## The American Eagle At Dusk and At Dawn 35th Anniversary Coins



First released to the public in 1986, the American Eagle Bullion Coin series has become one of the most popular and successful modern issues produced by any of the world's mints. Prized by both bullion investors and numismatic collectors, the America Eagle series is considered the United States Mint's signature product and offers an homage to the greatest classic U.S. coin designs of the 20th century.

To celebrate the 35th Anniversary of the series, the United States Mint launched new reverse designs and refreshed obverse designs for both the Gold and Silver series. The final 500 coins each from the classic gold and silver design and the first 500 each of the new gold and

silver designs were struck, resulting in 2,000 coins of utmost historic importance, designated the American Eagle At Dusk and At Dawn 35th Anniversary Coins.

Stack's Bowers Galleries is proud and honored to offer these historic Dusk and Dawn transitional coins exclusively through our Summer 2022 Showcase Auction, with Live bidding taking place on Thursday, September 1st. We expect that they will excite and inspire both collectors and investors just as the American Eagle Series did upon its launch nearly four decades ago.

These special 35th Anniversary coins have been graded and encapsulated by the leading grading services NGC and PCGS with custom labels to recog-



nize their historic significance. These coins will be auctioned primarily in lots containing special four-coin sets that include one each of the classic gold and silver eagle 1-ounce coins and one each of the new gold and silver 1-ounce coins. In these sets, the first coins struck of the new designs have been paired with the final coins struck of the classic design and this pairing format was maintained throughout.

Similar auction lots are also offered featuring one each of the classic and new designs in gold or silver. These two-coin sets maintain the same paired striking order as the four-coin sets and are ideal for collectors

focusing solely on either the American Gold Eagle or American Silver Eagle series.

Select coins of particular significance are presented in individual lots in the auction, including the very first and last coins struck of each type. These historic first and last few each represent a milestone in the history of the United States Mint and will serve as a trophy in an advanced collection of this category.

A Certificate of Authenticity relating to the significance of these coins will be included with each coin or coin set purchased.



### AMERICAN GOLD EAGLES

The American Gold Eagles were introduced as part of the Gold Bullion Act of 1985, which was passed by Congress in December of that year. The Act authorized production of gold coins in both Bullion and Numismatic formats in a range of weights from 1/10 ounce to a full 1 ounce. The flagship 1 ounce coin was required to be “A fifty-dollar gold coin that is 32.7 millimeters in diameter, weighs 33.931 grams, and contains one troy ounce of fine gold.” These specifications have remained unchanged nearly four decades later. The original obverse featured a modified version of the

famous torch-bearing Liberty design created by sculptor Augustus Saint-Gaudens for use on the \$20 double eagle beginning in 1907. The original reverse featured an inspiring Family of Eagles design by sculptor Miley Busiek Frost. The American Gold Eagles were produced at the Philadelphia and West Point Mints beginning in September 1986 and were first released to the public in October. Over the following decades, they gained incredible popularity from both bullion investors and numismatic collectors who appreciated their artistry and remarkable rarity for certain dates and finishes.



To celebrate the 35th Anniversary of the Gold Eagle series in 2021, the United States Mint selected a new reverse design by Artistic Infusion Program (AIP) artist Jennie Norris and sculpted by Mint Medallist Artist Renata Gordon. This new reverse features a stunning rendition of the head of an American bald eagle facing

left. For the obverse, United States Mint artists revisited the sculptural models used in the creation of the first coins in 1986, allowing them to create refreshed designs that are even more faithful to Saint-Gaudens' original work. The new design is struck with special anti-counterfeiting features.



### AMERICAN SILVER EAGLES

The American Silver Eagle Series was established by the Liberty Coin Act which was passed by Congress in June 1985 and signed into law by President Reagan shortly after in July. This act specified the exact specifications of the coins including a diameter of 40.6 mm and a composition of one Troy ounce (31.103 grams) of .999 fine silver. It required certain design features including a depiction of Liberty on the obverse and an eagle on the reverse. The Act also stipulated that the coins should “have inscriptions of the year of minting or issuance, and the words ‘Liberty’, ‘In God We Trust’, ‘United States of America’, ‘1 Oz. Fine Silver’, ‘E Pluribus Unum’, and ‘One Dollar’; and have reeded edges.”

