuance of notes in denominations of less than \$5; thus, Trinidad & Tobago issued notes for \$1 and \$2. And, as in Canada, denominations higher than \$100 were also the prerogative of the government. Thus, Trinidad & Tobago chose to issue a \$1000 in 1914. In the Trinidad & Tobago Blue Book, 1914-1915, under 'Estimated Amount of Paper Money in Circulation, Colonial Government': "On February 1st, 1906, the Government commenced issuing \$1 and \$2 notes. On June 12th, 1914, the first issue of \$1000 notes was made. The total value of such notes in circulation at the end of the financial year was \$636,960, of which \$102,000 consist of \$1000 notes." A spectacular high-value early British colonial note. It should be noted that the face value of this note was USD1000, just like a "Grand Watermelon 1000," and that it was encashable for fifty US \$20 gold double-eagle pieces, a truly staggering amount! A masterpiece in every respect, large size and a superb design.

There are 2 examples on PMG's population report that are considered "Specimen Proofs." The one we recently sold for over \$20k was one such example, however it did not have signatures, dates, or serial numbers such as this example does. This tiny area is a semi-autonomous archipelago off the coast of Tanzania. Microlithic tools have proven that Zanzibar has been home to humans for over 20,000 years. Zanzibar was formally under control by the Portuguese Empire during the exploration age, then the Sultanate of Oman, later the British Empire, then ruled as a constitutional monarchy under Sultan Jamshid bin Abdullah before the Zanzibar Revolution. However, it currently governs itself and is made up of the Revolutionary Council and House of Representatives. You do not need to know the entire history of Zanzibar to know how rare and special banknotes from the region are. The country was a trading point between the surrounding continents for many different imports and exports ranging from spices to slave trafficking.

What makes the 1 Rupee a coveted example among Zanzibar enthusiasts is that it was Printed by TDLR instead of the other denominations contracted to Waterlow and Sons. Even the storied set brokered in 2017 through the cooperation of Barnaby Faull, John Markis, and Aris Maragoudakis, did not feature one such example. These are very desired, and missing from many of the most extensive banknote collections. A total of merely 37 pieces of Zanzibar banknotes have been graded by PMG across all denominations. This particular specimen appears to be the finest graded example of any 1 Rupee.

12. Disputes.
