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





A number of such assemblages have been made highlighting this year, intriguing the collector on points of history, varieties (especially so in the U.S. series with the arrows at date, the varieties of the 3 in the date, the cessation of the two-cent, silver three-cent and half dime issues, etc.) and birth years (today, only of interest to centenarians!).

Present at the famous Boosel sale was Roy Harte, who, intrigued by this design of collecting, embarked on a



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

Counterstamps

Separatist movements against Spain began in the colonies around 1810. Most of the coinage used in the Philippines during this period came from Mexico and South America. Spanish authorities were fearful that usage of the insurgent countries' coins could imply that they were recognized by Spain and so, in 1828, a series of counterstamps appeared. The following thirteen lots consist of an extensive offering of these interesting pieces.

Stone Money from Yap Island --Part of the U. S. Trust Territory of the Paeifie-

1048 Yap Islands. Stone money weighing approximately 60 pounds and of roundish rectangular shape. Measures 2½ inches at thickest point (by center hole), and approximately 17 x 20 inches at narrowest and widest points. One side is dark gray, the other tan. Large center hole, about 2½ inches in diameter, carefully made. Stone in excellent condition. Age estimated by the consignor (see note below, last paragraph) to be pre-1870. Very few examples of stone money—possibly the most famous of the odd and curious monies of the world—have been removed from the Yap Islands, and this is the first we have sold at auction. Our estimate may be on the low side. (\$500-\$1000)

> Historical note: The ase of money made of hard, imported stone dates back handreds of years in the four Yap Islands, which are part of the western Caroline Islands in the western Pacific Ocean midway between Japan and Aastralia (and some 7,000 miles from Los Angeles). Tradition holds that Yap Island chiefs, conscious of the need for some darable mode of trade and having eliminated sach local island commodities as seashells and wood (for these were available to all), elected to import large stones of special hardness from the Palau Islands; this stone was not uative to Yap, and the canoe trip to Palau was an arduoas 225 miles each way, making each of the special stones precious.

> The stone itself possesses characteristics which reminded the Yap Islanders of the one thing which all considered of the greatest beauty; it was prized for its everlasting quality and becaase it was impossible to obtain. The moon's brilliance is indeed resembled in this crystalline limestone imported from Palaa. These "moonstones" were broaght rough-hewn to

Yap, where craftsmen smoothed each into a more or less round, moonlike shape. The center hole (drilled on Palau at the quarry for case of transport to the Yap canoes) was cut to accommodate a wooden carrying pole. Stone money is known to weigh up to several tons and to measure as much as 14 feet in diameter-making the specimen offered here "small change," in a manner of speaking.

As Pacific islanders kept their history alive by word of mouth, this account is the stuff of myth, but it is the story told by present Yap Islanders to our consignor, William R. Elwell, while he was Peace Corps Director for Yap and Paha Distrists of Micronesia. His stone money originated in the Rull Manicipality of Yap, largest of the islands in the groap. Mr. Elwell has volunteered to pass on the mysterious story of O'keefe, which dates this specimen, to the next owner upon request (the aaction firm will forward the purchaser's inquiry to Mr. Elwell after the sale).

Due to pressures from Great Britain, the coiners felt it much safer to continue the use of the 1652 date as the years rolled by.

> The importance of the 1792 Washington half dollar is historic. In its original form the Mint Act of April 2, 1792, stipulated that the portrait of the president would grace the obverse of the American coinage. When the legislation was introduced into Congress by Robert Morris the bill was accompanied by pattern half dollars-silver pieces for the senators and copper pieces for the House of Representatives members. Well known authority Don Taxay relates that the copper impressions were struck in January 1792 in the Coach House on 6th Street, near Chestnut, in Philadelphia. The designs were engraved by 23-year-old Peter Getz of Lancaster, who hoped to secure the post of mint engraver. Date numerals and lettering were punched by Robert Birch (see Lot 2070 of this sale). Congress objected to the monarchial nature of the Washington portrait, and the legislation was amended to provide for allegorical representations of Liberty.







The present coin has a Fine obverse and a Good reverse, the difference being largely accounted for by the way the coin was struck. The surfaces present a pleasing light brown color.