For the obverse, an adaptation of Adolph A. Weinman’s famous Walking Liberty design was used, first featured on United States half dollar coins from 1916 through 1957. The reverse displayed an inspiring Heraldic Eagle design by then-Mint engraver John M. Mercanti, who would go on to be appointed Chief Engraver in 2006. The silver was to be sourced from the National Stockpile

and the first coins were struck at the San Francisco Mint in October 1986. For most of the first decade, production was shared by the San Francisco Mint and the Philadelphia Mint, which struck the Numismatic and Bullion formats, respectively. Beginning in 1995, the West Point Mint was used intermittently to produce special issues and had largely replaced the San Francisco Mint for Numismatic coins beginning in 2000. The first 1995 issue with the “W” mintmark is considered a key-date in the series with some examples selling for as much as \$86,000 at auction.

In recognition of the 35th Anniversary of the Silver Eagle series in 2021, the Mint adopted a new reverse design by AIP artist Emily Damstra and sculpted by Mint Medallist Artist Michael Gaudio. As with the Gold Eagle series, the Mint revisited their historical assets to create a refreshed obverse design that is even more faithful to Adolph A. Weinman’s original Walking Liberty design. The new design type also includes special anti-counterfeiting features.

## The West Point Mint

The West Point Mint was originally established in 1937 as the West Point Bullion Depository. It was intended as a storage facility primarily for silver bullion and earned the nickname “The Fort Knox of Silver”. Located in the town of West Point, New York, the Mint is located just north of the United States Military Academy of the same name. The area had long been a strategic location for the United States, serving as military outpost beginning in January 1778 and it has been occupied by the United States Army continuously since. During World War II, the Depository loaned silver to the Atomic Energy Commission, as well as other industries and allies pursuant to the Lend Lease Act of 1941. The facility did not begin producing coins until 1973, when it was used to strike Lincoln cents to alleviate the production burden of the Philadelphia Mint. Beginning in 1976, it also struck Washington quarters that commemorated America’s Bicentennial. The now-famous “W” mintmark was introduced on \$10 gold coins struck in 1984 to commemorate the Los Angeles Olympics that year. This coin was the first United States legal tender gold coin that had been minted since 1933. The West Point Mint also started producing Numismatic American Gold Eagles at the inception of the series in 1986.

Up until this point, West Point was still not an official Mint of the United States. Only the facilities in Philadelphia, PA and Denver, CO were officially designated for striking coins. The facility in San Francisco, CA had been technically operating as an “assay office” since 1962. This changed in March of 1988 with the passing of Public Law 100-274, which declared the “assay offices” of San Francisco and West Point as official Mints. The West Point Mint continued striking American Gold Eagles each year and was used to strike select special issues throughout the 1990s. In 2000, it became the

primary production facility for the American Silver Eagle Bullion coin and is began striking the American Buffalo Gold Bullion coins in 2006.

Today, the West Point Mint serves as the primary production facility for all Numismatic American Eagle coins including gold, silver, platinum, and palladium compositions. It is also responsible for striking all gold commemorative coins and many silver commemorative coins, as well as select special issues. Ellen McCullom has served as Superintendent of the facility since 1999. As the location of the original first strike ceremony for the American Gold Eagle Bullion Coin series on September 8, 1986, it is fitting that West Point was selected to host the special striking ceremony for these 35th Anniversary coins in 2021. The facility has played an important role in both the Dawn and the Dusk of this series, and it will be long recognized for its historic significance, just like the coins that are struck there.

# NGC

Numismatic Guaranty Company (NGC) is based in Sarasota, Florida and has certified over 52 million coins from all over the world since 1987. It is also the official grading service of the American Numismatic Association (ANA), the Professional Numismatists Guild (PNG), and

the only coin collecting organization chartered by the United States Congress. To recognize these important 35th Anniversary coins, NGC developed a special label insert featuring custom graphics that showcases the evolution of the eagle portrait on this series.







