ABOUT THE DONORS

The Robison Collection of United States Gold Coins was donated by Doris and Ellis Robison to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and Cornell University. The Robisons have been deeply involved with these institutions and have, in the past, provided both financial support and counsel.

Ellis Robison, a 1918 graduate of Cornell University, is President-Treasurer of John L. Thompson & Sons & Co., the nation's oldest wholesale pharmaceutical firm, located in Troy, New York. He joined the Thompson Company as general manager in 1927. In 1952 he acquired full ownership of the firm and recently celebrated his 51st year there.

"Roby," as Ellis Robison is affectionately called by his friends, together with his wife, Doris, recently donated a "Hall of Fame" to Cornell University to honor the school's athletes of past and present. Being interested in athletics, the Robisons have contributed to many athletic programs including a sport and recreation center at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

"Roby" has received Cornell University's and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute's highest honor, that of being named President Counselor at each university. Gifts of coins donated by the Robisons have also provided Union College and Cornell University with herb gardens that have received international acclaim — the garden at Cornell University being recognized as the most comprehensive and complete herb garden in the United States.

It is with their tireless devotion to the athletic programs that this extensive collection was donated. In a recent interview, "Roby" commented on his feelings towards the support of athletic programs.

"There is no better way I can use what funds I have available than to have them applied towards facilities for students. They are able to graduate with better minds and sounder bodies. I think there should be a balance between academics and sports. Usually all the money goes for academics."

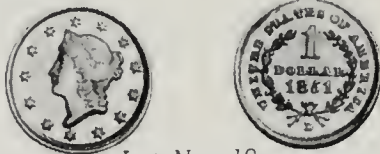

- 1 1849 Open wreath. Extremely Fine.
- 2 1849 Closed wreath. Extremely Fine, pale orange toning.
- 3 **1849'C'** Closed wreath. About Uncirculated and superb. Full frosty mint bloom with some prooflike surface. Rare so choice.
- 4 **1849'D'** Strictly Very Fine, even wear. Scarce.
- 5 1849'O' Extremely Fine. A choice coin with considerable mint bloom.
- 6 1850 About Uncirculated. Lovely deep orange toning.
- 7 **1850'C'** Strictly Very Fine, nearly Extremely Fine. Rare.
- 8 **1850'D'** Very Fine. Struck slightly convex as are most. The reverse stronger than usually seen.
- 9 **1850'O'** About Uncirculated and a needle sharp strike. Splendid pale orange toning. Really quite scarce.
- 10 1851 About Uncirculated but softly struck in the centers.
- 11 **1851'C'** Extremely Fine, some prooflike surface. Very attractive.

GEM 1851'D' GOLD DOLLAR

- 12 **1851'D' Brilliant Uncirculated gem.** Struck from clashed dies but a superb strike, with a prooflike satiny surface. Fully on par with the Bareford specimen we sold in December 1978.
- 13 1851'O' Very Fine and quite nice.
- 14 1852 About Uncirculated. Sharp and choice.
- 15 **1852'C'** Very Fine, even wear, no defects. Splendid pale orange toning.
- 16 **1852'D'** Extremely Fine and choice. The reverse shows virtually no wear and is slightly prooflike. Scarce.
- 17 1852'O' Very Fine, pale iridescent toning.
- 18 1853 Brilliant Uncirculated, frosty. A few hairlines and a bagmark or two.
- 19 **1853'C'** Extremely Fine and lustrous, light orange toning. Three obverse digs but they blend in with the toning.
- 20 **1853'D'** Strictly Very Fine, virtually in the Extremely Fine category. Yellow gold with a delicate coppery tint.
- 21 1853'O' Extremely Fine, frosty mint lustre. Choice.
- 22 1854 Type I. About Uncirculated, frosty lustre. Pale coppery toning.

- 23 **1854'D'** Extremely Fine. A few small hairlines on the reverse. Rare.
- 24 1854'S' Very Fine but probably used as a stickpin. "DOLLAR" and 1854 were damaged by the solder.

TYPE II

1854 - 1856

- 25 1854 Type II. Extremely Fine. Weakly struck about its periphery.
- 26 1855 Extremely Fine. A few small obverse nicks.
- 27 **1855'C'** Very Fine and choice. The obverse as usual is bluntly struck, the reverse sharp. The surfaces are remarkably nice as is the planchet. Scarce.

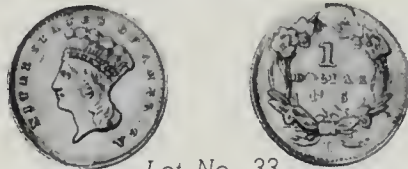
- 28 **1855'D'** The rarest coin of this type. Very Fine, even wear. The central portion is weak, obliterating "LL" and "8". The periphery, however, is sharply struck. Overall a very nice specimen.
- 29 1855'O' Extremely Fine, pale toning.
- 30 1856'S' The last year of this design. Extremely Fine, slightly prooflike. Very attractive and quite scarce.