A bit of metal wire or even cloth fiber adhered to the die. Under 50 to 70 tons of pressure, the tiny bit of matter became embedded in the coin.



How You Can Bid SUCCESSFULLY by Mail

Success Can be Yours

Over the years tens of thousands of clients from all over the world have successfully purchased rare coins, currency, and other items in Bowers and Ruddy Galleries auction sales.

While many of these purchasers have attended our auctions in person, most have submitted their bids by mail. We have also seen many unsuccessful mail bidders whose lack of purchases have been due to two main reasons: low bids and a lack of understanding of the bidding procedure.

Success can be yours when you bid by mail! In this article I draw upon my experience and observations and offer suggestions which should improve your chances of success when bidding by mail. Even if you've been a successful bidder in the past you may find some of my suggestions to be valuable.

Information in the Catalog

Nearly all the information necessary to successfully purchase coins by mail bidding can be found in the front part of each of the Bowers and Ruddy Galleries auction catalogues as well as on the bid sheet itself. I suggest that you read this information carefully, paying particular attention to the Terms of Sale. Not only is there valuable information there, but you legally agree to abide by the Terms of Sale when you sign your bid sheet.

Are You a New Client?

Are you a new client? Well, feel right at home! Bowers and Ruddy Galleries is always pleased to welcome new bidders. Most of your questions concerning bidding procedures should be answered here. Should you have any additional questions our Auction Department would be pleased to answer them by telephone or mail. If you are in doubt, ask. We want you not only to be satisfied, we want you to be pleased! If you are a first-time bidder please send your bid sheet as soon as possible, along with a 25% deposit and a list of numismatic and credit references. It takes us time to specifically check each reference, so the earlier you send us your bid sheet the more sure we can be of entering your bids before the sale date.

What Lots Should I Bid On?

This question goes through the mind of every bidder. Most of our auction catalogs contain items in many different numismatic fields. So many items are listed that no single bidder can afford to buy everything or even close to it. So, the problem is: what lots should you bid on in order to obtain the best results?

As a beginning step I recommend u'sing a worksheet during your first reading of the catalog. Jot down lots of interest and the approximate amount they are worth to you. Be sure to check the index to the sale, for often catalogs contain many different consignments, and items in the same series can appear in several different places in the same catalog issue.

Bid on items which fit in with your collecting or investment objectives. Consult your want list, consider any other possibilities and interests which run through your mind, and then determine which lots are of most significance to you. Don't be whimsical. Bid on items which you'll enjoy owning after you receive them.

How Much Should I Bid?

No one can tell you how much you should bid in order to win a lot. While many coins have general value ranges, the ultimate value of any coin is determined by how much a bidder is willing to pay. In general, pricing information for United States coins is readily available from numerous sources, so we do not provide printed estimates in the catalog. However, if you have any difficulty in estimating a

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value and would like our opinion, we invite you to telephone or write. Please remember that we do not know what other people will be bidding until the sale takes place, so there is no guarantee that our pre-sale estimates will represent the actual successful bidding range. Higher or lower prices may prevail once the sale takes place.

Pricing information on ancient coins, coins of the world, and currency is more difficult to obtain, so in many instances our Ancient Coin Department and our World Coin Department will provide printed estimates in the catalog. I recommend that you use these guides together with your own price studies, including prices realized lists from previous Bowers and Ruddy Galleries auctions. These lists are available for a nominal price and make the complete catalog a truly lasting reference.

When you have established the amount you want to bid, enter it on your *worksheet*. When you have done this for all lots of interest you are now faced with the question of which coins you want the most and how much totally you can afford to spend. If you attend the sale in person it is easy to control the total of your successful bids. However, by mail it is more difficult. So, carefully considering your budget and starting with a worksheet can be helpful.

Do not submit bids for a sum more that you can comfortably afford to pay. Participating in our auction should be a pleasurable experience, and there is no sense placing an undue strain on your budget.