# PCGS

The Professional Coin Grading Service (PCGS) was founded in 1985 as one of the very first firms to introduce independent third-party grading and encapsulation to the coin market. Based in Southern California, it officially began operations in 1986, which coincides with the introduction of the American Eagle series. Since

then, PCGS has gone on to certify over \$40 billion in numismatic items including some of the most valuable coins ever sold. To commemorate these American Eagle at Dusk and at Dawn coins, PCGS designed custom label inserts highlighting the classic and new designs for their respective series.





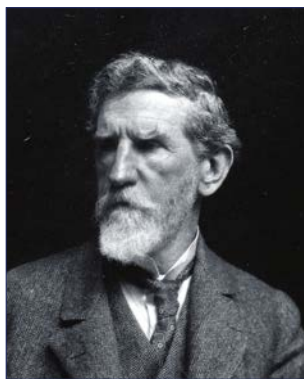

### THE ARTISTS

#### Augustus Saint-Gaudens

Designer: American Gold Eagle Obverse  
(Classic and New Types)



Augustus Saint-Gaudens was born in Dublin, Ireland in 1848 and would go on to become one of the most celebrated American sculptors of the 19th and 20th Centuries. He received extensive commissions for many important projects including for the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago, among many others. A particular point of pride was the nude Diana sculpted for display atop Madison Square Garden, the New York gathering place designed by Stanford White, of the architectural firm of McKim, Mead & White. Beginning in 1885, Saint-Gaudens maintained a studio in Cornish, New Hampshire, in verdant hills overlooking the Connecticut River. In Cornish, Saint-Gaudens was part of an artists' colony that included a half dozen or more artists and writers of repute. Each summer the group would hold amateur theatricals and otherwise enjoy the arts in bucolic surroundings.

By early 1905, Saint-Gaudens had been contacted by Theodore Roosevelt to help create a medal for Roosevelt's March 1905 inauguration, his first as an elected President. The official inauguration medal had

been created by Chief Engraver Charles E. Barber, following the custom that such medals were always made at the Mint. In an unprecedented move Roosevelt had Saint-Gaudens make another version. The medal that resulted is considered a classic rarity among collectors with some examples selling for nearly \$60,000 at auction.

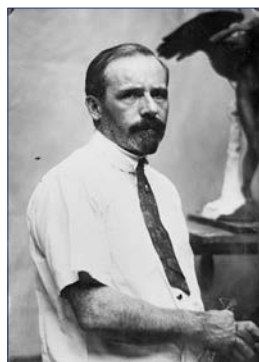
This successful collaboration with Roosevelt gained Saint-Gaudens a commission to re-design some of the nation's circulating coins including the gold \$10 eagle and \$20 double eagle. His re-designed \$10 coins entered commerce in the autumn of 1907 featuring Liberty in a Native American headdress on the obverse and a version of the eagle from Roosevelt's inaugural medal on the reverse. The \$20 double eagles exhibited a torch-bearing Liberty on the obverse and a flying eagle on the reverse executed in a stunning high-relief format. These were released in December 1907 and immediately caused a sensation among the public. Within a month or so all were gone, and they began trading privately at prices of \$30 or more—over 50% above their face value. An American classic was born. Unfortunately, Augustus Saint-Gaudens never saw this popularity over his creation, as he passed away in August 1907.

Today, Saint-Gaudens' \$10 eagle and \$20 double eagle are now considered some of the most beautiful coins to ever emerge from the United States Mint. It is fitting that a version of his torch-bearing Liberty was featured on the obverse of the American Gold Eagle series release in 1986, bringing this historic design to a new generation of collectors and investors. For the 35th Anniversary of the series, the United States Mint artists revisited the sculptural models used in the creation of the first coins in 1986, allowing them to create refreshed designs that are even more faithful to Saint-Gaudens' original work.