TYPE III

1856 - 1889

- 31 1856 Slanting 5. Extremely Fine, small obverse dent.
- 32 1856 Upright 5. Extremely Fine and choice.

VERY RARE 1856'D' GOLD DOLLAR

- 33 **1856'D'** Fully **Extremely Fine** and an unusually sharp strike. The "U" of UNITED is slightly weak but the rest of the lettering is bold. A small obverse rim nick and an incomplete rim on the reverse (done at the time of striking). Still, it is one of the best to reach the market in quite some time.
- 34 1857 Extremely Fine.

- 35 **1857'C'** Extremely Fine. Struck on a superb planchet (most unusual for this date). Sharply struck and really choice.

- 36 **1857'D'** Extremely Fine, lustrous, light coppery toning. The typical uneven strike but overall a very attractive specimen.

- 49 **1861 'D' About Uncirculated**, pale coppery and iridescent toning. One of the sharpest strikes we've ever seen. "UNITED" fully struck up! This is far superior to most of the Mint State specimens known. Prohibitively rare in this splendid condition.

- 50 1862 About Uncirculated.

- 51 **1863** About Uncirculated, tiny obverse rim nick. Well struck, frosty, and very attractive.



Lot No. 52

- 52 **1864 Brilliant Uncirculated**, full blazing mint lustre. The bottom of "18" softly struck as is almost always the case. A beautiful specimen of which only 5,900 were coined for circulation.



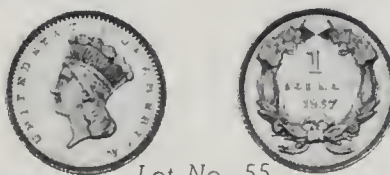
Lot No. 53

- 53 **1865 Brilliant Uncirculated**. A blazing "First Strike" with prooflike surface. A small reverse rim nick causing a slight bend. From its appearance it looks like this was done at the mint. Rare.



Lot No. 54

- 54 **1866 Brilliant Uncirculated**, full frosty lustre. A very nice sharply struck coin, although from clashed dies. Rare.



Lot No. 55

- 55 **1867 Brilliant Uncirculated** and a sharply struck specimen. Mostly frosty but with some prooflike surface.

- 56 **1868 Brilliant Uncirculated**, frosty, but mostly prooflike. A lovely coin and of course quite scarce.

RARE 1875 GOLD DOLLAR

- 65 **1875** About Uncirculated from the point of wear but formerly mounted on the reverse below the wreath (undoubtedly used as a stickpin). A small lint mark on the obverse, lightly polished. The removal of the pin was done with consummate skill. A rare coin and really quite attractive.

- 66 **1876 Brilliant Uncirculated**. A choice prooflike example just bordering on the gem category. Rare, especially so in this state of preservation.



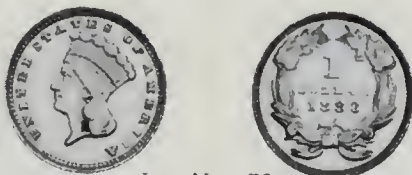

- 67 **1877 Brilliant Uncirculated.** Mostly prooflike with some faint hairlines. Delicate coppery toning.
- 68 1878 About Uncirculated and choice.
- 69 1879 Brilliant Uncirculated. A prooflike "First Strike." Some light rubbing in the field but the specimen is really quite nice.

- 70 **1880** A prooflike **gem.** Brilliant Uncirculated and a dazzling two-tone example. One would have to search ages to find its equal.

Lot No. 81

- 81 **1796** The first year of issue and the only year of this type. Obverse: Capped bust of Liberty right, LIBERTY above, date below, **NO STARS** in the field. Reverse: Heraldic eagle, stars, and inscription. **Extremely Fine.** The "E" of LIBERTY weak as is the edge reeding above it due to planchet adjustment marks. A very nice specimen with nearly full mint lustre.

CAPPED BUST RIGHT. STARS ON OBVERSE

1796 - 1807

VERY RARE 1796 STARS QUARTER EAGLE



Lot No. 82

- 82 **1796 Stars** on obverse arranged 8 x 8. About Uncirculated and a very sharp strike. The coin, however, was mounted minutely on the rim above "E" of LIBERTY and the rim below the date. Obviously used as a pin to show the eagle. The work was done so well, it virtually defies detection. A very rare coin which will no doubt elicit heavy bidding.



Lot No. 83

- 83 **1797** The stars now arranged 7 x 6. The large die break from "Y" to the 13th star clearly in evidence. Very Fine but formerly mounted on the edge. The heat probably "sweated" the design which accounts for the retooling to strengthen the devices. Rare nevertheless.



Lot No. 84

- 84 **1798** Stars unusually arranged 6 x 7. Extremely Fine and a charming little coin. A small obverse rim nick opposite the 11th star but overall the coin is lovely.