I recommend that you bid generously on the lots which you strongly want to buy, bearing in mind that the same catalog you hold in your hands will be read by thousands of other potential bidders in all parts of the world. If a coin is particularly scarce or desirable, if it appears on the market infrequently, and the last sale record is, say, \$500 several months ago, chances are fairly good that a bid in the \$500 to \$750 range would be successful, and chances are even better for a bid higher than that. On the other hand, chances that such a coin can be obtained for just \$300 to \$400 are rather remote.

In addition to lots which are of strong interest to you, there may be some lots in the catalog which you would want to own "if the price is right." if they appear to be bargains to you. For these lots you may wish to submit lower bids. You probably will not achieve a high degree of success with such low bids, but occasionally a lot will be won in this manner. Be prepared, however, to be able to pay for whatever lots you bid on whether you are successful on just one lot or on several dozen.

To re-emphasize a point, due to the careful descriptions we give to each coin and our careful grading, bids substantially below the market value generally will be a waste of your time and ours. If you want to be successful, I recommend reasonable and realistic bids.

When you have completed your worksheet, make your final decisions. By using the worksheet you can easily add or delete lots, increase or decrease amounts, and otherwise calculate what you wish to purchase without confusing the final bid sheet. Remember not to bid more than your ability to pay. Auction invoices are payable upon receipt of the auction invoice and/or the coins, as per our Terms of Sale. We are acting as agent for both the consignors and the bidders, and prompt payment is your legal obligation.

If you wish to pay your invoice by charge card you may do so, but only with the understanding that you must pay the same percentage that we must pay for this service. Please add 2½% to invoices paid by Mastercharge and 3% when paid by Visa. We regret passing this fee along, but our profit margin in auction sales is too slim to allow the loss. Retail coin purchases may be charged without the fee.

The Bid Sheet

The bid sheet is a very important part of our transaction and must be treated with the greatest care. Your signature on it obligates you to follow the Terms of Sale and to honor all bids. Fill it out carefully and check it twice for accuracy using your worksheet as a guide.

List your bids in numerical lot order on the bid sheet we provide. This bid sheet was designed for very specific purposes, and it makes our job much easier. List your bids in vertical columns beginning in the upper left corner on the front. For best clarity I recommend that you use a blue or black pen. Other colored pens, pencils, or marking pens are difficult to read. Make all entries legibly. If we cannot decipher a bid we cannot enter it. And, our guessing at whether an indistinct figure is a "3" or "5", for example, is apt to lead to mistakes.

If you have any questions concerning a particular lot, please contact us at the *earliest* possible date. As the auction sale draws near, things get busier and busier here. By contacting us early, there is plenty of time for exchange of any additional information required.

As auctions are conducted by our Auction Department, please do not attach correspondence concerning direct sales, research, or other Bowers and Ruddy Galleries business to your bid sheet. Please write to us separately about such other items.

Changes on your bid sheet should be avoided. However, I realize that sometimes illness or financial reasons will dictate cancellation or change of your bids. If this happens, *telephone* our Auction Department *immediately*. Be sure to do this *before* the sale. I strongly recommend a telephone call rather than a letter, for it is impossible for us to cancel bids or change bids if notice of this arrives by mail after the sale has taken place. After you telephone us, please confirm changes by letter.

If changes are necessary in your final bid sheet, do not write over the incorrect entry. It is far better to fully cross it out and to re-enter it in the right manner. Trivial or irrelevant marks on your bid sheet may cause us to misread it.

If you are bidding only on a few items enter them on the front of the bid sheet. If you are bidding on many items, fill out the front first and then continue on the back. If desired, an additional sheet of paper can be used as well. Please do not put a few bids on the front of the bid sheet, leaving many blank spaces on the front, and then put additional bids on the back—for as careful as we try to be here, we may assume that as the front spaces are not filled in completely there are no additional bids elsewhere on the sheet.

Fill in *all* information requested on the bid sheet, especially your telephone number. In this way, if we have a question concerning any bid we will contact you. If there is a question and we are unable to contact you for clarification, the result may be that your bid will be cancelled by us—an unfortunate thing for both of us.