### Adolph A. Weinman

Designer: American Silver Eagle Obverse  
(Classic and New Types)



Adolph A. Weinman was born in Durmersheim, Germany in 1870 and immigrated to the United States in 1885. He quickly gained credibility in the arts field, studying at Cooper Union in New York's East Village, and later studying at the Art Students League of New York with his future collaborator Augustus Saint-Gaudens. He would gain prominence through several of his commissions for public exhibitions including the 1904 Louisiana Purchase Exposition held in Saint Louis, MO and the 1915 Panama-Pacific International Exposition in San Francisco, CA. As an assistant to Augustus Saint-Gaudens, he contributed much of the actual design and modeling work on Roosevelt's famous 1905 Inaugural medal, which served as the foundation for Weinman's career as a medalist. He would go on to design several coin series for the United States Mint beginning in 1916 including the dime and half dollar. The dime featured a winged Liberty on the obverse that resembled the Roman god Mercury. His half dollar design featured a full-length Liberty striding forward with an arm outstretched in a welcoming manner. Both of these designs are now considered iconic among collectors and represented a renaissance in the nation's coinage. Just as then, Weinman's Walking Liberty motif was featured on the American Silver Eagle coins released in 1986 to represent a new era of collectability. As they did for the Gold Eagle series, the Mint revisited their historical assets for the 35th Anniversary of the series to create a refreshed obverse design that is even more faithful to Adolph A. Weinman's original design.

### Miley Busiek Frost

Designer: American Gold Eagle Reverse  
(Classic Type)

Miley Busiek Frost is an accomplished American sculptor whose design was featured on the reverse of the original American Gold Eagle coin series launched in 1986. Her "Family of Eagles" design was initially conceived while watching American eagles on a rocky cliff with her family in Wyoming and she later crafted a bronze sculpture based on that scene. She then became inspired by Ronald Regan's acceptance speech at the 1980 Republican National Convention and chose to name the sculpture after the theme of the speech "Together, a new beginning". When news arose of the new American Eagle Bullion coins to be launched by the United States Mint, she decided to submit this design for consideration, and it was ultimately selected for the reverse of the gold coin series. Her "Family of Eagles" design was utilized for 35 years beginning with the Dawn in 1986 and ending with the Dusk of the design in 2021.

### Sherl J. Winter

Sculptor: American Gold Eagle Reverse  
(Classic Type)

Sherl Joseph Winter was a medallic artist born in Dayton, Ohio in October 1934. He joined the United States Mint in 1967 as a Sculptor—Engraver and contributed to several significant designs throughout the 1970s and 1980s. He also served as "acting" Chief Engraver upon the retirement of Frank Gasparro in 1981.

His work was featured on medals for the U.S. Marine Corps Bicentennial, American Revolution Bicentennial, Lady Bird Johnson, and the Willa Cather gold medalion for the American Arts program. He also contributed designs for the 1986 Statue of Liberty half dollar and 1988 Olympic silver dollar. He is most famous for his modeling work on the reverse of the American Gold Eagle coin beginning in 1986, where he adapted the "family of eagles" design by Miley Busiek Frost.





**John Mercanti**

12th Chief Engraver of the United States Mint  
Designer: American Silver Eagle Reverse  
(Classic Type)



John Mercanti was born in Philadelphia, PA in April 1943 and went on to build a long and influential career with the United States Mint over 35 years. After studying at several Philadelphia-based arts schools, he joined the Mint in 1974 as a sculptor—engraver. He later went on to serve as Chief Engraver from May 2006 until his retirement in 2010. During this career, he was responsible for more coin and medal designs than any other employee in United States Mint history. He designed several commemorative Mint issues in the 1980s and 1990s including the 1986 Statue of Liberty dollar coin and the 1991 Korean War Memorial dollar. He also designed five coins for the 50 State Quarters Program that ran from 1999 until 2008. Perhaps his most influential contribution to American coinage is his majestic Heraldic eagle design featured on the reverse of the American Silver Eagle coin released in 1986. Though retired, Mercanti is still held in high regard among collectors and was named one of the Most Influential People in Numismatics by *Coin World* magazine in 2021.

**Jennie Norris**

Designer: American Gold Eagle Reverse  
(New Type)



Jennie Norris is an artist and graphic designer based in Arizona. Her primary mediums are graphite and liquid graphite, and she takes much of her inspiration from the desert landscape. She has worked with several significant corporate clients including Crayola, Hershey, Target, and Costco. She also works as a graphic designer at the University of Arizona. In 2019, Norris was selected to be part of the Artistic Infusion Program at the United States Mint. Her first submission through this program was selected as the winner among 39 applicants to be featured on the reverse of the new American Gold Eagle coin series beginning in 2021. Norris’ design features a bold close-up profile of an American Bald Eagle facing to the left, which replaces the “Family of Eagles” design by Miley Busiek Frost that had been used since 1986.