Lot No. 85

- 85 **1802/1** Stars further arranged 8 x 5. Extremely Fine, lustrous, and prooflike in the devices. An attractive coin but with circulation marks that are magnified by the surface.



Lot No. 86

- 86 **1804** The obverse star arrangement as above, the reverse with **14 stars**. In fact this reverse was used to strike the 1804 Dime. About Uncirculated and very choice. Perfectly centered and nicely struck. Virtually full mint lustre. Early quarter eagles are very rare in this condition, more so than the other denominations.



Lot No. 87

- 87 **1805** Stars 7 x 6. **Brilliant Uncirculated**, full frosty mint bloom. The reverse with some planchet adjustment marks on the eagle, commonplace to the early coinage in gold and silver. A simply beautiful example which will no doubt realize a record price.

One is in the Smithsonian, another in the Connecticut State Library, and a third in the Eliasberg collection. The coin offered here is of the same dies as all other Philadelphia quarter eagles of this date. Reeding identical to that on earlier and later Philadelphia coins, entirely unlike that on Charlotte and Dahlonega pieces. Strictly Very Fine, obverse sharper than reverse, faint traces of Proof surface remaining within claw and shield. For identification purposes, small nicks just left of 7th star, on edge above S-A, on rim adjacent to right wingtip and stop after final A. This piece is apparently the one discovered in the middle 1950's in upper New York State by Q. David Bowers. The last time one was sold in public auction was in the 1963 Bell sale, another in the 1968 Shuford mail bid sale, both EF ex-Proof. . . ' We mention as a point of clarification that the presently-offered 1841, while close in condition to the aforementioned piece discovered by Q. David Bowers, is not the same coin. That piece differs slightly and is illustrated on page 31 of Issue No. 14 of the Empire Review (published by Q. David Bowers and James F. Ruddy; August, 1961). In his monograph Varieties of U. S. Quarter Eagles Walter Breen traces the whereabouts of eight specimens (1 of questionable authenticity, 5 in collectors' hands, 2 permanently impounded in museums). If one adds the presently offered ex-Lester Merkin coin to the list (for it is not the same as the Q. David Bowers coin) this gives a population of just **six known** confirmed authentic pieces in collectors' hands. As such it ranks as one of the most important of all United States gold issues. For a number of years cataloguers have referred to specimens of this beautiful cameo-like rarity as '**The Little Princess**', so we would be remiss if we did not perpetuate this nomenclature here. A wonderful opportunity for the specialist to acquire a sharp specimen of this exceedingly rare and important issue. (Estimate value: \$15,000 to \$20,000)."

The coin realized \$10,050.00 at that sale. Today it should realize close to the estimate noted above.

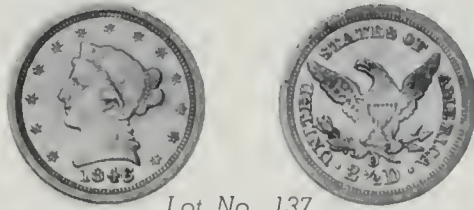

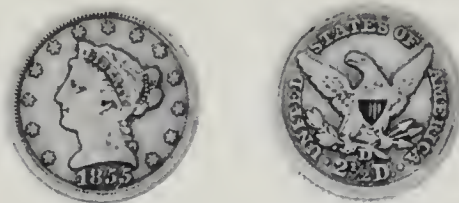

- 325 **1861 CONFEDERATE CENT. RESTRIKE IN GOLD.** Designed by Robert Lovett, Jr. in Philadelphia for the Confederacy. After striking twelve pieces in copper-nickel, Lovett fearing prosecution by the United States government, hid the coins and dies. According to the Redbook, Capt. J. W. Hazeltine (Philadelphia coin dealer) later bought the cents and dies, striking seven pieces in gold, twelve in silver, and fifty-five in copper. **However**, quoting J. W. Hazeltine from *Confederate Currency and Stamps* (1949) by Claud Fuller and published by the Tennessee Division, Confederate Daughters of the Revolution, Hazeltine, states, "I purchased the dies from him (Lovett) and, as you all probably know, did not strike any in nickel (copper-nickel) considering them to a certain degree as originals, but we had **three struck in gold**, and I believe five in silver and fifty-five in copper, **the die breaking on the fifty-ninth piece** which is in existence showing the break in the die."

We have been able to trace only three in gold; one in the Eliasberg collection in Baltimore, another in the Smithsonian Institution, Washington, D.C., and this one which is better than Fine, closer to Very Fine. Identifiable by a dent on last "A" of AMERICA, a small repair on edge in the same area and several unimportant scratches. Traces of the original surfaces visible around CONFEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA, date, 1 CENT, and wreath. This coin was last sold in our Donald Groves Sale, November 1974 (lot 467); formerly in Lester Merkin's October 1973 sale, and earlier in Schulman-Kreisberg's March 1964 sale.

Whether 3 or 7 pieces were struck, this is a great opportunity to acquire an extreme rarity. With the expanding interest in Americana this coin should attract considerable bidding.