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Also, it is important to remember that when you bid in our sales do not subinit bids on identical coins elsewhere or buy the same coins elsewhere, for we will expect you to honor any bids on which you are successful—and unless you specifically want to collect duplicates you inay end up with two specimens of the same coin. Auction sales are not approval sales. If you are not completely positive that you actually want to own the coin, do not bid on it.

If you are purchasing coins from several sources and would like to know the results of your bids as soon as possible, I invite you to telephone our office the third business day following the sale to determine whether you are successful. Usually we have all of the information compiled by that time.

On your bid sheet enter only the lot number (no other descriptions or adjectives are necessary), and use the number in its entirety. For example, if you wish to bid on lots 1205, 1206, and 1207, enter the numbers in their entirety. If you list the lots as 1205, 6. and 7, then we may enter bids for you on lots 6 and 7. We implore you not to use shortcuts!

Please submit your bids in even dollar amounts such as, for example, \$120, \$122, \$127, or whatever. Cents and fractional dollar amounts will be ignored. For example, such bids as \$127.35, \$127.50, and \$127.90 will all be entered as \$127.

Be especially careful of transposition errors. If you want to bid on lot 1206, be sure it is not entered as lot 1602, for example.

Before you mail your bid sheet make a copy of it for your own records. If here at Bowers and Ruddy Galleries we enter one of your bids incorrectly you are not obligated by our mistake. However, if the error is yours and you bid on the wrong lot, bid the wrong amount, or otherwise make an error, then you are obligated to accept the consequences of the error. So, please do your best to be careful.

Optional 10% or 20% Increase

We offer a special service to bidders who wish to increase their bids in order to purchase a lot at a small advance over the original bid. Simply check the 10% or 20% space at the bottom of the bid sheet. These increases are especially useful if you are really determined to win the lot. While there is no guarantee that the 10% or 20% increase will insure success, it has been our experience that often this will make the winning difference. Remember, we purchase the lots for you below your high bid if the competition permits. An explanation of this is given in the "Instructions for Mail Bidders" section in the front of the auction catalog.

Special Instructions: One Lot Only

Our catalogs are usually arranged so that each session contains a variety of items. As noted earlier, pieces within a given specialty may appear in several places in the catalog. Suppose, for example, that you wish to purchase only one Choice Brilliant Uncirculated 1918 quarter dollar, and the sale contains four specimens, lots 901, 902, 1212, and 1457. If you make a notation on your bid sheet we will be pleased to execute special instruction bids at no extra charge to you. As these will be handled separately from your other bids, please pair or group the bids and notate them as per the accompanying illustration.

Another example of a special instruction bid might be that you want either lot 850, a 1932-S quarter, or lot 1352, a 1938-D half dollar, but you don't want both coins. In this instance, follow the following example:

As your special instruction bids will have to be executed from the auction floor by one of our staff members, they are subject to the auction rule that the first bid recognized by the auctioneer at the winning amount wins. In case of tie bids between the floor and the mail bid book, the mail bid takes precedence; however, this preference cannot be accorded your bid when executed from the floor. Please list your special instruction bids in consecutive order.

Do not make your special instruction bids unduly complicated or there may be further problems. While we will do our best with special instruction bids, we cannot be responsible if we inadvertently miss a bid on a lot, due to the pressure of the sale.

Special Instructions: Maximum Expenditure Bids

Never bid beyond your ability to pay. You have a legal obligation to pay for every lot for which you are the successful bidder, as per our Terms of Sale. If you have a limited budget of, for example, \$2000 and you wish to maximize your chances of spending as much of this amount as possible, you can bid more than this amount by placing a "Maximum Expenditure Bid." You can then submit bids up to four times the amount of your maximum authorized expenditure. Your bid sheet will be executed from the floor by one of our representatives who will keep a running total of the amount spent. As soon as the \$2000 is reached, further bids will be cancelled.

Normally we accept Maximum Expenditure Bids only from clients who wish to spend \$1000 or more totally, due to the bookkeeping involved. To bid in this manner, write on the very top line of the bid sheet, for example: "Maximum Expenditure: \$2,000," or whatever your spending limit is.

Very important note: We cannot mix "One Lot Only" and "Maximum Expenditure Bids" due to the complex mathematics involved and the pressure of the sale itself.