**Renata Gordon**

Sculptor: American Gold Eagle Reverse  
(New Type)



Renata Gordon is a New Jersey-based sculptor and painter who joined the sculptor—engraver department at the United States Mint as an intern in 2011. She previously earned a degree in sculpture from the University of the Arts in Philadelphia in 2010. At the Mint, Gordon has sculpted over 40 designs for coins and medals includ-

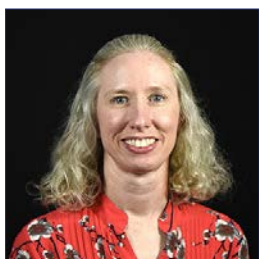




ing the Code Talkers Congressional Medals program, as well as the First Spouse Gold Coin program and the America the Beautiful quarters program. For the 35th Anniversary of the American Eagle series, she worked to bring artist Jennie Norris' new design for the reverse of the Gold Eagle to life.

### Emily Damstra

Designer: American Silver Eagle Reverse  
(New Type)



Emily Damstra is a scientific illustrator, nature artist, and coin and medal designer based in the Great Lakes region. She earned a Master of Fine Arts degree in Science Illustration from the University of Michigan. As an illustrator, she has created natural science illustrations for businesses, governmental, not-for-profit organizations, advertising agencies and many other institutions. Her numismatic design portfolio includes over 40 designs for both the Royal Canadian Mint and the United States Mint. She joined the United States Mint through their Artistic Infusion Program in 2014 and has contributed to numerous issues including the 2018 Breast Cancer Awareness Commemorative coin and the America the Beautiful quarters program. She is perhaps most famous for her design on the reverse of the new 2021 American Silver Eagle, which replaced the Heraldic Eagle by John Mercanti that had been used since 1986. Damstra's design features a majestic full-length portrait of an eagle flying to the left as if trying to land and grasping an oak branch in its claws.

### Michael Gaudio

Sculptor: American Silver Eagle Reverse  
(New Type)



Michael Gaudio is an artist, draftsman, and sculptor who worked at the United States Mint for over a decade as a Medallist Artist, Sculptor, and Engraver. Prior to joining the Mint, he studied at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, the New York Academy Graduate School of Figurative Art, and at the highly regarded Repin Institute in St. Petersburg, Russia. At the United States Mint, he contributed to over 50 coin and medal issues including the Code Talkers Recognition congressional gold medals program, the First Spouse gold coin and medal program, and the Native American and Presidential dollar series. For the 35th Anniversary of the American Eagle series, he was crucial in adapting Emily Damstra's new reverse design for the Silver Eagle for production. Gaudio retired from the Mint in 2020 after a long and accomplished career.



## THE PRODUCTION TEAM

**Ventris C. Gibson**

40th Director of the United States Mint



Ventris C. Gibson was confirmed as the 40th Director of the United States Mint in June 2022, after serving as Deputy Director since October 2021. She is the first African-American and only the seventh woman to serve as Director. She brings over four decades of experience in human resources and executive positions to this role and first began her career in the United States Navy. She joined the United States Department of Veterans Affairs from 1996 to 2003 worked at the United States Department of Health and Human Services from 2014 to 2015. Prior to joining the Mint, Gibson served as the Director of the Department of Human Resources for the District of Columbia from 2015 to 2021. Upon her confirmation, Gibson remarked that “Since joining the Mint last October, I have been tremendously impressed by the dedication and professionalism of its workforce, and the outstanding quality of the circulation coins, bullion coins, and numismatic products made by the Mint.” Under her stewardship, the Dawn of the newly re-designed American Eagle series is sure to meet success.