The Maximum Expenditure Bid policy will allow you to bid more liberally on all lots which you are interested in, since you don't have to worry about being successful on more than you can afford. You may spend less than your limit, but you will never spend more. We will do our best to follow your instructions strictly. Let us suppose, for example, that your limit is \$10,000 and that at a given point in the sale we have spent \$9500 for your account. Your bid will not be executed beyond the remaining \$500. If the next lot which is of interest to you comes up at \$625 we cannot bid on it for you, for this exceeds your limit.

Inspection of Lots

All lots being sold are available for inspection before the auction. Times and location for in-person examination are printed in the catalog. Mail inspection of lots is available to clients who have established sufficient credit and who agree to adhere to our rules. In order to view lots by mail the following procedures must be observed:

1. This service is available to established clients only; clients who have made appropriate auction purchases in the past. The amount of value sent for inspection must be in line with your previous credit record.

2. If credit references or past experience are not satisfactory to us, we may at our option, decline sending the coins or alternatively make arrangements to submit them to your bank.

3. As multiple requests may be made for the same coin, it is sometimes possible that certain coins cannot be sent for mail inspection as they are not available for that purpose or could not be returned in time to permit examination by in-person bidders. Due to time limitations, lots will only be mailed for pre-sale examination within the continental United States.

4. Lots must be returned within 24 hours of receipt together with your check for round-trip postage and insurance costs. Lots must be returned to us insured for the amount we specify.

5. Lots may not be removed from protective envelopes or display holders.

The Auction

The most commonly asked question about our auction procedure is the execution of mail bids. I construct a hypothetical lot 1798 for which we have received the following mail bids:

In this case, we would act as agent for Bidder 1578, the highest mail bidder. As agent, we try to purchase the lots as cheaply as possible against the floor competition. The lot would probably open at \$190 or \$195, about 5% to 10%, at the auctioneer's discretion, above the next highest mail bid, which in this instance is the second high mail bid of \$180. We would then represent Bidder No. 1578 against floor competition up to the limit of \$250 (unless the 10% or 20% increase had been checked). If there were no floor bids at all, the lot would sell for \$190, a savings to Bidder No. 1578 of \$60 from his maximum authorization! Many of our clients have learned to depend on this service and to bid quite liberally, purchasing many coins and saving much money. Of course, the closer your bid is to the current market value, the less the chance is of saving money. Most savings are when very liberal bids are submitted but competition does not make it necessary for us to use them to the maximum.

If Bidder No. 1578 had submitted a \$170 bid he would have been unsuccessful. As the two highest bids then would have been tied at \$180, the bidding would have opened at that figure. If there had been no further competition, the lot would have been awarded to Bidder No. 379, the first mail bid received for that figure.

Conclusions and Summary

In our auctions Bowers and Ruddy Galleries acts as agent for both the consignor and the bidder. We do our best to meet this dual obligation in the fairest way possible. We want the consignor to be pleased with the accurate descriptions of his coins and we want the bidder to be pleased with the coins he receives.

The procedures described here insure you that as a mail bidder you will pay only as much for a lot as you would if you were attending the sale in person. At the same time they still guarantee the consignor the maximum return on his coins within the limits of bidding competition.

In summary, I recommend reading the catalog carefully, searching throughout the descriptions for lots of special interest. Then use a worksheet to formulate your bids. When filling out the bid sheet do it clearly so that each bid is precise and clear. Don't bid more than you can afford to pay. I invite you to take advantage of our special bidding instructions: our One Lot Only service and our Maximum Expenditure Bid service (but not both at the same time) by making appropriate notations on your bid sheet as per the examples given here.

If you have any problems or questions or if our Auction Department can help in any other way please contact us as soon as possible. We'll do our best to take care of everything to your satisfaction!

If you are about to bid in one of our sales for the first time, I welcome you aboard. I believe that you will really enjoy your first auction experience. We offer the satisfaction of buying the coins you want at the price you want to pay. providing your bids are successful. If you are at past bidder then I thank you for your past participation and encourage your future bidding.