**David J. Ryder**

34th and 39th Director of the United States Mint



David J. Ryder was first nominated to be Director of the Mint by President Bush in 1991. Prior to this, Ryder held several significant Federal positions including Deputy Chief of Staff of the Office of the Vice President from 1989 to 1990 and Deputy Treasurer of the United States from 1990 to 1991. He went on to serve as Director of the Mint from September 1992 to November 1993. After his tenure, Ryder worked in the private sector specializing in anti-counterfeiting systems for currency and secure documents. In April 2018, Ryder would return to the Mint for a second tenure as Director that lasted until September 2021. During this “Dusk” of his career at the Mint, he oversaw several popular new coin programs including the 2020 75th Anniversary of World War II coins and the 2021 100th Anniversary Morgan and Peace dollars, all while navigating the COVID-19 pandemic. Perhaps the most significant accomplishment under Ryder’s watch is the re-design of the American Eagle coin series, which is considered a signature Mint product. To mark the 35th Anniversary of the series in 2021, new reverse designs were selected for both the gold and silver series and refreshed versions of the classic designs were created for the obverse. Ryder left the Mint in September 2021 and remains a respected figure in the collecting community and was named one of the Most Influential People in Numismatics by *Coin World* magazine in 2021.

**Joe Menna**

13th Chief Engraver of the United States Mint



Joe Menna is an innovative and accomplished artist and sculptor who first joined the United States Mint in 2005 and was appointed as the 13th Chief Engraver in 2019 by then-Director David Ryder. Menna studied at a number of well-regarded institutions including the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, PA, the New York Academy of Art, The Stieglitz State Academy of Art and Design in St. Petersburg, Russia, the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Art, and the Art Students League in New York. He also worked as an instructor and sculptor at the Johnson Atelier Fine Art Foundry in Mercer County, NJ. Upon joining the Mint in 2005, he was the first full-time digitally skilled artist hired by the United States Mint and was critical to the development of the first digitally sculpted coins, which was a technique introduced by the Mint in 2006. Menna's design and sculpting work has been featured in over 60 coin and medals across the past two decades, including the 50 State Quarters Program, the America the Beautiful Quarters Program, the Lincoln Bicentennial One-Cent Coin, the First Spouse Gold Coin and Medal Program, the Native American \$1 Coin, the Presidential \$1 Coins, and many others. For the 35th Anniversary of the American Eagle series, Menna oversaw the transition from the classic designs introduced in 1986 to the refreshed obverse and entirely new reverse designs introduced in 2021.

**Ellen McCullom**

Superintendent of the West Point Mint



Ellen McCullom has been an essential part of the United States Mint team for over 40 years and currently serves as the Superintendent of the West Point Mint, a role she's held since 1999. Her career first began in 1975 as a laboratory control technician at the West Point facility, which was then known as the United States Bullion Depository at West Point. In the 1980s she also worked at the Procurement and Contracting office at the New York Assay Office in lower Manhattan and then at the Mint Headquarters office in Washington, DC. She returned to West Point in 1984 as the Administrative Officer and the Acting Production Manager. Her tenure has witnessed both the Dawn and the Dusk of the American Eagle coin program, first issued in 1986. As part of the 35th Anniversary striking ceremony held at West Point, McCullom served as part of a four-person team led by then-Director Ryder to personally strike the last 500 of the classic design for both the silver and gold coins, as well as the first 500 coins of the new silver and gold designs.

In the event any applicable conditions of these Terms of Sale herein are not complied with by a Buyer or if the Buyer fails to make payment in full by the Default Date, Stack's Bowers reserves the right, in its sole discretion, in addition to all other remedies which it may have at law or in equity to rescind the sale of that lot or any other lot or lots sold to the defaulting Buyer, retaining all payments made by Buyer as liquidated damages, it being recognized that actual damages may be speculative or difficult to compute, and resell a portion or all of the lots held by Stack's Bowers, in a commercially reasonable manner, which may include a public or private sale, in a quantity sufficient in the opinion of Stack's Bowers to satisfy the indebtedness, plus all accrued charges, and Stack's Bowers may charge a seller's commission that is commercially reasonable. More than one such sale may take place at the option of Stack's Bowers. If Stack's Bowers resells the lots, Buyer agrees to pay for the reasonable cost of such sale, together with any incidental costs of sale, including reasonable attorney's fees and costs, cataloging and any other reasonable charges. Notice of the sale shall be by U.S.P.S.
